WATSON, JOHN, 1746. Deed from John Watson, Jr., to Anthony Cole, conveying land in Goochland as per patent, dated Mar. 17, 1736. Goochland D. B. 5, p. 198.

WATSON, JOHN, JR., of Goochland, 1748. Deed to John Crow, of same county, for land in Goochland, purchased by said John Watson, of Rene Laforce. Goochland D. B. 5, p. 486.

WATSON, JOHN, of Henrico County and Parish, 1749. Deed of gift to Mary Watson Hynds, daughter of his wife, Martha Watson, to twenty negroes, 500 pounds in money, and other personalty, and 395 acres of land in said county on Chickahominy Swamp and Allen's Branch, to be delivered to her at her marriage or when she becomes twenty-one. If she have no issue, this property is to go to his children. Henrico D. & W. B. —, p. 121.

WATSON, JOHN, of Henrico, 1749-50. Will. Land in Henrico County given William Putnam; land in Henrico County given Watson Putnam; land in Goochland County adjoining Joseph Pease and Ben Woodson given Moses Bramfield; to daughter, Elizabeth Watson, land in Henrico County upon the brook, etc.; to daughter Susannah Watson, land called Samson's, etc.; to wife, Martha, home plantation, etc. Wife, Martha, William Putnam and Nathaniel Bacon, executors; witnesses, Nathaniel Bacon and others. Henrico D. & W. B. (1749-50). D. & W. B., Vol 2, p. 40, in an inventory and appraisement calls him "captain."

WATSON, JOHN, 1751. Deed to William Gray proved, in Court, and ordered to record. Amelia County Court Order Book 3, p. 8.

WATSON, JOHN, 1758. Nathaniel Bacon settled his accounts as guardian for John Watson's orphans and the estate of Mary Watson Hynes. Henrico County Court Minutes, 1758.

WATSON, JOHN, of Prince Edward, 1759. Deed to Morton, land on Great Buffalo. Witness, John Watson, Jr. Prince Edward D. B. 1, p. 168.

WATSON, JOHN, SR., of Prince Edward, 1761. Deed to George Smith, of Amelia, for tract on Little Buffalo, being part of a larger tract on which he, Watson, then lived, and patented by him March 10, 1745. Witnesses, John Watson, Jr., Josiah Chambers and Richard Morton. Prince Edward D. B. 2, p. 52.

WATSON, JOHN. Will dated and probated 1763. Sons, William, John, Burwell, Henry, Isaac and Jacob; son-in-law, William Poole; wife survived. Lunenburg W. B. 2, p. 176.

WATSON, JOHN, SR. Will. Executors, sons Drury and Samuel,—\$10,000.; witnesses, Abner Watson, John A. Watson, William P. Watson. Wife, Mary; daughter, Betty Ann; sons, Drury and Samuel given land "whereon I now live on Little Buffalo"; daughters, Nancy, Mary, Susannah Thorn. Prince Edward W. B. 6, p. 479.
