Article of Agreement Between Herman H. Brower & John Fusmer

Articles of Agreement made this 9th day of November 1872 by and between Herman H. Brower of the town of Palatine County of Montgomery & State of New York of the first part, and John Fusmer of the same place of the second part.

Witnesseth that the said party of the first part for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, hereby agrees to sell all the timber on a certain wood lot, situate in said town and bounded as follows: viz: on the north by the lands of Herman Brower: south by the lands of Jonas Rice: East by the lands John Connolly & widow Brower & west by the lands of Charles Miller & Peter J. Dillenback--containing $18\frac{55}{100}$ acres more-or-less.

And the said party of the second part hereby agrees to buy said timber and pay for the same the sum of \$1576.75 being at the rate of \$85.00 pr acre--to be paid by said party of the second part as follows viz: the sum of \$876.75. Cash paid down and the balance \$700.00 to be secured by a good Endowed note such as will be acceptable to the party of the first part to be made payable at sight--and the said party of the second part is to have five years to cut & remove said timber.
