The Button and Fuller family reunion was held at the Methodist church at Williamsburg Sunday, August 10. A basket lunch was served in the basement of the church with tables set for 43 guests. After dinner a social hour was enjoyed which included a short program. The opening numbers were songs by Donald Corpe, accompanied by his mother Mrs. Frank J. Corpe, Jr. A quartet, formed by Mr. and Mrs. James Button, Mrs. Cora Button and Earl Button accompanying both groups."

After the musical numbers Rev. Howard Fuller gave a very interesting talk about South America where he and Mrs. Fuller worked for three years in a missionary school and hospital.

Those present were Mr. and Mrs. Moses Wagner, Mr. and Mrs. George Fuller and family, and Mr. and Mrs. Robert Fuller and family all of Fife lake, Mr. and Mrs. Lucius Fuller of Flint, Mr. and Mrs. William Fuller and daughter of Royal Oak, Rev. and Mrs. Howard Fuller and family of Lyons, Mr. and Mrs. Roger Kitchen of Old Mission, Mr. and Mrs. Earl Button and family, Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Button and son, Mrs. Cora Button and Mr. and Mrs. Frank Corpe Jr. and family, all of Traverse City, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Button, Mr. and Mrs. James Button and Otto Linkletter, all of Williamsburg.

There are two brothers, George Button and family in California and Harry and family in Potlatch, Idaho, who were unable to attend.

Published **1930**, according to handwritten notation, possibly in a Kalkaska or Traverse City newspaper, probably under a heading of "Fife Lake" though that portion was not saved.
