This book traces the beginnings of the Baird family from John Baird of Liberton, Scotland (married 30 Jan. 1691 to Marion Gibson) to what was known to the author in 1936. Some of the family stayed in Scotland and established a brewery, some went to Russia to work for the Tsar while others went to Ireland, Canada and the USA. Willing to do limited look-ups. The rear (detailed) index has many names, and lists; Anna Jane BAIRD, Matthew BAIRD; J. BEARD, Lillie Ann BEARD, Margaret BEARD, Rebecca (Benchoff) BEARD; and BARDS too numerous to mention. MOORHEAD (MOREHEAD) GENEALOGY A 16 page booklet compiled in 1875 and reprinted by The Bard Family. This genealogy line is connected with the Bard (Beard) family and collected by Moorhead / Henderson / Bard ancestors (initially) from tombstone inscriptions in the "Old Graveyard Cemetery" in West Newcastle, Lawrence County, Pennsylvania. The earliest Moorheads mentioned are William MOORHEAD (d. 27MAY1819) who married Elizabeth BARNETT (d. 20MAR1832). The spelling was changed to Morehead in more modern times. The primary decendancy surname sequence up to the Bard reference is as follows: William MOORHEAD m. Elizabeth BARNETT, James MOORHEAD m. Catharine HENDERSON, Hugh Henderson MOREHEAD m. Rachel FALLS, Ellie Bushnell MOREHEAD m. Richard BARD. Thomas Henderson BARD m. Susan Phillips DYSART. Thomas Dysart BARD m. Henrietta Ruth RAYMOND. Subject: Look-up List Instructions
(Genealogy Look-Up Titles)

If you wish to participate in this look-up program, please send a plain text list of the look-up books and CDs you have in your possession, to me and to each of the BARD, BAIRD and BEARD mail lists. Each list administrator should keep a master list of the look-up titles. I'll also keep a master list, re-post periodic updates, and eventually, if we get enough participation, post the master list to the Web.

The list you submit will represent the titles that you will be willing to use to look-up queries received from other list subscribers. If possible, please list your look-up books in alphabetical order. We suggest that you submit your list and look-up queries directly to the mail list and post the results there also (as opposed to private e-mails), because the purpose of look-up programs is to allow all list subscribers to share and mutually benefit from the look-up books and from the query results.

Don't be afraid to copy text and/or scan a page for a query, as this is allowable (for research purposes) under Sub-Section 107 (fair use) and Sub-Section 108 (reproduction at libraries) of the copyright statutes. You can use the Print Screen (entire screen) or Alt-Print Screen (active window) keyboard keys to copy out images of search results, and then paste them into a word processor or e-mail program to send in reply to query requests. But as you all know, RootsWeb mail lists presently cannot accept images or HTML formatted pages, so there may be times when you are forced to send the query results via private e-mail. If you wish, cc me these e-mail results at cbard@adelphia.net, and I will try to post that info (which could not be publicly posted on the Mail List) on the Web for all to see, and post a link to them on the mail list.

Please don't feel that you have to submit ALL your books or genealogy cds for this initial roll call. A short first list will be just fine, and will help ensure smooth transition and fuller participation in this new program. You can submit other titles at any time in the future.

There is no rigid format for these list submissions. Provide Title, Author, Date, Condition, No. of Pages, Publisher, (Price if it is also For Sale) and any other important characteristics of the book or cd. You may wish to state if the book is a how-to guide, historical work, or general reference work, or if it actually has some genealogy data in it. It would be wise for our BAIRD, BARD, & BEARD mail list subscribers to state clearly if there are BAIRD, BARD, or BEARD names listed in the table of contents or in the index.

Books and cd-roms can be listed as Look-Ups and as being available For Sale. Contact the person privately if a purchase is desired. If you don't own a look-up book anymore, or if another list subscriber purchases one of your look-up titles, please let us know, and we will update the look-up list to reflect the change or the new owner.

A look-up QUERY sent to a Mail List for book look-up should look something like this:

Subject: Look-up: Archibald BEARD (BARD) - Biographical Annals (Curtis Bard)

Message Body:

TITLE: Biographical Annals of Franklin County Pennsylvania by G. O. Seilhamer, 1905.
QUERY: Archibald BEARD (BARD); b. circa early 1700's, Place: Ireland?, m. POTTER?
Immigrated to Maryland about 1740, then to York (now Adams) County, PA, then to Franklin County, PA. Children were: Richard BARD, William BARD, and David BARD. ANY old-world (Pre-1740), Ireland, or passenger ship data wanted.

Note that all the important elements are mentioned: 1. That it is a Look-Up. 2. The Query ancestor's Name. 3. The Book Title (or partial title). 4. The Look-up Book Owner's Name., and 5. More specific information concerning the Look-Up title and Query in the message body.

* Important: It is up to each subscriber to keep an accurate and up-to-date list of who and which titles and what query was made! (to keep repetition down to a minimum.)

* It is customary to include your own look-up list with any query, so that the other person can request a reciprocal query.

* Only list subscribers are eligible to participate in this program.

* Please compile and submit your own list of titles BEFORE OR WHEN you submit queries. And please try to make your queries as simple as possible. Preferably limiting them to one person or one marriage with relevant dates included.
