Item I give and Bequeath unto my Son W^m. Ruess all that
part of the Tract of Land I now live on, on the north side of the
falling Run granted me by patent bearing Date the eighth
day of September one Thousand seven Hundred and Twenty
Eight: also one Hundred and fifty acres adjoining the lower part
of said Tract of Land beginning at the mouth of a small Run
on the north side of the falling Run at the upper end of the great
Meadow and thence to my back line to include the aforesaid
Quantity. also my Negro man Peter, my Horse Stall, and one
young man and one Feather Bed and furniture to him and his
Heirs forever.

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Son Henry Ruess all that part
of that Tract of Land which I live which lies on the south side
of the falling Run, also one Hundred and thirty acres of Land
the lower part of a Tract adjoining the Land I live on also my
Negro Boy Jacob, and one Feather Bed and furniture to him and
his Heirs forever.

Item I give unto my Daughter Sarah Vincent one Negro girl
named Lucy one Cow and Calf and two Sheep to her and
her Heirs forever.

named Ann three Cows and Calves and Six pewter plates to her and
her Heirs forever.

Item I give and Request unto my Daughter Elizabeth Knowlton
my Negro Wench Hannah to her and her Heirs forever.

Item I give unto my Daughter Abigail Knowlton my Negro Wench
Milly to her and her Heirs forever.

My will is that my Fall with all the residue of my Estate not
bequeathed or given away, be sold and the money arising therefrom
be Equally Divided amongst my ^{four youngest} children William
Henry, Elizabeth, and Abigail and if any of my last mentioned
children should die before they arrive to the age of Twenty one or
Married then my will is that their part be Equally Divided amongst
my surviving children their age not to be regarded ever.
