Family section of Cabell County History indicates that Thomas Cartmill and Samuel Hatton both came to Big Sandy in 1790's. Says Tom's son John and "his" (John's?) son James were in Civil War. There's a James listed as AWOL in WV Archives, but claims it's probably son of John (not James Madison Cartmill). The whole clan moved to Clinton Co. MO (including John). John was the only Cartmill surname in 1870 Wayne Co. census; didn't check for Fields, Chapman, etc.

Ratliff's book on Compton says that Thomas was son of John Cartmill and Susannah Ward; also mistakenly lists Margaret as having married James Madison, but doesn't list her having a brother by that name.

"The Van Bibber family came from Pennsylvania to Greenup County in the very early days, and they seem to have been closely associated with the Boone family. Captain John Van Bibber's wife, Chloe Staniford, was born in Cecil County, Maryland, in 1760. They were the parents of James, Jacob, and a daughter Rhoda, who was killed by the Indians. James married Lois Reynolds... Chloe Van Bibber, who may have been another daughter of Captain John Van Bibber, had married Jesse Boone before coming to Greenup County and they were the parents of two children, Harriet and Alphonso. A third child, Minerva, probably born in Greenup County, married Wynekoop Warner in 1817.

"Peter Van Bibber (parents not known) lived in the 'French Grant,' Scioto County, Ohio. He married Nancy Devore in Greenup County, in 1815. James Gilruth states in his letters that Peter had four sons, Jesse, Jacob,

John and Tyce. Also that a niece, Olive Van Bibber, who lived with them married Nathan Boone, a son of Colonel Daniel Boone. This couple went to Missouri with the Daniel Boone Family in 1820. ... "

The following is taken from notes from Trans-Allegheny Pioneers and Van Bibber Family by Mrs. Miriam W. Donnolly:

"Peter Van Bibber, with his young son, Jesse, and his two brothers, John and Isaac, a Baptist minister fought in the battle of Point Pleasant, October 10, 1774. They came with the army from Greenbrier and afterwards settled in the Kanawha Valley, where they became the ancestors of a large and prominent family. Peter distinguished himself for bravery in this battle so that he was promoted on the battlefield. His implements of warfare with which he fought so bravely are preserved in a case in historical rooms at Charleston, West Virginia.

"Peter's son, Jacob, was captured by the Indians near Point Pleasant in 1789 and made prisoner. He made his escape however, and got home about two years later. He was afterwards with General Wayne in his memorable campaign of 1794. He and his wife died in Missouri....

"Children: Jesse (1759), Peter, Matthias (Tice) (1772), who married Margaret Gardner, Jacob (1775), who married (1795) Sarah Miller (1776-1843), Olive, and James, who married Jane Irvine. There may have been other children, Joseph, Nancy, Sophronia and Ellen.'" "

Spraker goes on to quote a statement she says that Olive made during her lifetime. "A newspaper clipping, unnamed and undated, was sent to us, containing an account of this interesting record. Efforts have been made to locate the branch of the family in which this quaint and interesting document is preserved, but without success. It is said to be a statement made by Mrs. Nathan Boone, recorded in the handwriting of Mrs. John C. Boone (her daughter-in-law) and preserved in the family of L. N. Boone of Webster Grove, Missouri. After saying that she was born the 13th of January, 1783; and grew up at the mouth of the Big Kanawha River, Mrs. Nathan Boone continues:

'After the death of my father, Peter Van Bibber, my mother and I lived with my brother in Ohio, on the Ohio, opposite the mouth of the Big Sandy River. I was married on the 26th of Sept. 1799. On the first

of October, without any company but my husband, I started to Missouri, or Upper Louisiana. We had two ponies and our packhorse. After being on our journey some time we were overtaken by a man and woman who travelled with us to Vincennes. We remained there nearly three weeks, in consequence of getting one of our ponies crippled. We travelled along the remainder of the way, arriving in St. Louis the last of October. My husband was offered eighty acres of land (in the center of what was afterwards the city) for one of our ponies. He laughed and said he would not give one of the ponies for the whole town. We went to St. Charles County, and located about twenty miles above St. Charles. We crossed the Missouri river at St. Charles by placing our goods in a skiff. My husband rowed and I steered and held the horse by the bridle. It was rather a perilous trip for so young a couple. I was just sixteen, my husband eighteen."

Notes for Nathan Boone:

Per Hazel Atterbury Spraker: The Boone Family; Genealogical Pub. 1974, page 126-7 ref. Nathan and Olive (whom she says was born "on the banks of Greenbriar River, Ky...." and "some say she was the sister of the wife of Jesse Boone."):

Nathan Boone spent his early childhood in the primitive settlements of Kentucky, and married at the age of eighteen. In September, 1799, he assisted his father in removing the family to Missouri. Draper Manuscript 6 S 18-254 gives an account of this journey as follows:

'Daniel M. Boone and Nathan Boone started with their mother in the boat (called a pirogue) while Col. Boone started with the stock by land, assisted by a young man named George Buchanan and D. M. Boone's negro Sam. At Limestone (now Maysville) Nathan Boone got his marriage license and returned (75 miles) to Little Sandy, where Mr. Peter Van Bibber then lived, and Sept. 26th was married to Miss Olive Van Bibber; then started out and went all the way by land via Lexington, Louisville, Vincennes, and St. Louis.'

"The young couple located in St. Charles Co., Mo. In local history we find the following: 'From 1800 to 1812 he (Nathan Boone) was employed surveying Government land in what are now St. Charles, Montgomery and Warren Counties. In 1870 he with his brother Daniel surveyed a road from St. Charles to Blue Lick in Howard County, a road that is still in use. In 1820 he finished a large stone two-story house in St. Charles County, Mo. In this house his father Daniel Boone died, September 20, 1820....Nathan Boone was a member of the Constitutional Convention of 1820, and was in the U. S. Army from 1832 to 1853.'"

(She goes on to recount his military record in some detail, then moves on to Olive; see her notes. etc)

The implication here is that Olive is James' daughter, not his sister, but I think that was not intended. etc.

Martin and his wife Esther sold a 10 acre section of land (patented to him in 1716) to John McCulloch on November 23, 1738, Shortly after selling the land, Martin probably moved to Orange County, Virginia where he purchased 650 acres from Thomas Branson Sr. (part of Branson's 850 acre, November 12, 1735 patent land) on January 13, 1741/42. Per: History of Cecil County (MD):

"Prominent among the early settlers of Bohemia Manor were two brothers, Isaac and Matthias Van Bibber. Their father, Jacob Isaacs Van Bibber was a Hollander, and was one of the first settlers of Germantown. His sons, the two brothers before mentioned, were natives of Holland, and were naturalized in Maryland in 1702. Previous to coming to Maryland they had been engaged in merchandizing at Philadelphia. In 1702 Mathias Van Bibber bought part of John Moll, Jr.'s land, which the reader will recollect was the easternmost of the four necks which comprised the Labadic Tract. Two years afterwards he bought another portion of the same tract, and in 1708 his brother Isaac bought 130 acres of it, which he and his wife Fronica sold to Matthias in 1711 for 150 pounds, which, it is stated in the deed, had been expended in the erection of a mill then occupied by the said Isaac. This mill was located upon a branch of the Bohemia called Mill Creek, on the site of what was formerly known as Sluyter's mill, every vestige of which has long since disappeared, even the land once covered by the dam now being cultivated. This is the first mill mentioned in the history of that part of the county. It was built a short time before the date of the deed.

"Matthias Van Bibber appears to have been fond of the acquisition of the land, for in 1714 he purchased St. Augustine Manor of Ephraim Augustine Hermen for 300 pounds. This manor was directly east of Bohemia Manor and was separated from it by an old cart-road, which was known then and for many years afterwards as the "Old Choptank Road." It was originally an Indian path that led from the Choptank River along the dividing ridge between the two bays, probably far up into Pennsylvania, but was laid out and cleared from the head of St. George's Creek to the Chester River, twelve feet wide, for a cart road, in 1682, by Casparus Hermen and Hugh Gregory, who were appointed for the purpose of the court. The road had been used so little that it was then overgrown with young timber and its location was doubtful, consequently the boundaries of the Manor were unknown. Van Bibber claimed that the road from the head of Elk to the head of Bohemia, which ran near the head of Back Creek, was the boundary between the two Manors. Whereupon Hermen obtained a commission from the court to ascertain the eastern boundary of Bohemia Manor, and in this way to settle the dispute. The commissioners, who were John Dowdall, Captain Benjamin Pearce, Francis Mauldin and William Dare, met in September, 1721, and after taking the testimony of several witnesses, fixed the location of the Choptank Road,

and thus ended the dispute. The alienation fee claimed by the Proprietary of Maryland was paid when the sale of St. Augustine Manor was consummated, showing that it was then claimed as part of Maryland. Matthias Van Biber also became the proprietor of Van Biber's Forest, which was patented to him in 1720. This was a large tract of land in the Third district, near Mechanics' Valley, containing 850 acres. In addition to this he owned another tract, which is described in his will as his plantation at the head of Elk. It was located a short distance southeast of the mansion of Hon. J. A. J. Creswell. Matthias Van Biber was for a long time chief justice of the county and occupied that responsible position when the court-house was built at Court House Point.

"Isaac Van Biber's will was proved in 1723. He left three sons, Jacob, Peter and Isaac, and three daughters, Hester, Christiana and Veronica. Matthias Van Biber's will was proved in 1739. He left four sons, Jacob, Adam, Matthias and Henry, and four daughters, Sarah, Rebecca, Christiana and Hester. He bequeathed his land at Head of Elk to his son Jacob; his dwelling plantation, which was part of the Labadie Tract, to his son Adam; Clifton, in Middle Neck, he devised to his sons Matthias and Henry, and his part of St. Augustine Manor to his daughters, Sarah and Rebecca.

"Henry Van Biber, brother of Isaac and Matthias, came to Cecil County about 1720. His will, which was written in Utrecht, is to be found among the records of the Orphan's Court, and being a literal translation from the original Dutch is probably the most curious document in the archives of the county.

"These members of the Van Biber family ... continued to hold some of the land there as late as 1840, when Henry Van Biber of Virginia sold it to Robert Cochran, father of J. P. Cochran, late governor of Delaware, who yet owns it...."

Ancestral Records and Portraits, Vol. 1 (familytreemaker): "Thomas Cornell arrived in Boston, with wife and

family in 1638. In 1641 he removed to Portsmouth, R.I., and from there, in 1643, to Throgg's Neck, N.Y., where, after a brief period, as Governor Winthrop records:

"The Indians set upon the English that dwelt under the Dutch and killed such of Mr. Throckmorton's and Mr. Cornhill's families as were at home. These people have cast off ordinances and churches and for larger accomodations had subjected themselves to the Dutch and dwelt scattering near a mile apart.'

"Among those who escaped was Thomas Cornell, who, with the remainder of his household, went back to Portsmouth, where, in 1646, he was granted about two hundred acres of land. The same year he received a grant of land in Westchester County, N. Y., known to this day as 'Cornell's Neck.' he died in 1673, having been closely associated with Roger Williams in his colonization of Rhode Island, and having held many positions of trust, among others that of Commissioner, 1643. The place at Portsmouth is still owned by the family. The old house was burnt in 1889. From the windows of the modern house, built in colonial style, can be seen the old burying-ground of the family, where Thomas Cornell, the first of his name in this country, was interred...."

He remained in that city until 1704, when he and his elder brother, Isaac Jacob, accompanied by Reynier Hermanns Van Burklow, a son-in-law of Peter Schumacher, and possibly others, removed to Bohemia Manor, Cecil County, Maryland. There he was a justice of the peace, and is described in the deeds as a merchant and a gentleman. Their descendants, like many others, soon fell away from the simple habits and strict creed of their fathers; the Van Beebers of Maryland have been distinguished in all the wars and at the bar; and at the Falls of the Kanawha, Van Bebbber's rock, a crag jutting out at a great height over the river, still preserves the memory and recalls the exploits of one of the most daring Indian fighters in Western Virginia.
