(From a letter dated 16 June 1980, written by COL John B Clark, RETIRED of 2306 Wilkinson Flace in Alexandria, Virginia 22306. He had received a letter from a Mr Alfred Brower of 25 Locust Street of Elmwood Park, New Jersey 07407, which is quoted in a part below:)

"In a book put out by the Francis Vige Chapter of the DAR pertaining to Pioneer Families of Knox and Sullivan Counties in Indiana, it states that the father of Adam Brouwer Berkheven, who married Magdalena Verden in 1645, was Peter Clement Brouwer, a merchant of the city of Heern, Holland and who was the first president and general manager of the Dutch West Indies Company, founded in 1614. Also, Magdalena Verden's father was the secretary of the Company and her grandfather, Thomas Badie, was the treasurer. Peter Clement Brouwer was born in Heern, Holland in 1580 and died in 1625. He was married to Helena May. She was born in 1581 in France and her brother was the Navigator for the same Company. She died in 1641, the year before Adam came to New Amsterdam. Peter Clement was the son of Nicholas Brouwer, born in 1555, married Sophia Kiess. She was born in 1558, the daughter of Nicholas Kiess. Nicholas Brouwer's father was Arant Brouwer, Burgemeister of Amsterdam from 1550 until his death in 1575. Arant Brouwer and his brother owned all the breweries and flour mills in Amsterdam and Heern at the time of Arant's death."

(NOTE: If this is true, then references to Simon Brouwer and Frans Sigmensen Brouwer of Katwijk, Holland and reportedly Adam's parents will have to be reevaluated. This note by COL Clark.)

(From the pen of Clarence S. McClow of 6818 Blenheim Road Apt B Baltimore, Maryland 21212, we have the following information):

DUTCH RECORDS ANNEKE JANS AND BROWER - MCCLOW LINES

King William XIV of Holland (Ref. N.Y. Geneo & Bio Record), VOL 56, page 203, had a daughter Anneke. She had a grand-daughter also named Anneke, daughter of Wolford and Anna Webber. She married Rocloffe Jans of Westerland in Holland. They had four children: Sarah, who married John Kierstead and later Cornelius Van Bussum; Catherine, who married John Van Brough; Fytie, who married Peter Hartgers; and Jan, who married Annetje Peters in 1682.

Rocloffe Jans died and shortly thereafter, Annette came to New Netherland (now New York) where she met and married (in 1638) Rev. Evardus Bogardus, who was a widower. They lived in Rens Selaerwyck.

Her first husband, Jans, received a valuable grant of land near Red Hook, New Jersey. (Doc. History III #367). He also secured from Gov. Van Twiller of New York, a grant of sixty-two acres on Manhattan Island, a little north of Fort Amsterdam. This was the original conveying of the valuable estate north of Warren Street, in New York, now in the possession of the corporation of the Trinity Church.

With her second marriage to Bogardus, she had four more children: William, born Nov 2, 1638 and died in 1711, and who married Wyntie Sybrant on Aug 29, 1658; Cornelius, born in 1640, who married Rachel DeWitt; James, born 1643; and Petrus, no record of his marriage.

In 1705, the farm (then called the King's farm) was lear at to the Trinity Church Corp. Cornelius did not sign the lease.

William Bogardus and his wife, Syntie Sybrant, had three children: Evarardus; Sytie; and Anneke, who was baptised Oct 3, 1663. She later married Jacob Brower (or Bruer, Brouwer) of Gowanus on Jan 29, 1662. They were divorced April 5, 1709. Their children were:

BROWER - MCCLOW HISTORY

Adolphus Brower married Jane Farden in Bergen County, N.J. Their sixth child, Isaac Brower, born in 1725; married Jane Quackenbush. There were four children from this marriage: Paul, Daniel, John and Elizabeth.

Elizabeth Brower married Cornelius McClow (or McCloe, Mucklow) on May 10, 1785 in Trenton, N.J. Records were burned in the 1812 War. She died March 20, 1812 in Black Hole Valley, now part of the Federal Allenwood Penetentiary, in Fennsylvania. Cornelius McClow and Elizabeth Brower had eleven children. (My line is listed in capitals).

(From a letter dated July 6, 1980 from Mr William L. Brower of Route 1 Box 211, Grove, OK 74344, we have the following:)

"Thank you for the packet of Brower genealogy materials. VOL III, Number 1, dated April 1978 is my line. I have a record written by a member of the family in 1850. It is as follows:

Adam Brower was born in the year of our Lord, 1801, February the 16th and was wedded in the year 1822 the 3rd of November.

Charity Foust was born in the year of our Lord, 1800, August the 26th day and was wedded in the year 1822 the 3rd of November.

Delila Brower, a daughter, was born in the year of our Lord, 1823, March the 29th day.

Eliza Brower, a daughter, was born in the year of our Lord, 1824, August the 16th.

Mary Brower, a daughter, was born in the year of our Lord, 1826, March the 26th day.

Carrel Brower, a son, was born in the year of our Lord, 1828, June the 23rd day, and deceist May 24th (?), 1860.

Carrington Brower, a son, was born in the year of our Lord, 1830, May the 11th day.

George Washington Brower, a son, was born in the year of our Lord, 1832, April the 30th day.

Ephraigm Franklin Brower (my grandfather), a son, was born in the year of our Lord, 1834, April the 3rd day.

Elizabeth Ruffina Brower, a daughter, was born in the year of our Lord, 1836, March the 31st day.

John Marion Brower, a son, was born in the year of our Lord, 1838, March the 24th day.

Sampson Makepease Brower, a son, was born in the year of our Lord, 1840, February the 18th day.

Lovey Caroline Brower, a daughter, was born in the year of our Lord, 1843, June the 23rd day.

Ruffin Columbus Brower, a son, was born in the year of our Lord, 1845, November the 4th day.

The following dated April the 20th, A.D., 1850:

Ephraigm's first wife, Permelia, died 20 minutes before 2 o'clock A.M. on June 20th, 1962. She was 29 years, 8 months, and 26 days old. He married Mary Frances Brunton on Oct 6, 1862. She was born Oct 9, 1844 in Ill. and died Feb 28, 1911. Ephraigm died October 3, 1902.

I have Ephraigm's children as well as Ephraigm's trother John's family. Not as complete as to dates, however, if anyone is interested.

Ephraigm served in the 23rd Missouri Volunteer in the Civil War, Co. F.

I was adopted by Joseph E Brower and his wife, Mae Oyler Brower. Joseph was the eighth of ten children of Ephraigm and Mary Frances Brower, and Parmelia (his first wife).

You may feel free to publish any of this information and I will be glad to share any other family genealogy I have. We do inted to finish the preparation of Ephraigm's Civil War diary for publication next winter. He kept fantistic and descriptive records of all his movements and sight seeing trips.

Ephraigm and both of his wives are buried in the Glaze Cametery, Cainsville, Harrison County, Missouri.

Mrs Catherine Brower of 300 Cass Plaza Drive Logansport, Indiana, sent me a portion of the PERU TRIBUNE dated 22 July 1978. "Back in 1901 the ladies of the Bunker Hill Methodist Church made a quilt. It has 1,000 names embroidered on it. The quilt is now on display at the Miami County Historical Society in Peru, Indiana." I see the names of my grandparents, father, my aunt and two of my uncles.

Mr Arthur Shaw of 109 West Main Street in New Paris, Ohio 45347 sent a copy of an obit from the Eaton Register dated 19 August, 1931. It is copied verbatim. Following the obit is the lineage of Mr. Shaw:

"Eaton Register Herald - Wednesday, August 19, 1931

DANIEL M. BROWER

Daniel M. Brower was born the fourth day of August, 1847, and died August the eighth, 1931, aged 84 years, 4 days. He was the eldest of four children born to John and Elizabeth Brower. His entire life was spent in this country and community, having been born and reared upon his father's farm, adjoining his own and upon which he lived until his death.

He attended school at the Dooley district school and in his late years took great pride in recalling the many pleasant memories of that time and looked forward to the annual reunion of teachers and pupils of the school.

On May 28, 1884, he was united in marriage to Dora Hildebolt, who died in September 1892. To this union were born two daughters. On June 6, 1894 he was married to Emma Clark, who preceded him in death on September 8, 1926. After her death, many hours of his time was spent in writing. Several poems were printed in the newspapers and received much favorable comment from far and near. His last poem dedicated to his surviving schoolmates, entitled "The Fassing Years or The Last Milestone", he had just completed the poem four days previous to his death and had intended to present it to them at the coming reunion of the Dooley school district.

He is survived by his two daughters, Mrs Walter Shaw of Eaton, and Mrs Glenn Spacht of Philadelphia, Pa.; two grandsons, Arthur Shaw and Brower Spacht, and a host of relatives and friends who mourn his loss."

The above Jacob Brower I believe to be correct. However, there is a big question about Henry Brower. I believe it to be correct but am not sure. Can you help? From Daniel Brower on line three (3) and below, I am real sure. I have much information on most of the children from Daniel (line 3) on. Some is lacking, however.

The information I have on Jacob Brower is what I got from George Brower in Preble County. There seems to be at least 3 lines or branches of Browers in Preble County (Eaton). One in eastern Preble County around West Alexandria, and east into Montgomery County. Then my line that settled southwest of Eaton, five miles, by Daniel Brower and who is buried there. Then there is still another line in western Preble County.

I have never been able to connect any of these families. However, I believe they can be traced back to the brothers of Jacob or to his cousins. HELP!!

1) VOL IV, Number 1, dated April 1979 - at the bottom of Page 1, Bible Record, Daniel, born in 1803 (etc).....

Sophia, b. 6 Jan 1807, d. 3 Sept 1893 at Henry County, Indiana and buried Jefferson Twp., Wayne County, Ind. The daughter of Jacob and Anna (Rudy) Brower. Married Jacob Deardorff, b. 23 Feb 1805 at Bedford County, Virginia, d. 9 July 1855 at Blue River Township, Ohio. Buried Jefferson Twp., Wayne County, Ind. They were married 29 June 1826 at Preble County, Ohio (Ulrich German Baptist Cem.)

Jacob and Sophia moved to Henry County, Indiana in 1829. He then "entered" government land on 25 December 1825 (Sect 25), Blue River Twp., Henry Co., Indiana and farmed all his life. They were loyal members of the Old German Baptists.

Anthony Jr was the son of Christena and Anthony Dierdorff, Sr.

2) VOL IV, Number 2, dated July 1979 - at the top of page 2. An early will for an Abraham Brower in Dearborn County, Indiana. In the middle of the paragraph, "John married to Rebecca Marshall, the daughter of Josiah Marshall. Marriage took place in Sept 1866". I would like to add:

Josiah Marshall married Harriet Price 8 Oct 1834. He was the son of Jacob and Rebecca (Murray) Marshall. The Marshall's came to Preble County, Ohio from Baltimore County, Maryland. Rebecca Murray was the daughter of Wheeler Murray, granddaughter of Jabez and Mary (Morgan) Murray and William and Martha (West) Wheeler. I can not go back any farther with the Marshall family.

3) VOL III, Number 4, dated Jan 1979 - page 8, second paragraph from the bottom.

One daughter of Jacob Brower was named Lydia, she married Abraham Overholser. She was born in 1813.

The above is only partially true. Her birth date was 30 June 1813 and she did marry Abraham Overholser, but she was <u>not</u> the daughter of Jacob Brower. Her parents were Daniel and Sarah (Flora) Brower."

HISTORY OF PREBLE COUNTY, OHIO Her People, Industires and Institutions

DANIEL M. BROWER - The people who constitute the bone and sinew of this country are not those who are unstable and unsettled, who fly from one occupation to another, who do not know how to vote until they are told, and who take no active or intelligent interest in the civic affairs of their communities. The backbone of this country is made up of the families who have established their homes, who are alive to the best interests of the community in which they live, who attend to their business in preference to the affairs of others, and who work on steadily from day to day, taking the sunshine with the storm, and who rear a splendid family in habits of honest living. Such people are always welcome in any community. They are the wealth producers, and Preble County is fortunate in being blessed with many of them, among whom is Daniel M. Brower, a farmer living on R.R. #4, out of Eaton, and who is the proprietor of "East View Farm".

Daniel M. Brower was born in Gasper Twp., Preble County, Ohio, on Aug 4, 1848, the son of John and Elizabeth (Sharkey) Brower, both of whom were born in Franklin Co., VA., who came with their respective parents to Preble County, where both grew to maturity, and where they were married. John Brower lived, until his death in 1901, on a farm adjoining that which is now owned by Daniel M. Brower. His widow is still living on the old farm. She was born in December 1827.

John Brower and wife were the parents of four children, all of whom are deceased with the exception of Daniel M. Brower. Delilah was the wife of John Brower, and died in 1906. William H. married Brookie Harshman, and died in 1912. Marcus married Ollie May, and died in 1912.

Daniel M. Brower spent his early life in Gasper Township on the farm adjoining that on which he is now living. He was educated in the district schools of his home neighborhood, and remained at home until he was married, in June of 1884, to Dora Hildebolt, who died in 1892, leaving two children, Vera and Orva. Vera was the wife of Walter Shaw, and lived in Preble County. (She died in July 1936, aged 51. Walter Shaw died Oct 9, 1960 at aged 76). (They were the parents of one son, Arthur, who was born November 15, 19_(?). He married Reba Charles, daughter of Mr and Mrs Nathan Charles of Fountain City, Ind, on Oct 7, 1936. She had a twin sister, Ruby, who married a Buriff. Arthur and Reba Shaw were the parents of one daughter, Sharon, born January 22, 1940. She was married to Robert C. Barnes on June 30, 1962).

Orva is the Wife of Glenn M. Spacht, and lives at Dayton, Ohio. (Glenn Spacht died July 7, 1957 in Albany, NY. They were the parents of two sons, Hugh B. of Buffalo, NY and Thomas R., in the Armed Forces at the time of his father's death. There was also one grandchild). In June 1894, Mr. Brower married, secondly, Emma (Sarah Emily) Clark, to which second union no children have been born. (Emma died in Sept 1926 at age 69).

Mr. Brower is a prosperous farmer and is the owner of 95 acres of splendid land, $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles southwest of Eaton. He is an adherent of the Democratic party and has been highly honored by the people of his township who, thirteen years ago, elected him to the office of Township trustee, to which office he has been re-elected in each succeeding election, which fact alone attests to his wise administration of the duties of this office. He is also a school director of his Township. Mr. Brower is, in every respect, an honorable citizen and highly esteemed in the community where he lives.

(His father, John was born in 1820 and died in 1901 and his mother, Elizabeth (Sharkey) Brower died in 1917. She was born in 1826).

(Daniel's brother, Marcus L. Brower, was born in 1854 and died in 1912. His wife, Ollie (May) was born in 1868 and died in 1915. Daniel Brower died in 1931)
