#### The Hester Family History:

John Nathan & Betty Jean Isom Hester & Descendants

Both John Nathan Hester and Betty Jean Isom were born in the sweltering heat of an Alabama July. These two remarkable individuals came together to begin a family amid hardships that would have defeated many people, but they persevered together over a lifetime to raise five children.....

John Nathan was born on July 1, 1925, to Fred and Mary Pearl Dhority Hester. They lived "in the valley" then, on land near Spring Creek in Colbert County that Papa Hester worked as a cotton farmer. The oldest son of a family that would grow to include eight children, Nathan learned to work hard and to assume responsibility at a very young age. In 1934, the family moved to a farm on Hawk Pride Mountain Road in the New Bethel community when Nathan was nine years old. He always loved hunting and fishing. He worked extremely hard during the week so that he could participate in area basketball games on weekends. The stories of how he had to walk all the way to Spring Park in Tuscumbia just to be able to play the games amused and amazed us during our growing up years.

Betty Jean was born on July 8, 1930, in Russellville, Alabama, the sixth of seven children born to Fred and Alma Grissom Isom. As the youngest daughter, Betty is remembered as a precocious and mischievous child, who would sneak off across the railroad tracks and hide in the shrubbery while Mama Isom called for her to come home. Betty would coax her dog to remain silent by petting his fur and whispering, "shhhh." When Betty was six years old, the family moved to Colbert County, settling for a couple of months in the Valdosta community. The Isoms then moved to a house on Frankfort Road in the New Bethel community. A storm destroyed the original house in 1938. Betty remembers Mama Isom hiding the children in a wardrobe to protect them from the storm when winds tore the roof from the house. After the storm, Papa Isom built the fieldstone house for the family to live in. Papa Isom went to work with TVA in 1932, working on Guntersville Dam, Joe Wheeler Dam, and Pickwick Dam projects. He was also involved in the early construction of the Reynolds Metals Plant. His work often took him away from home. Mama Isom kept the home fires going and took care of the family. Papa and Mama Isom also operated a country store. The kids helped out in the store.

Thus, Nathan and Betty were living within a few miles of each other during their growing up years. It was at the end of the Great Depression. The country was limping along. Signs of economic recovery for the Valley were beginning to emerge. The development of the Tennessee Valley Authority flood control project, rural

electrification, and FDR's Civilian Conservation Corps were beginning to have some impact on the region. Both attended New Bethel School and were taught by Miss Belle Richardson. Betty remembers being taught by Mrs. Figures, a niece of the noted teacher Maud Lindsey. Mrs. Figures was a wonderful storyteller, and a woman who endeavored to teach resourcefulness as well as basics to her students. She taught knitting, crocheting, sculpture, and carving to both boys and girls. Neither Nathan nor Betty has a recollection of noticing on another very much until Betty has a recollection of noticing on another very much until Betty reached the age of 14. As Nathan recalls, "She was the prettiest thing I ever saw." America had become embroiled in World War II in both Europe and the Pacific. Nathan and Betty married in 1945. A short week later, Nathan was inducted into the Army for training at Camp Fannin, Texas. The US was preparing a ground force to counter the Japanese Army's control of the Pacific Theater. Betty remained living at home with Mama and Papa Isom. Betty was able to visit Nathan at Camp Fannin for two weeks in April of 1945.

After completion of basic training, Nathan shipped out for the Pacific from San Francisco. He remembers a desolate feeling as they passed under the Golden Gate Bridge on their way to the Pacific Theater. On August 14, 1945, Japan surrendered in the face of the devastation of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. On September 2, 1945, Nathan's ship floated alongside the Missouri, on which General MacArthur and Japanese authorities signed the formal surrender. Nathan's mission was changed from being part of the ground force to mop up the South Pacific Islands to being part of the force occupying surrendered Japan. His recollection of post war Japan is of a devastated, starving nation.

Meanwhile, back on Wheeler Mountain, Betty gave birth to their first child, Sarah Nell Hester, on August 19, 1945. They continued living with Mama and Papa Isom and awaited news of the war through radio reports and newsreels at movie theaters. The price of admission to the movies was about 50 cents. Betty bought their first furniture, a bedroom suite from Montgomery Ward, while she waited for Nathan to come home. When Nathan returned from the Pacific and saw Sarah for the first time, she was eleven months old.

A couple of months after Nathan's discharge from the Army, the family moved into an old log house owned by Hosie Malone. Life was hard with no indoor plumbing. Cooking and heating were provided by a woodstove. Nathan began working at TVA. At this time, they moved to the old house on the hill on Mama and Papa Hester's place. Betty gave birth to their first son, Fred Nathaniel Hester, on July 19, 1947. Another daughter, Carol Jean Hester, followed on August 24, 1948. Betty has often remarked on those days. The workload was heavy. Water was toted from the spring at the bottom of the hill. There were three babies still in diapers. Wood had to be chopped and carried in for the stove. Even so, the house was cold in the winter. Nathaniel was a curious child. He kept them very busy just trying to keep up with him. Carol was a blessing because she had an easier disposition. It was Nathaniel's curiosity that brought the family's earliest and deepest tragedy. He died as a result of a fire caused by playing with matches on October 26, 1949. His grave is located at Crooked Oak Cemetery in Russellville, Alabama. In spite of the deep sorrow that followed Nathaniel's death, and with the loving support of family and friends, the family survived the tragedy. They moved to the Tom Keeton place on Allen Road in the New Bethel community.

In 1951, the family bought its first home, the little white house on Hawk Pride Mountain Road, from Louis Smith. The house was still heated by an iron woodstove and water was hauled by hand from a well. Nathan and Betty added a bathroom and larger kitchen to the house in 1961. It was in this house that the second round of children were born. John Douglas Hester was born October 21, 1952. Paul Daniel Hester made Flag Day forever memorable to us by being born on June 14, 1955. Susan Marie Hester finished up the litter of children on January 3, 1959. Or neighbors were Mrs. Sherrod, Jean and Marshall Pennington, Frances and Kenneth Sherrod, Eloise and Waldon James, Bud and Pearl James, Louis and Minnie Smith, Aunt Nellie and Uncle Rather Porter. The house provided a safe environment surrounded by caring neighbors and allowed us to roam and explore the world around us. We all have memories of learning to ride our bikes down the hill in front of Bud James' house, digging fox holes, climbing trees, having pets, stealing apples from Bud James's trees, being afraid that Bud James would get us if we didn't behave, and being worried that Bud James would see us as we took a bath in a washtub on the back porch.

We were also blessed to grow up in an extended family in which our best friends were nearly always our cousins. Mother always warned us that we had better behave because if we didn't she would surely hear about it. An abundance of aunts and uncles ensured that we at least tried to be on our best behavior because someone was certainly watching. On Daddy's die, it was Nelson and Mildred Hester, Edward and June Hester, Pearline and RC McMurtrey, Gerald and Jean Lee Hester, Alton and Mae Jean Hester. On Mother's side, it was Nellie and Rather Porter, Ludie and Roy Wagnon, Freddie Mae and LD Malone, Mildred "Mickie" and Bruce Helsley, and Clayton and Bernice Isom. Nobody saw it as a negative. We were spoiled not with material things, but with the abundance of personal attention that can only come from large families. Friday evenings when the McMurtreys would come from Birmingham or Uncle Nelson's family would come from Memphis to Mama Hester's were the high point of the week. We all gathered there to visit and to play. Summers were filled with work in the garden, peddling, canning and freezing, baseball games, fireworks, swimming, fishing, dinner on the grounds at New

Bethel Missionary Baptist Church, and camping trips with the Junior and Joyce Webb family.

1962 marked the beginning of a difficult period for the family. Papa Hester died of complications from prostrate surgery. In April 1963, Nathan was severely burned when a valve controlling a supply pipe blew during his job at TVA. Seventy percent of his body was burned by contact with the chemical phosphorus. Hospitalized for several months, he began a long convalescence at ECM Hospital. It was a hard time. Betty was stretched between the hospital and five school age children at home. She has often remarked that she would not have made it without the support of family and friends. Nathan worked hard to recover. Skin grafts were transferred from his back to his severely burned arms and legs. In July, he came home. By fall 1963, he returned to work at TVA.

By 1965, all the children were in school so Betty began working at Aunt Ludie and Uncle Roy Wagon's Hilltop Market on Frankfort Road. The kids were all busy with their education. Sarah was enrolled at the University of Alabama in Birmingham's Nursing School. Carol was at Cherokee Vocational High School. Doug, Dan, and Suzy were at New Bethel Elementary School. Life was full. All five children were good students. All five were encouraged to pursue an active extracurricular life. It is amazing to think how they kept all five going to 4-H, basketball, football, baseball, cheerleading, and other activities. It was also in 1965 that Nathan and Betty bought the house at the bottom of the hill from Louis Smith. The house sat on 67 acres. This provided a pond for fishing and swimming. Nathan and Betty started working harder than ever as they began to farm the new land.

In the late '60s, the family entered a new phase as the older sisters began to graduate from high school and college. The family welcomed new sons-in-law when Carol married Frank Whitaker, and Sarah married Jimmy McKee, both of Cherokee, Alabama. We were blessed with the addition of new grandchildren that saw us into the turbulent '70s. Doug graduated from high school, started college, and married Rhonda Rich from Cherokee, Alabama. Dan was the first to attend Colbert Heights High School. He graduated in 1973, and started college. In 1974, Daddy suffered his first heart attack. We had a very special Thanksgiving that year. After his surgery in 1975, Nathan retired. Betty began working at the sewing factory in Cherokee. Dan married Sheryl Young. Susan graduated from high school in 1977, and started college. She married Ahmad "Adam" Karbaf.

The late '70s marked a change for Nathan and Betty. With Nathan retired, Betty went back to school to study nursing. She became a part of the army of working women that entered the workforce in the '70s. She started out in 1978 as a LPN at Helen Keller Memorial Hospital. In 1979, she returned to school to get her RN certification at Northwest Alabama State Junior College. During her career, Betty worked in home healthcare as a nursing assistant's supervisor and both as a floor nurse and charge nurse at the hospital. In 1995, Betty retired from the Sullivan Center at HKM Hospital, ending a career that spanned nearly twenty years.

As full and a rich as our lives have been, it is only with the addition of in-laws and grandchildren that our family has been made complete. Nothing made us any happier than being made aunts and uncles while still in school. The grandkids....Carla, Dana, Derrick, Mona, Amanda, Molly, Daniel, John, Elizabeth, and Betsy.....remind us of what life is all about. With a 14-year span from the oldest to youngest children, and nearly the same period of time between the younger children and the grandchildren, we have a treasured closeness. The cycle repeats itself with the great grandchildren. We have been blessed to always have young children to keep things lively and to remind us of what is important in life. At last count, Nathan and Betty had 10 grandchildren and six great grandchildren with one more on the way. Shk 2/27/97 . Nathan passed away on August 1, 1997. There are now nine great grandchildren. #### John Nathan Hester Service History

John Nathan Hester, Army Serial # 44053413, Private 1st Class was drafted into the United States Army after Christmas, December 1944. John married Betty Isom on January 2, 1945. John left Tusculumbia, Alabama by bus on January 9, 1945 bound for Fort McClellan, Alabama. There, he had a physical and was sworn into the Army on January 12, 1945. He was then sent to Camp Fannin, Texas for basic training. He traveled to Camp Fannin by bus by way of Camp Shelby, Mississippi. Camp Fannin was located between Tyler and Longview, Texas. He was assigned to Company C, 62nd Battalion.

Also drafted into service at this time were several local men, Choat Bird, Charles King, James Byrd, Travis Kimbrough, and William Holland. John was assigned to the same company as William Holland.

On February 24, 1945, John was recognized as a sharpshooter and received a medal. After completion of basic training at Camp Fannin, Texas, John was sent to Fort Benning, Georgia for six weeks Paratroop training. He made six jumps and received a Paratroop medal called wings.

John visited home two weeks during June before reporting to Fort Ord, California for overseas duty on July 7, 1945. He was sent first to Luzo then to Manila in the Philippines. The war had ending in Europe. The US under the leadership of President Truman decided to drop the atomic bomb on Japan in August, which brought WWII to an abrupt end. John was then assigned to the 1st Calvary Division that was a part of the occupation army in Japan. While stationed in Japan, John traveled through many cities including Tokyo, Yokohama, Osaka, Honshu, Kobe,

Kyoto, and the two cities where the bombs had been dropped, Nagasaki and Hiroshima. The two cities were completely destroyed. Also witnessed General Douglas MacArthur and the leader of Japan signing the Peace Treaty and the end of WWII.

John arrived back in the United States on April 11, 1946, and was then sent to a convalescent hospital at Camp Welch in Daytona Beach, Florida for a few months. He then went to Walter Reed Hospital where he got an honorable discharge from the Army on July 17, 1946.

In 1973 Bobby was drafted into the army and stationed in Warrington, Virginia after his training at Fort Benning Georgia as a Military Policeman. After his discharge he returned to Memphis and joined the Memphis Police Department. He married Anita Webb in 1973. They had no children.

While on duty January 12, 1983, he and his partners Ray Schwill and Thomas Turner answered a call in north Memphis to serve a warrant and were attacked by several men at the residence. They managed to call for backup, and upon arrival the fellow officers heard gunshots, and saw officers Schwill and Turner trying to escape. Bobby, apparently injured, was taken hostage inside the residence Schwill suffered a gunshot wound through his jaw and hand, Officer Turner was Struck in the head with a gun both were able to escape.

Scores of officers immediately surrounded the house. The neighborhood was evacuated, and a police command post stationed across the street.

Police determined there were approximately seven people in the house holding Bobby. They were a "self oriented religious sect ". Their leader being temperamental had been expecting the world to end on the previous Monday. Thier beliefs and actions based on recent eclipse and taking drugs combined with alcohol consumption for days. When this event did not occur, he became extremely overwrought, accusing the police of being the Anti-Christ.

As I have heard it was a big drug ring bust among some very violent and intoxicated individuals. Holding many other people as well hostage.

After 30 hours of negotiations with the captors, the SWAT TEAM stormed the house, amid gunshots and retaliation,all in the house were killed, including Bobby.

At Bobby's funeral police departments were represented from across the United States. More than 1500 people at tented his service, and it took more that an hour for the two-mile long procession to reach the cemetery. Motorists on I-40came to a stop, showing respect as the hearse passed by. This event made the National news and Bobby's memory has been honored in many ways, including his name on the Monument for slain officers in Washington,D.C., and in Beale Street police precinct they have a picture of him as well as other police officers who have given their lives in the line of duty. Bobby fellow officers, remembering how he loved to fish on his off duty time, have established an annual fishing rodeo in Memphis in his name.

Bobby lived a life of gentleness and great love for his family. He died with honor and respect from his peers. Sacrificing for all law enforcement, who stand for truth and justice. He was not able to fulfill his lifelong dream of returning to Colbert County to live and become a Forrest Ranger. ( This article reprinted from The Heritage of Colbert County, Alabama.
