The genealogy "tentatively" assigns a son named Pieter to his family. However, the two records cited, a 1731 church membership of Antje Berge and the 1759 administration of Peter Brewer of Shrewsbury, cannot belong to the same man. The 1731 membership, as described, is in error. The actual record, found in GMNJ 22:4, states that Antje Berge was the widow of Peter Brower. As he died prior to 1731, this Peter Brower cannot be the Peter Brewer whose estate was administered in 1759. No direct, or circumstantial evidence, is provided to account for a son named Pieter. The genealogy does not address the parentage or possible parentage of Annatje Jans. Hereinafter cited as "Jan Brouwer."
