## HELP FOR USING THIS BOOK

The numbering in this second supplement (Volume 1) to the BOOK OF JARED is a tad awkward. We hope the following comments will help you use all three volumes.

In order to keep an accurate count of all the descendants of JOHN JARED 1, we must continue from the last numbered person in Volume I. We continued from that number in Volume II, and now must continue the numbering for Volume III from where we left off in Volume II.

The last descendant number in Volume I is 6371, page 669.

The first number in Volume II Supplement I is 6372, page 22.

The last number in Volume II (Supplement I) is 8557, page 306

The first number in Volume III (Supplement II) is 8558 on page 5.

The count continues from the last number, 8558, as we make up this the third volume of THE BOOK OF JARED. It doesn't matter whether it is an individual left out of a previously counted family, or an entirely new family, we must number them as they come along consecutively. The individual descendant number becomes a part of each person's identification. We shall attempt to make an index that will help to find each of them.

We often find discrepancies between data submitted from the different branches descending from a common ancestor. We have no way of knowing who has given us the correct data, unless they quote from an authentic source, such as a family Bible or a living person who knew the individuals of the family personally, a census or other acceptable document. Sometimes we can judge which data is correct by the data from the immediate family group, sometimes that is impossible, so we attempt to give the data from both sources. It will be the responsibility, however, of the immediate family members to follow through and research original records to verify the correct date. We hope those finding different data will send us the correction along with their sources that will support a change of data.

An asterisk behind the individual's personal number (17\*) means he appears elsewhere in these three books, with more information. Usually he will be found as a parent with a family. When the asterisk is used to indicate additional information it will appear before the individual number, (\*17).

The - sign following an individual's personal number, means we have no further information about that person. However, much additional information has come into the two newest volumes, so check all indexes for new information.

## ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

My appreciation is expressed to the willing members of different families who gathered information from others for us, and to all for their patience in waiting for the book. Especially I wish to honor Carol Hall and Wilda Luttrell who have far exceeded the "call of duty" in collecting and sharing, new up—dating and correction information.

Honorable Mention also goes to those who have written and contributed personal and family histories, to make this last edition more interesting and special to all of us.

DESCENDANTS OF WILLIAM and ELIZABETH (RAULSTEN) JARED

“William JARED was a Captain (sic) in the Revolutionary War. After moving from Loudoun and Bedford Counties, Virginia about 1800 he located on Indian Creek, Putnam Co., Tennessee He was the oldest child of John JARED, a prosperous worker in wood, making wagons, wagon wheels, spinning wheels, looms and such other implements useful to the pioneers of those days.”

John Jared, the father of William, kept a ‘Day Book’ for his business accounts. in it he recorded the vital records of his immediate family. He told that he was the son of Thomas and Martha JARED. [Their name was also spelled ‘Jarrett’ and Jarrell!]. Records of their home and property are found in Isle of Wight, and Surrey Counties, Virginia, in the early settling of that area. Surrey was carved from Isle of Wight County, so the references extant today all apparently refer to the same property originally taken up by Thomas and Martha and their children.

John’s record book has survived to the present time, see extracts from its pages in Volume I, Book of Jared We shall refer to it henceforth as ‘John’s Journal’ all thought it is mostly a record of his daily business transactions. Vol I pages 9, 10, 18, 19.

According to Quaker Church Records, the oldest child of John, William was born 3 June 1758 near Kingswood, Hunterdon Co., New Jersey, see Supp 1, Vol II, p. 41. “On December 6, 1792 William married Elizabeth, the sister of Colonel James Raulsten of the Second Division of the Tennessee Militia, in the War of 1812. Col. Raulston’s picture hangs in the State Capitol Building in Nashville, Tennessee.”

William Jared was called “Captain” in the neighborhood of Buffalo Valley, Tennessee, where he lived, and became known as one of the leading pioneer citizens of that section. “He died 22 September 1827. His widow Elizabeth (Raulsten) Jared was born 6 January 1770, and died in June 1835.”

Although they are recorded in both previous volumes of the Jared Family Book, we will repeat their children’s names and vital records because so much has been added to their data since last printing. Sylvia Giles copied their birth and death dates from the family Bible that once belonged to Aunt Mary Frances “Fanny” (Jared) Stanton. [See Vol 1, pages 11, 15, 17.]

Many descendants of our William JARED have joined the D A R, and the S A R on the record of Capt. William Jared of Berkley County Virginia A study of Capt. William Jared's family proves he was not our ancestor. His children are not of the above family, and he never lived in either Loudoun or Bedford counties. Our William, however, is a Veteran of the Revolutionary War, although the National Archives have no record of his service at this time. His only existing war record comes from his father's journal. (See Book Of Jared Vol 1, pages 9, 10). This record has been established and approved by the D A R and his descendants may join the patriotic organizations from the following number 428534.

Funeral services for Bryan S. Jared, Rusk, Tex., 56, were Wednesday at Wallace Funeral Home, Rusk, with the Rev. Jewel McClure officiating. Burial was in Rose Hill Cemetery here Thursday, Dr. Edwin W. Parker of First Methodist Church officiating, at graveside rites. Harvey Funeral Home directed burial.

Bearers were Joe Gill, Charles Lowrey Jim McGoodwin, D. W. Hill, Dan Flannigan and Jack Williamson.

Jared was born in Whitehouse, Texas, and had made his home in Ardmore 18 years prior to moving to Rusk two years ago. He had once been manager of the Ardmore Hotel.

At Rusk he owned and operated Jared's Restaurant. He was a veteran of World War II and a member of the Methodist Church.

Jared died in a Rusk hospital Tuesday following a heart attack. A columnist for the Rusk Cherokeean commented: "He was one of the finest men we've ever known. He was 'loaded' with humor. Rusk is a better town because he came our way."

Survivors include the widow, Margaret; a son, Scott; a daughter, Frances; and a brother, J. P., all of Rusk, and two sisters, Mrs. Don Jenkins, Little Rock, Arkansas., and Mrs. J. T. Moseley, Lafayette, Louisiana.

Locie and Neta Buck were prominent land owners in the Maple Spring, Henderson County community, near Beech Bluff, Tennessee They were active in the Presbyterian Church where Locie served as Elder and Sunday School Supt. for twenty—seven years. During World War II Locie Worked in the Milan Arsenal making ammunition.

In April 1944 Locie and Neta rented their farm out and moved to Gardena, California to work as a butcher in the Supermarket of Neta's brother, Albert Jared. Their son, Horace, was in the service and Alviene was in Junior High School, and did not wish to go. They took only young Sylvia with them. After six months they moved to their farm home in Tennessee. In October 1944 they sold the farm and moved to Jackson for their retirement years.

In Jackson they became well known in the Church and Community. Locie served as Elder until his death. He sang in the Church Choir and was a member of the Original Fowler Quartet known throughout West Tennessee. He worked for Union University for many years in carpentry.

In the same Church Group, of course, Neta was also active. She played the piano for different events, was secretary of the Women's Missionary Circle and the Altruist Sunday School Class. When her health failed after two heart attacks and a bad fall, she sold her home and moved to Maplewood Health Care Center, where she now lives. (March 1983).

Neta recalls her parents, Petway and Alice, moving from Texas when she was small, to Bloomington Springs, Middle Tennessee. Later They moved to Mendon, near Jackson, in West Tennessee. Petway bought a farm and worked it as long as his health permitted. He and Alice are buried in the Maple Springs Cemetery.

Cousin William Joel Jared, #8746 tells us some things about their family in his letter dated 25 August 1982.

"You may be interested in how we left Martin Creek (out of Baxter) to work in the Bemis Textile Mill. Bemis is an old company town out of Jackson in Madison County Tennessee This was about 1905. Several of the family worked in the mill for about a year. Then my grandfather rented a farm near Mendon which is close to Bemis. He may have bought a farm there later. His oldest son married and bought a farm near Medan and he and his sons and daughter and grandchildren are still there.

"Another brother, Albert, bought a farm near Beech Bluff, about thirty miles away to be close to a girlfriend. The family, less Uncle Frank, moved to White Fern out of Beech Bluff, about 1916. The family stayed there till the early 1930s. Albert and Etta moved to California. By that time my dad and Mom had a little country store in Beech Bluff, then came the depression and we followed Albert and Etta to the Golden West, in 1936. Albert's girlfriend in Beech Bluff married another and he found a wife in California.

"Times were hard in California in 1936, and my dad had a hard time finding a job. He finally got one as a janitor in a hotel in downtown Los Angeles. The war came, and he got a job in the Shipyard as a painter. He followed that profession and did well buying and selling rental property. All us kids married and have our own homes. He helped me through USC School of Engineering. (If Cordell, #3006 can brag about his lawyer and Engineer sons, why can't I?). I saw Cordell last May and he took us to Martin Creek where my father was born. He's a great guy and so is his wife Maenell. My wife, Kay, just received a quilt from her (wedding Ring), which we are very pleased over.

"My Aunt Nita told me her mother, my grandmother, told her that on the day they were married it had rained hard and the road was muddy. The wedding party drove the horsed and buggies into Cookeville and as they entered town all the Church Bells in town began to ring. This was the custom.

"My father remembers seeing Halley's Comet in 1910 when he was in Medon. He was a young boy, about 12, and remembers its long tail across the sky. He now wonders if he will see it again in 1987.

"Father also tells about his father in law who owned a barrel stave Factory in Beech Bluff. Every time a stave came out it meant 5 cents Dad thought he was marrying into money until he discovered Mr. Stayton shut down the factory when he made enough money to get him through the year.

"About my cousins now living in Medon, "the last of the Jared's." Well, Arthur owns a Roadhouse where they have live music, dancing etc. His claim to fame is that his roadhouse was used in the Movie "Walking Tall," made in the seventies. The movie was about a sheriff trying to clean up his county. It was based on a real story, which took place in an adjacent county. The Hollywood movie people wanted to make the movie in the county where it happened, but the residents said 'no', so they went to my cousin's place.

"Grandfather commented from his deathbed, "One Jared leaving this world and another coming in". Franklin Petway Jared died 26 May 1933, two days after I was born."

My grandfather Stayton died 28 October 1941, one month after his wife, Sophronia, who died 18 September 1941."

## WILLIAM FELIX JARED'S HISTORY

"I was born at Bloomington Springs, near Baxter, in Putnam County, Tennessee. We had a large family and I was the youngest of four boys and four girls.

"When I was a little boy about eight years old, I joined the Methodist Church. My Mother, Susan Alice Dodson, was very religious and my Father, Franklin Petway Jared, was also. My Mother was the daughter of a famous minister, Dr. Dodson, who founded the Dodson Chapel near Cookeville, Tennessee. It is still there.

"Grandpa Dodson was a prosperous man and educated all his children. Mother was a school teacher. One of her brothers was a minister and another a teacher. Uncle Frank Dodson was a doctor and Aunt Miranda, Mother's sister, married a York, who had a bank in Baxter.

"Mother's Daddy gave her 25 acres of land and a brand new house at Bloomington Springs as a wedding gift. Theirs was a very elaborate wedding, including a carriage drawn by white horses.

"Both sets of my Grandparents had about 200 slaves which were freed during the Civil War.

"My Dad's parents were Brice Byrne and Amanda (Carr) Jared. They lived in Cookeville, Tennessee and were among the first farmers in the area. They left farms to all their children. Grandpa and Grandma raised a large, successful family of businessmen and land owners. As a wedding gift, they gave Daddy 80 acres of land. It was hill land.

"My Father was a farmer and Mother stayed home and raised a large family. They were very strict about the company we kept. When we were old enough to go courting, we would have to be back by 9 o'clock. Our parents wouldn't allow us to go with anyone unless they were first class. They always said that you were known by the company you kept, so we grew up that way and tried to improve our generation all we could.

"We all worked on the farm to make a living and it was a pretty hard go. My first venture in making and saving money happened when I was a little boy. I ordered a small bank which held 50 dimes, which is \$5. Every time I had a chance I would drop a dime into it. We were always taught to save our money.

"We lived next door to the depot agent. His wife dipped snuff. She would give me 50 cents a week to go out into the woods and get a small twig from a black gum tree, which she would use as a toothbrush for dipping snuff. She would also give me 50 cents a week to keep the stove wood box full of wood. I also picked and chopped cotton and ran errands for the other neighbors. The money always went into my little savings bank.

"Eventually, the little bank was full. I told my Daddy, 'Oh boy, now I have my bank full. I have 50 dimes " He said, 'You have ! Lend it to me" I said, 'OK,' and started saving again. When the bank was full again, I said, 'Daddy, I have 50 more dimes again!' and he said, 'Good, lend them to me,' and so I did.

"In a few more months the old cow had a calf. I asked Daddy if he would let me have the calf for the \$10 he owed me, and he said that would be fine. I kept on saving dimes and he kept the calf until it became a cow. That was a good deal because my Daddy had to feed the calf until it became a cow.

"He was good that way about helping me out and he didn't hesitate about paying me back either. In about two years and a half, the cow had a calf and I sold the cow and calf for \$65. That was the first venture I had in making money.

"I was able to buy my own clothes by ordering them from the Sears, Roebuck Catalog, and pretty well dressed myself with the help of my little dime bank.

"Later on our family moved to West Tennessee, and I had typhoid fever in 1919.

"While attending school, I met a pretty little girl named Pearl Stayton. I made a hit with her and we loved each other very dearly. She was the apple of my eye. I had seen her in a dream and recognized her right away. Pearl was from a fine, well-to-do family. Her Dad, Arlando L. Stayton, owned a barrel stave factory as well as a prosperous farm.

"Pearl and I were married December 20, 1922 and later had a beautiful baby, Mary Elizabeth, but lost her during childbirth. It was a real heartbreak for us.

"We decided to build a large General Store in Beech Bluff. The two-story building housed not only the store, but our living quarters, a doctor's office and a barber shop where I cut hair for 25 cents a head. We also had two Gulf gasoline pumps in front of the store. At one time the price of gasoline dipped to 8 cents per gallon.

"In the store we sold groceries, hardware, including horse collars and bridles, and patent medicine. Later on we began selling home-made pies which Pearl made. The motto of our store was, 'You've tried the rest, now try the best.' The store acted as a community meeting place for the men of the town who loved to sit around the wood-burning stove and swap stories, whittle, and play checkers. Those were happy years.

"Then times got hard and money became scarce because of the great depression. Everyone was buying on credit. The future didn't

look good, so I wrote my sister, Etta, in Los Angeles who encouraged me to sell out and move to California. We decided to leave in June of 1936.

"When we arrived in Los Angeles, we moved into a room in my sister, Etta's, apartment house. At that time Wanda was nine and Joel three years old. I walked the streets for four weeks and wore out a pair of shoes looking for a job. It was hard to do • I finally landed a job in the Security Building downtown working for \$65 a month. Boy, was that a happy day as we were in tough luck and really broke "

"In those days you couldn't rent a place if you had children, so I decided to borrow money and buy a two-story house for \$1,700 with \$400 down and \$17 a month on 51st and Broadway. After painting the place and making a few minor repairs, I sold it in three months and made \$1,000 profit. That started me out buying and selling houses. Since then I have bought and sold better than 30 places, and I have made pretty good on them.

"It kept me very busy working a full-time job and doing this in my spare time. We didn't take a vacation for several years. But, my Daddy always said a man will rust out quicker than he will wear out, and he was right.

"World War II came up when Mr. Roosevelt was president. I got a job at Calif. Shipbuilders painting Liberty Cargo Ships. I was a good worker; always on the job and very good in my profession.

"Our fourth baby, Sharon Ann, was born about this time and was the most beautiful baby in the Hollywood Hospital. We sure were proud of her.

"After the war, I worked for the Southern California Gas Company as a painter. Later, I went to work for Los Angeles County. They were nice people to work for and soon I got a promotion and was transferred to Mira Loma, a rehabilitation center near Lancaster, California, where I got to be Supervisor of the North portion of the County in the Mechanical Department, and I had the largest paint shop in Los Angeles County. I worked from 20 to 30 people.

"At Mira Loma I worked and trained inmates so they would have a profession when they left. There were about 200 housing units on 640 acres of land. They had a hospital, two churches and a theater for the inmates. In addition, there were five shops and a boy could learn any trade he wanted to. It was a wonderful thing for those people.

"And my family all grew up. I tried to raise my kids like I was raised, to be honest and pay their debts and don't lie. My wife has been a wonderful mother and housekeeper. We have raised three nice children and they all have good jobs and homes of their own. The Lord has been very good to us all."

HERBERT G. JARED writes their family narrative: Our Family was Norman—French and moved to England about the time of William the Conqueror. The name was originally spelled ‘JARRATT’, and was pronounced ‘Aha—RATT’. In England this became JARRETT. Apparently the first to settle in America shortened the name to ‘JARED.’

He seems to have been a religious man, well acquainted with the Bible, and no doubt took the spelling of the name from the Book of Genesis (see p. 10 Supp I). All his children, except William, were given Bible names. William and Joseph were Revolutionary War soldiers. They were given land grants for their service, good for so many acres anywhere in the West where the land had not already been taken. They chose to settle in what is now Putnam County, Tennessee.

My grandfather, also named William, moved to White County and we had little contact with the rest of the family thereafter. He had five sons. Uncle Tom never married. Uncle Obe married but had no children. Uncle John had one son who never married. Uncle Bob moved to the State of Washington and we have lost contact with his descendants.

Uncle Bob was Robert Payne Jared, Number 3333 in the BOOK OF JARED. I was surprised to learn he was a Civil War Veteran, as I had thought him to be one of the younger children of William.

William JARED No. 19 BOOK OF JARED, was indeed a Methodist Minister, According to a History of White County, he was not only the first Circuit Rider in what is now White County, but was also headmaster of the first school to be organized in the county. He was known for his firm discipline. Although he was reputed to have owned two or three household slaves his sympathies were definitely with the Union in the controversy preceding the Civil War. According to my Aunt Alice Jared Kirby, his wife, Martha Jett, was a granddaughter of John White for whom White County was named. Another County History I read more recently told that John White was a brother of

James White, the first settler in what is now Knoxville, where I have worked and resided for the past 35 years.

William died in 1861, the year the fighting started in the Civil War. The inscription on his tombstone in the Sparta City Cemetery tells us he died "in his sixty second year." which does not agree with other family records. (editor's comment -- Tombstones are far down' the line of accuracy when judged against other vital records).

Although both he and his son, Robert, were staunch Union Supporters, one may be forgiven for suspecting Martha shared her neighbor's sentiments. According to one story after the Union troops had raided her corncrib she sent to General Thomas, a message that she was the widow of a Union Sympathizer. She got her corn back — and then some! After the war, however, she applied for a pension on the grounds her husband was a Union Sympathizer. She was sent a paper to sign stating she herself sympathized with the Union. She never signed and never received the pension!

The accounts of the Robert Payne Jared family published on page 379 and 380 of the BOOK OF JARED, indicate the family lived in Texas for nine years; a; so that two brothers helped build the store on the Pend Orielle River in Washington. Piecing these two bits of information together with other known facts and cementing them with a little conjecture I come up with the following picture:

ROBERT PAYNE JARED moved his family to South West Texas and either secured a parcel of Land under the Homestead Law or operated a store. He wrote, or perhaps visited his two younger, still unmarried brothers, Thomas D. and Joseph G. Jared, and convinced them to try to secure ownership of a farm under the Homestead Act. They chose a tract of land in the San Antonio area near a town called Bon Armee. Robert Payne Jared undoubtedly provided invaluable advice and assistance in constructing the buildings on their new farm.

When Robert decided to relocate his operation to Washington Territory The two brothers returned the favor by helping him in the construction of the store building, after which they returned to the Texas homestead.

\*3338 Joseph G. Jared evidently grew tired of single life and returned to White County, Tennessee where he married Emma Lee BROYLES. She was the daughter of John Summerfield and Mary (Crook) Broyles. She spent her childhood and youth on a farm in Cashdollar Cove near Gunspring Mountain in White County, Tennessee. The Broyles family was supposed by the generation I knew, to have come from Ireland or Wales, but my first cousin, Clela Bain Wingo has evidence that the name was originally spelled "Breile" and that they emigrated from Leipzig, Germany.

Uncle Tom Cashdollar, whose relationship I will explain later, grew up in Cashdollar Cove. He once told me, "I knew your great grandfather Broyles. We called him 'Uncle Summerfield.'" He was a great neighbor and friend. can say the same for your maternal grandfather, Billy Knowles, my brother in law."

Joseph and Emma (see Book Of Jared p 378 #333S) became parents of a son, whom they christened Thomas Kelly, while tarrying in White County. About that time Thomas D. Jared visited Tennessee. Concluding his visit he began his return journey back to the Texas Homestead. Before he had traveled a day's journey

He became ill and died. His remains were returned to Sparta and buried by those of his father in the City Cemetery.

Joseph Jared (\*3338) was now the sole owner of the homestead. Since failure to live on, and work the land would cloud the title, he returned to the homestead with his wife and young son. Four more children, Martha Ruth, Joseph Summerfield, Mae Bell, and Charley Lee were born while the family lived in Texas. The children did not attend public school but were taught by their mother at home. On one occasion the four older children were induced by Mexican children to eat castor beans. They all became very ill except Tom, who claimed to have eaten as many castor beans as the rest. The incident cost Martha Ruth her life.

Soon after Charley Lee's birth, Emma, who had up to this time apparently adapted quite well to the rigors of pioneer life, began to develop symptoms of mental illness. This is said to have resulted from a blow on the head she received when she fell from her horse in early teens, having been sent across the mountain to fetch her grandmother to assist at a birth.

Joseph placed her in a sanitarium and hired help to care for the children. This proved to be unsatisfactory so he returned to Tennessee to leave the children with his brother, Obe (Overton Jett Jared \*3335), and his wife Lou.

Mary (Crook) Broyles, the children's maternal grandmother, now a widow lived in the John Crook house some 3—5 miles from the Obe Jared family. She heard rumors that the children were not happy. She took them to live at her house. Her youngest daughter, Mrs. Mollie (Broyles) Hudson, taught in a school a few miles away so the children were treated to their first experience with a public school. Tom was even tempered and endured the jibes often given to "new" children, but Joe responded with his fists and got the reputation of being pugnacious.

Another rumor heard by Mary Broyles was that her son in law was a hard drinker. She jumped to the conclusion that he had gotten rid of Emma and the children to allow himself more liberty to drink and carouse. She and some of her daughters went to Texas to see for them selves. They found Emma in apparently good mental health, but they were advised by the Sanitarium authorities to leave her there for another year to assure that her cure was complete. Ignoring this advice they secured her release against medical advice and brought her with them to Tennessee. Shortly after she manifested further symptoms of mental disorder. Mary took Thomas Kelly aside and asked him to tell her the whole truth about the situation. He told her that his father did indeed drink, but he did not run around. She immediately wrote to Joseph and apologized for what she had thought. His reply indicated he would sell the farm and return to Tennessee.

He reunited the family on a farm in Cashdollar Cove, adjacent to the one where Emma had spent her childhood and youth. A sixth child, Alice Victory, was born while they lived at that place. The children were able to attend school at Shady Grove in a more relaxed atmosphere since they were no longer "outlanders" and since they had no relatives teaching in that school. My mother said she regarded as "just some more of the mean boys" at school.

Thomas Kelly (Tom) was encouraged to drop out of school at completion of the eighth grade to help on the farm, but Joseph Summerfield "Joe", being short of stature and asthmatic, was sent to White County High School

in Sparta, as it was thought he was too weak to make a living farming. Both Tom and Joe were drafted during the First World War and served with the AEF in France. Both tried their hand at teaching after the war, but Tom decided he was a farmer by profession, and Joe decided on a career as a mail clerk in Nashville. Charley planned to enter the Methodist Ministry, but was discovered to have tuberculosis and died before he could complete his education.

After the war Tom Jared began courting Bertha Knowles, who lived on an adjoining farm. She was one of the four daughters of William J. Knowles, a descendant of John Knowles, an early White County settler who had immigrated from Ireland and served with the Pennsylvania Regulars during the Revolution. He married Kitty Lou Bruster, daughter of John Foster and Amanda (Simril).

When Tom Jared came to court Bertha Knowles he found he usually had Lora, her sister, as a 'tag along' wherever they went. He began to bring his brother Joe along on his dates. Joe worked in Nashville for about a year before he and Lora were married. Tom and Bertha followed them in matrimony a year later. The Joe Jared's settled in Nashville near the Trevecca College Campus, about a block away from the home of Tom Cashdollar. Tom and Bertha Jared occupied the Knowles house jointly with Billy until his death in 1926, and continually until Tom's death in 1964. Aunt Bertha has resided in this house continually since she was two years old.

Mary Bell Jared married John K. Bain, a veteran of the First World War. Alice, the youngest child married Reubin Kirby, a White County Farmer and Merchant. The Bains raised a large family and during much of their married life lived in the Joseph Graham Jared house. The Kirby's had one son and lived in the Pealed Chestnut Community of White County.

The Joe Jared's had four children, of which I was oldest, two boys and twin girls. My mother died at age 39, when I was eleven, my brother eight and our sisters five. The Tom Cashdollars moved into the house with us to take care of the boys. The girls lived for a while in the Tom Jared family along with their two sons. There was lots of visiting during this period. This era ended when my father married Miss Emma Lee Brown of Jasper, Alabama. She was a daughter of Tom and Emma (Snoddy) Brown. They had one child a daughter.

J. K. Bain, son of Mae Bell and John K. Bain, and Kelly William Jared son of Thomas K. and Bertha, served in the army during the Second World War. My brother, Billy Knowles Jared, and myself both served in the U. S. Navy during the Second World War.

I have lived in Knoxville, Tennessee for the past 35 years. I am an Electrical Engineer with the Tennessee Valley Authority. My brother Billy Knowles Jared, and his wife reside in Nashville area and both teach in the Metro Nashville System. My sister, Jean also resides in the Nashville area where she drives a school bus. Her husband is a retired printer. Her twin, Joan, resides just over the county line in Cross Plains, Tennessee. She works in Springfield as a nurse and her husband carries the mail in Nashville. My sister Martha Lee resides in the Detroit area where she teaches school. Her husband is an accountant. My wife, Katherine, is ill most of the time, but struggles valiantly to make a home for me and our unmarried daughter.

Kelly William Jared has held several jobs requiring mechanical ability. He is currently the electrical maintenance man for the White County High School. His brother, Raymond Harold, is a dairy farmer and tends his mother's farm with the help of his son, Lyndon, and occasional help from Kelly.

Joe Kirby is employed by Thomas Industries in White County. I am not familiar with the employment situation of the Bains, but J. K. resided on Gum Springs Mountain until his death in 1970. He was a disabled Veteran.

David lives in Akron, Ohio. William Johnson in the Atlanta, Georgia area, and Esther Ruth, Clela, Quentin, and Mary Alice all reside in the Chattanooga, Tennessee area.

In proofreading I find I forgot to mention that Great Grandfather Broyles fought on the side of the Confederacy; that my aunt, Mrs. Alice (Jared) Kirby taught school in White County until her retirement in 1975; and that my father's widow, Mrs. Emma Lee (Brown) Jared taught school in the Metro—Nashville System until she retired at about the same time."

## HOW I FOUND MY TENNESSEE ANCESTORS

by Eleanor M. Hall\*

Great-grandmother's genealogy record, like the little toy dog, was covered with dust For 60 years it lay in the same old place. Then we delved into it, and we found that she had summed it up as follows:

My great grandfather, John Jared, came over from England to Virginia in or near the first settling of Virginia. He was a wagon maker by trade. His first wife was a Miss Whitaker of Celtic descent. Their oldest son, William, was born in Loudoun County, Virginia, on June 3, 1758. He was my grandfather. Their second son was Joseph, then his wife died. My great grandfather then married a Miss Palmer of Virginia, by whom he had five sons, namely; Israel, Joel, Moses, John, and Thomas. My grandfather had two sisters, Naomi and Ruth.

Great-grandmother gathered her data from folks in Tennessee in 1889 when she and grand Aunt Frances went back to visit. They gathered a voluminous record, and we always said our genealogy was all done.

Our family stories were well remembered. Great grandpa had poled the raft away from the bank of the Caney Fork in Putnam County, Tennessee, and floated down to the Cumberland, with my great- grandmother, their children, and their belongings, they drifted on the Ohio River for a little while before they kept their rendezvous on the Mississippi River with the steamship, Saluda. Theirs was the only family on the Saluda that did not lose a member when the terrible explosion came spewing death and destruction. Grand Aunt Martha was rescued just before she went down for the last time, and Grandpa was found on the bank where the force of the explosion blew him. Great-grandpa told his family to stand up and be counted. They were all there. Because of boarding at Lexington, Missouri, instead of at New Orleans, our family had not been warned, as other LDS families had, against traveling on the ill-fated ship. They were all spared in health but lost much property.

When their company reached the Valley, Great-grandfather's grave was one of those that marked the trail behind them. Great-grandmother raised her family in Utah as best she could. When they were settled in homes, she turned her time and attention to gathering her genealogy from Tennessee.

She knew her people very well, so she did not record the dates and places of their births, marriages, and deaths, or give the relationship of each one to herself. She listed male relatives in one book and female in another. If she knew the dates and places of birth offhand she put them in the spaces provided for that purpose. Otherwise? she did not Relationship in those early days of temple work was figured to the proxy performing the ordinances. If Great-grandmother or Grandfather performed the ordinances, they stated their relationship. If they were assisted by friends or neighbors, the relationship to our family was lost to us, so far as that record was concerned.

Plainly our beginning task was to tabulate the existing record onto modern sheets and identify the lists of names, so far as possible, with their immediate families. A meager pedigree and a few incomplete family group sheets emerged, enough for the checking with records in the Church Archives. A survey of the Archives' records showed that other LDS families were attempting to compile the Jared genealogy. We made their acquaintance and were able to collaborate with them.

After exhausting the supply of information in the Archives, we turned our attention to the Early Church Records section of the Genealogical Library. We found information of great value there, because our folks joined the Church in the early days and experienced the building and the expulsion from Nauvoo.

My great-grandparents with their children and belongings floated down the Ohio River to meet the steamship "Saluda."

The Genealogical librarians in Salt Lake City have gathered much information about Tennessee settlers. We learned that during the depression, the State of Tennessee had sponsored a WPA project, which resulted in the compilation of a book for each county in the state. These books are made up from family Bible records, personal letters, affidavits, bills tax lists, land and property exchanges, store bills and accounts, family histories, and all manner of sundry bits of personal information pertaining to families residing in the various counties. The books had been carefully typed and placed on the shelves of the state library at Nashville. The librarian has been generous in permitting our Church microfilming teams to copy the contents, and all this information is available to searchers in the Genealogical Library at Salt Lake City. These sources increased our knowledge.

Personal contact with our relatives in Tennessee seemed to be our next step. The question was, to whom should we write? Were there descendants of the families on record who could help us further? Mother opened her battered old trousseau trunk hoping an old letter she had been meaning to answer for fifty years was still there. She found it. It was dated June 11, 1911.

Miss Ida Young  
My Dear Cousin:

I have just found a letter you wrote me several years ago, dated April 14, 1897. I have wanted to get in communication with some of my Utah cousins for some time, but it seemed that I had lost all trace of you all. My sister used to correspond with cousin Anna Young; but since she, my sister Mae, married and moved away I could never find cousin's address anymore. I don't know just how old or what size you are, but you said you were in the seventh grade of school. That was about fourteen years ago so I suppose you are about my age.

You may have changed your name long before now, but hope you will get my letter and let me hear from you all. My name is Betsy Ann after Aunt Betsy Ann Nichols. We have lived in Missouri fifteen years. I am a stenographer and bookkeeper for a seed house.

On July 20, 1950, I wrote to this Miss Bettye Jared, at the address given,  
Dear Miss Jared,

I do hope you get this letter. My mother, Ida Young McAllister, gave me a letter you sent to her in 1911 when I was one year old. I am the fifth of her twelve children. I am married and have two sons. One is on a mission in North Carolina for our church. He is to come home late in September, and I hope to go down and come back with him. On the way I would like to look up some of our relatives in Tennessee and visit the old Jared Home where my great grandmother, Rhoda Byrne Jared Young was born. I recently read a history of Putnam County -Tennessee], and it leads me to believe there may still be a number of my Jared and Young kin living there. I should like to become acquainted with them.

I am sending this letter hoping it will find you, and maybe you will be my guide as to whom and where I should visit.

This was her reply 10 days later.

Hocomo, Missouri  
August 1, 1950

Dear Eleanor,

Sure I got your letter. Came to me almost as quick as if I'd been Miss Bettye Jared. You see, my brothers are still in business in Springfield on Commercial St. and the only Jared's there, so they knew that the letter was for me, and forwarded it right on. Sure was glad to hear from some of my Utah kin.

You certainly will find lots of kin folks in Tennessee, nearly everyone around there is kin. You will find some of Aunt Nichols' grandchildren on the old Jared place. At Cookeville, the county seat of Putnam, you will find lots of cousins. Call for Ellen Jared there, and she can give you information.

There followed a long list of names, addresses, and connections.

The trip did not materialize that fall, but letters kept coming from everywhere. On Nov. 7, 1950, one came from Frank A Robinette of Amarillo, Texas. Last August 1 was visiting in Missouri, and a cousin showed me a letter you had written to a kinswoman, Bettye Jared, of Springfield, Missouri.

In 1944, I was in Tennessee visiting; and we drove into the old region from which our grandma came to, Missouri in the 1840's. Our distant cousin, Mrs. Pearl Jared High, accompanied us on a tour of the old people and places; and we met an old Jared relation said she remembered her well. She also spoke of the Jared girl going to Utah long, long ago, and marrying a man by the name of Young, of the LDS Church. Said she paid them a visit once long ago.

More than ten years ago, with the assistance of Mrs. High, I located the holder of the old Capt. William Jared family Bible and had photos made of its records. I enclose a set for you.

Here was a copy of my third great-grandmother's and great-grandfather's Bible, giving births, marriages, and deaths of all his children and grandchildren. He said his parents were John Jared and Hannah Whitacre.

The correspondence continued. It went through DAR cousins; Pearl High of Cookeville, Tennessee; and Grace Jared of Olney, Illinois; and skipped down to Little Rock, Arkansas, to a most helpful cousin, retired Judge John Jarrett. He discovered the account book our John Jared used in his wagon making business. It was found in the attic of his old grandaunt in Kentucky. John had recorded his ancestors and descendants in the back of the old day book He gave the record of his marriage to Hannah Whitacre and their children's names and dates. Hannah's death date was recorded and John's marriage to Rachel Palmer, together with the names and dates of their children. The record matched our information perfectly. John had recorded the names and dates of his parents, which enabled us to trace the line back to Jamestown, Virginia.

In 1963 we published a book showing 11,000 descendants of old John Jared. His descendants were among the first settlers of middle Tennessee.

Dad and Mother were married November 27, 1933 in the frontier town of Deadwood, South Dakota, about five years after I was born, which in retrospect, demands an explanation. That's why I'm here today — to demand an explanation, or rather, to be a character witness to explain these things to you — if I can think of something you'll buy.

Charles was three years old the day of the marriage. He and I had lost our Mother earlier that year, and Dad had courted (apparently by Pony Express mail) her younger sister who was caring for us in St.— George, Utah.

Eleanor, the younger sister, brought us to Deadwood by bus and train because the stage didn't run to Sundance, Wyoming, where Dad had an office upstairs over a vacant lot where they kept fire horses and hoses. The Sundance Kid, (Harvey Longbaugh) was apparently named after this town, which was the County Seat of Crook County, which was named after Crooks like The Sundance Kid.

We lived in the parsonage of the local Methodist Church, right where the board sidewalk ended on the way out of town which we also were, (on the way out of town), after about a year had elapsed. It is recorded we stayed in town longer than Butch Cassidy, even at that.

Rawlins, Wyoming was our next hometown, near where our Mom had been killed enroute to Sundance the previous year. The L D S Branch President and the Sunday School Superintendent were Eyres, (Railroad men) from around Murray, Utah. One of the Western States Missionaries who used to come and stay with us there, was Lew Heaps, who is now in my High Priest group in California, and also an Oakland Temple Worker.

We left Rawlins suddenly too; for a teaching position in Big Piney, Wyoming. (Next to Fraser, Colorado, this is the coldest spot in the nation.) It was another town like Sundance with no LDS Branch and was again, truly the Wild West. Dad was a successful basketball coach there but again escaped to Utah before the school years was completed to avoid a whole community quarantine for a new disease. A real polio scare, we landed in East Midvale, Utah where we ran a grocery store, vegetable stand operation on the corner of 7200 South State St. and Union Avenue. It is vacant there now, but there was a "Genie Boy" restaurant there until just recently. We farmed the eight acres immediately to the west

and attended the Midvale Third Ward. Dad started work at Bingham. Charles started the first grade. Mom started genealogical work, and I started to worry. Dad told me that if I worried too much I would go bald, and that really worried me; understandably, even then.

Mom and Dad worked very hard together and were very happy during our years at Midvale, and then also at Murray, where they bought their first home in December of 1937. They worked so hard, played so hard and even danced so hard it used to make me tired just to watch them. It didn't bother Charlie though — until they made us work hard too. Is there anyone here who knew us when we lived in Murray? Those were the days. Remember Merlin Shaw, Jesse Casper, Paul Rose, Earl Smith, and many more? Dad was, like these men, always a boy's man wherever we lived. I remember when I was a young Branch President in Korea, an Air Force pilot approached me after a meeting and said, "You're Vern Hall's boy—he was my Scoutmaster in Midvale, Utah." That type of greeting has been common place in my life.

Dad was prominent in 4—H Club work in Murray, and Mom became a prominent genealogist. Mom was also Primary President and a great boys' woman. Perhaps some of you remember Vere McHenry, Bud Westover, Douglas Allen, Art Parks, Bob Born and Vance Halliday. They and many others were her Guides in Primary. Glen Tuckett, Earl Townsend, Dick Howe, were some more.

Both Dad and Mother were school teachers by profession and in 1945 they were offered jobs teaching High School in Bancroft, Idaho. "Far Out!"; that term had not been coined yet but it fits Bancroft. What can I say about Bancroft — that you'll believe? Is there anyone here from Bancroft? It doesn't matter who they are; everyone from Bancroft are the same - their different. We lived about five years in Bancroft, but it only took ten months. It is a farming/railroad town where they grow wheat, potatoes, snowdrifts, comedians, missionaries, grain elevators, and fine girls. If any good can come out of Nazereth, then Clarence Call can come out of Bancroft; and he did, like many others of his kind, to enrich the four corners of the earth. I've met them wherever I've gone. Their success is measured by the good they do for others; and its obvious from the questions they ask me that their teachers, Mr. and Mrs. Hall had a great impact for good upon their lives.

After a year in Bancroft a long sought dream came true for Mom and Dad. They bought their own farm - a bit of rocky bench land with some lush bottomland and a chunk of mountainside in a beautiful upper

Weber River setting, 1946 through 1959 they spent there and today Kamas Valley is different and better because of them. The dairy herds are finer due to Utah's first successful artificial insemination program founded by Dad in that valley. The genealogical library and the temple were never too far away for my folks to frequent. Through the Veteran's Farm Program, the Stake Temple/Genealogy program and callings to work with the youth they left many improved families and dairy herds in the it wake.

Charles and I left for our missions from Oakley on the Weber, and although I spent little time in Oakley I returned to steal away the Stake President's daughter for my eternal companion and to be the mother of eight children and sixteen grandchildren, at last count.

In 1959 they sold the farm and located near the library and temple at 157 North State Street, to retire to the most productive period of their lives. Theirs was an experience so big I can't write about it. It was like Grand Central Station, The Salt Lake Tabernacle annex, and the London subway, but with the love of God and man. It was families meeting others, choosing mates, temple marriages, sealings, meeting new and old friends, Family —Home—Evenings, music, and eternal ties. It lasted twenty—two years and included eighteen months in the Pennsylvania— Harrisburg Mission. (Is there anyone here who has not been to 157 North State Street?)

And, is there anyone here who, as a kid 40 or 50 years ago, living in the south part of Salt Lake Valley who has not ridden your bike out to, and down Butlerville Hill, (without tearing up your bike?) I have done that, but somehow, now I'm lost out here. I can't see the town for the houses. As always, though, we still consider the H. V. Hall home a haven; made so by its proprietors. The address may have changed, but the humble home has not.

People across the WORLD would feel better about the thoughts of going to God if they had something on earth to compare it with. Many people across the world do have something here in Butlerville.

Thanks, Mom and Dad, Uncle Vern, and Aunt Eleanor, Brother and Sister Hall, Grandpa and Grandma\_\_\_\_\_ Have a happy eternity.

Yuba City High music director finds satisfaction

The Yuba City High School Band room fills with young musicians every school day at 2 p.m., the last class period of the day. The atmosphere is lively, with brass and percussion instruments in practice, and empty places where the woodwinds are temporarily absent. The snare drummer rounds off a composition with evident satisfaction. a solo,.

Peter Hall, a former YCHS tuba player, has assumed directorship at his alma mater this year, by way of music studies at Yuba College, Brigham Young University and five years as an assistant to Richard Morrissey predecessor. Hall's familiarity with YCHS band allows him to go about his duties with a relaxed demeanor. Not many surprises are likely, with his back ground in all aspects of the business, but triumphs may be anticipated. The young players seem to trust his musical judgment, and he theirs.

The door opens and woodwind members enter and take their places. The rest of the band continues undisturbed. Gradually the sounds fill out with higher tones and richer music as flutes and clarinets pick up their parts. Despite the arrival of musicians carrying music stands, chairs and instruments, no disruption occurs - no change in tempo. no pauses for orientation. The woodwinds have been practicing in another room with assistant director Janet Nason. The completed band begins a new selection, "Instant Concert," an arrangement by Harold Walters. A couple of bars of "Rule Britannia" begin, then meld into "Jeannie with the Light Brown Hair," suddenly that has become "My Grandfather's Clock" and subsequently "Jingle Bells" or an Irish Hornpipe. Mexican folksong or Hebrew melody, turning into "Three Blind Mice." The players keep straight faces by some miracle known only to practicing performers.

"It's a laugh," Hall admits relaxing after practice in his office, which is partitioned off from a noisy instrument room. His concentrated hour with the band has ended. Trombonist

Working with young people at alma mater

Alan Brownley remained a moment after class is dismissed to repeat a challenging phrase.

The band director's mornings are spent in intermediate school band practice, preparing junior students for marching bands and for advanced work in high school. All four Yuba City intermediate schools support bands. with the majority (90 percent) of new YCHS band members coming from Gray Avenue Intermediate.

A few players have become serious music students, such as the trombonist mentioned above who began music as a freshman at YCHS: Sandy Larsen tenor saxophone: and Patricia Pednault piccolo and first flute.

Two foreign exchange students —from Germany and Denmark — are participating in YCHS band this year as clarinetists. For them, marching bands are a unique American experience, one not available in their own countries.

Hall has personally experienced the rewards of band participation. His music background at YCHS helped him decide to become a music teacher.

"I really enjoyed playing. In music education, I'm able to do a lot of performing music. What's great about it is the feeling of performing well. the discipline one can learn. It may not always end in satisfaction; here is one place you really get back what you put into it."

The benefits or embarrassments are immediate and unequivocal, as in a glaring false tone or an inopportune entrance or losing track of the score.

The bandleader performs privately with Robert Holmes, Marysville High School band director, and has played with the Yuba-Sutter Oratorio Symphony. At present, however, his spare time is committed to administrative classes at California State University, Chico.

Both YCHS and MHS bands have off shoots of jazz. An extracurricular group of about 18 YCHS students meets evenings.

"I'm pretty excited about that. They're mostly the kids who tend to be serious: who'll go on with music after high school. You need something with new challenges for the top kids."

One plan is to gather musicians from all the area schools in joint ventures following the pattern of cooperation the leaders found when YCHS and MHS bands traveled together to British Columbia for the Queen's Birthday Celebration. It resulted in "lots of kids getting together. no fights."

"Eliminating the rancor and competition can only help the area bands. If we get together whenever feasible, we can learn from the way other bands function and how they rehearse."

Playing in band helps students who come from other areas —"sometimes with only a day's notice" — to fit into a new school environment. Band permits a readymade acceptance, "where automatically a new student finds people with things in common, or music the new comer may have played at a former school. A connection is established."

Dealing with his students is not all ease and comfort, but "I like them." he says. "They're good kids. Trying to learn to grow up — sometimes hard on me hard on them — and some don't manage. A difficult home life may make it too hard to grow."

The better students Hall expects will progress through the Yuba College music department, then to four year colleges. YCHS band members often continue at Yuba College. Then San Jose State or Chico, or BYU.

Why did the teacher choose the bandleader way of life?

"Sometimes you wonder — noisy, goof-ups and all." More seriously, he enlarges. "For one thing it's a kind of service. You help someone do something they couldn't do alone an individual accomplishment with personal rewards.

"The other purpose is the thought of creation say a piece of music the kids can't play, (that) they've never seen it before. Gradually they learn it, instill a new score into their memories. People out there, who didn't know that music, enjoy hearing it. That's why people get into teaching and teaching music.

## SOME MEMORIES OF LUE

Luetta McAllister Hall, 1904 —1933

Considering Michael's request that I write a page or two about the life of his grandmother, Luetta, I reach back into my earliest memories of her. Incidentally they are the earliest memories I have about me, too.

Our parents, Dick and Ida McAllister, took the old wicker baby buggy to the farm in Johnson Canyon, when they moved the family that summer, because Boyd, the current baby, was only three months old. I, being 23 months older than the baby, "was as big as anybody!"

On our way to the farm, the 320 acre homestead, Dad and Mom were trying to "prove—up on" in Johnson Canyon, Kane Co., Utah, lay twenty miles from our home in Kanab. We were traveling light, because we were taking the short—cut over the Sands, to recompense for our late start, and to get Dad and the boys to the farm in time for evening chores. That meant we would go up Kanab Canyon to Hog Canyon, go through the beautiful Hog Canyon with its meadows and chuckling brooks, then over the Sand Dunes that was why we couldn't take a heavy load. Everyone except Mom and the baby got out and walked over the sands. That is, all the big kids but me. Mom simply would not let me walk through all that sand. How I wanted to join Luetta, Bernell, Annie and John as they ran from clump to dumb of the big pink sand—lilies that at the moment reclaimed that desert spot. Had I been allowed to go I would also have picked the great white thistle blossoms, that they for some to me, in explainable reason, - completely ignored those beauties.

Before my crying spell was over we had crossed the sands, and were in Dry Valley. Sure enough, the reservoir in Dry Valley was dry as usual. With everybody in the wagon now, we hurried through that little vale, and headed down the last short canyon that turned the point just at the tall swing trees, and pulled over to the granary and the big tent that made our housing for the summers. The sun was still up, but very low, and the tinkle of the cowbells could be heard from down at the pasture gate where the impatient cows waited with distended udders. They had not been milked since the night before when Dad and Bernell, milked them early, so they could get home with the horses and get us all back to the farm before dark the next night. The wagon stopped in the narrow passage between the tent and the granary, and we all piled out. The first job, as always, was to look for snakes. If any had wondered into camp, they must be disposed of first. Then Luetta and Bernell headed for the pasture gate to get the cows. Ring our collie dog bounded after them, and I, too, started out to help.

But, I was called back I couldn't go! Tears of frustration accompanied by kicks and squeals reverberated from the echoes of the surrounding cliffs.

Then I saw an avenue of escape, the hole in the tent above the kitchen table. That nobody, absolutely nobody, was to touch until it could be repaired. I jumped onto a chair, upon to the table and stuck my head through the hole (that had been only a little slit before) and called, "Wing go wiff 'oo. to kill aa' snakes

In no time, Lue and Bernell were back with the cows, and Dad and Bernell were milking them. Mom was making supper, and Luetta, Annie, and John had turned their attention me. Lue put a pillow in the wicker baby buggy and laid me on it, then with the help of Annie and John she began decorating it, with the wild flowers they had gathered on the Sands and in Dry Valley. They wove the stems into the holes of the wicker buggy until it was a mass of flowers. Then they heaped them over me. I lay very still, feeling beautiful, loved, and secure. Lue had that way about her, of making everyone feel loved, needed, and valuable to her.

Most of my very early memories of Luetta are connected with the farm. I don't think they all happened any one summer. I seem to have all the memories of the farm jumbled into one entangled heterogeneous hodge—podge, that covered the next six years. We only lived there the one summer, I believe, but there was an awful lot of travel back and forth the years the family stayed in Kanab to take care of our property there. In irrigation country ground must have particularly close husbanding. So we never built a house over there. Just used the tent for cooking and eating, and used the grainer for bedrooms. The various grain bins made our room partitions. Enough grain was in the bottom of the bins to be covered with a tarp, or horse blanket, then a mattress, then the bedding, and finally the kids, just layered up in those bins. As the new grain crops were harvested in the late summer and fall our beds became higher and higher, as boards were added to make them hold more grain, until finally we had to have the step ladder to get into bed. Then we could touch the ceiling, and the beds had to come out and all the little kids go home to start school. A cot or two were added to the crowded eating quarters, and beds were made in the covered wagon for those who stayed to finish the harvest and bring the animals home.

Across the canyon to the east of our house was a particularly beautiful and quaintly formed pink and white sandstone formation. Beautiful to see from the kitchen tent. Wonderful for us kids to play on when we were allowed to go so far from home. One particularly pronounced formation that we called "Molly's Nipple" was a favorite play place. Dad was building an irrigation dam under the ledge of interesting formations, and Mom was fixing lunches for all the kids to go with him, and spend the day. Bernell and John helping, and Lue and Annie just to play, and do whatever they wished.

Mom had made two little blue "butterfly" dresses for Luetta and Annie, with bonnets to match. They looked especially jaunty as the five of them took their lunches and hiked across the Wheat field, the potato patch, and the strip of un-cleared sagebrush, where the work and play would begin. I had had my tantrum to no avail, and was now with stubbornly protruding lips, planning a way to get there by myself. The men folks, and the team disappeared into the "wash" where they would work. The two little blue dots began to climb the hill across the wash and straight to Molly's Nipple. I had my answer. Luetta sitting on the very peak of that strange rock looked about the size of one of the doll cups in my little set of blue dishes. I called to Mama. "There's a little blue thing on Molly's Nipple, can I go pick it up?". She laughed, and I bawled again.

When the cousins came, which they did often, especially the Adams cousins who lived just down the canyon a few miles at "Oak Springs"

we had great fun. "Run Sheep Run" was our favorite game. Luetta and Nate were the usual leaders, and chose up sides for their sheep in about an even way, usually; but one time, for some reason, Nate had all the sheep and Lue had me for her one little lamb. I suppose it was because of a bet, or challenge of some kind. Lue never did any thing without a good reason.

Goal was under the cow shed. A clean cow—shed, mind you. One built to shelter the animals that would be left on the farm all winter. The poles were set in the sandy loam, branches made the cross—wise roof base to hold the straw that was thrown onto the shed and down behind it and also fell around both sides, as the first thrashing in that country separated the wheat and piled the straw behind that shed. What shot over the top and landed in front was pushed into the shed for winter bedding, but now, before winter came it was a good place for a play—house, and that's what we girls made of it. And that's the place we had all chosen for goal in our game of "Run— Sheep—Run". Those waiting at goal could see out in only one direction and that left a lot of room to hide for the other side.

Lue lead me away from the goal when it was her turn to hide me. She only took me a little way beyond the big cedar tree that shaded the milk and cheese cooler, and gave me instructions. She would circuit around and come into the cow—shed from the opposite direction. I was to stay well back out of sight, and circuit in the other side and climb the straw stack back of the shed, as she called certain signals; but before anyone else could see me, I was to be sitting on top of the shed directly above the goal.

She made her circuitous route back to the goal and drew her map in the sand. It was by no means according to scale. Nate lead his crew out and Lue began calling her signals. She kept calmly calling, "blue, blue" which meant keep climbing the straw stack, but don't let anyone see you. When Nate's side were away past the tent, the granary, The Cedar tree and starting up the hill to the black rock, she suddenly yelled "Pink". Everybody turned toward goal, just in time to see me jump off the shed and touch Goal under it. They marveled at how she persuaded me to jump off that shed. Only I knew that I could do anything she made up her mind to.

The last time we went to the farm we had to be taken out of school. Dad had been made Bishop of Kanab Ward, and the inconvenience of farm and town work and travel was too much with the Church work that would entail. Besides, he was never able to dig a well. The soil was too sandy, and would cave in everywhere he tried to make one work. We had to haul our drinking water from "Oak Springs". The water in the creek was not fit for human consumption. Years later, when the right kind of machinery was developed, a wonderful artesian well was developed on that property. Dad sold the place. He took us kids up there for the last time to help him dig the potatoes. Everything else was moved back to Kanab, or had been sold. All other crops were gathered.

It was late Saturday night, and he had a Bishop's meeting scheduled for early Sunday morning. He filled the double bed wagon box nearly full of potatoes and covered them with a thick layer of straw, and made our beds on top. He gave us our supper and put us to bed. The wagon was so loaded we could see out without sitting up, when he rolled the wagon cover up a bit and tied it to the bows so we could see out until darkness would come.

The sun was setting with its usual rosy autumn afterglow when we pulled out of the old farm gate and closed it for the last time. The gate was near the irrigation dam he had built so long ago, and some stray cattle had accumulated there for an evening drink. Dad got out and chased them away, barking like a dog, so they wouldn't break the fences down and get into the place. I wondered why he should bother. It wasn't our place any more, and nothing was left by way of crops that they could destroy. Perhaps it was his way of distracting us, so he wouldn't have a scene with his bunch of emotional kids, on this the last end of eight or ten years of hard work and pleasant living in this beautiful spot. But then, Dad was like that, always looking out for the other fellow. His oldest daughter had a generous supply of that same trait. She always knew how the other fellow felt, and either enjoyed happiness with them, or steered them into other avenues if things were not right with them.

This night there was a melancholy with all of us. She pointed to the first star that shone in the air, and taught us all to wish upon it. She showed us the Milky Way, The Great Dipper, and the Little bear. She taught us this poem:

The man in the moon, as he sails the sky,  
Is a very remarkable skipper  
But he made a mistake as he went to take  
A drink of milk from the dipper.

He dipped right into the Milky way  
And slowly and carefully filled it  
The big bear growled,  
And the little bear howled,  
And scared him so that he spilled it.

We were wakened before light the next morning by some man down in the town of Johnson, joshing Dad for getting breakfast ready before he got his kids out of bed. He even served us in bed that morning and let us eat it as we went on our way. He still had ten miles to go, and he figured that Mama could get us up and bathe us when he got us home. Which of course she did. He made his early meeting, and we made it to Sunday School at 10 A. M. When those two ganged up on getting a job done they simply did not fail. However, they always said that without Lue, and her unique managerial ability, they could not have been so successful
