

Descendants of John Ladd

Generation No. 1

1. John¹ Ladd was born Abt. 1630 in England, and died Abt. Aug 1680 in Henrico Co., VA. He married **(1) Bathsheba Lovett**, daughter of Lancaster Lovett and Ann Unknown. He married **(2) Mary Unknown** Abt. 1676. She was born Abt. 1650 in England.

Notes for John Ladd:

A John Ladd arrived Virginia 7 October 1653 by William Diltye of Charles City, County.

15 October 1666, John Ladd and another were appointed to settle a difference concerning building of a church after a jury failed to agree.

24 September 1667, John Ladd granted a tract of land in Henrico County, VA, on the north side of Four Mile Creek.

1672, sold 700 acres of land on west side of Lynnhaven River, which sale was confirmed by Bathsheba ladd, his wife.

25 May 1673, Granted 700 acres of land in Lynnhaven Parish, Lower Norfolk County (now Princess Anne)

16 April 1674 John Ladd sold this tract of land, but no wife joined to confirm the sale

Will, dated 10th of 6th month 1679 designates wife mary as executrix:

1. Give to son Amos Ladd, 124 acres of said parcel and 25 of same to give to daughter Elizabeth, with benefit of all the timber to build upon said land.
2. To Elizabeth Ladd a parcel of hogs on the other side of the creek, being 6 old ones and 2 shoats, and also "my horse ball, and one iron pott, three spoones and one dish," pot and dish chosen by her mother, delivered within one month of his decease. Also, "thirty pounds of feathers and one blanket."
3. To wife Mary Ladd, the plantation of residence and after her decease to the "child she now goes with if a sonne, but if not, then to Sarah ladd and Mary" to be equally divided. Also to wife, "one feather bed with rugg and blankett and paire of sheetes and curtaines and vallins."
4. To son Amos one feather bed with rug and blanket and pair of sheets, the bed being ticking, as also, "my great chests and six pewter plates and six spoons and two gunns, one fowling piece and one Muskett, and all my carpenters tooles, except one adze, allsoe one large iron pott about 8 gallons, and one brasse skillett frame about two gallons, one pewter dish and saucer, and my mare and colt she now hath, with all her increase...one heifer called cherrye and one steere called hart about three years old."
5. To daughter Sarah Ladd one cow called Damsell, one brown yearling cow calf, a feather bed, not full, one blanket and one old rug and one iron pot and one pewter dish and pewter plate.
6. To daughter "Racell Ladd two yearling cow calves, one pewter dish and plate and three young sowes and one brasse skillett."
7. To daughter Elizabeth one cow called "Browninge."
8. To child "my wife now goes with one long gunn, two steeres, one two years old, and the other one." To son Amos Ladd one ox chain and hooks and staples for three yokes.
9. To daughter Eliz. one small couch, and to daughter Sarah one large chest and one sow.
10. To son Amos one young sow, the rest and residue of estate except on young hore running in Curles. To wife Mary, made executrix. Hand and seal 10th of 6th month 1679. Amos should stay with wife while 17 and then to have benefit of his own labor, daughters to 18 or married.

7. William² Ladd (John¹) was born Aug 1679 in Henrico Co., VA, and died 27 Nov 1751 in Charles City Co., ae 72, minister 25 years. He married **Huldah Binford** 07 Apr 1700, daughter of Anthony Binford. She was born Abt. 1679.

It would appear that William is the unborn child by father's will. Not known if born before or after his father's death. He was a minister of the Quaker faith and died the 27th of the ninth month 1751. The following was read at the Virginia Yearly meeting on 8 May 1761:

"A Testimonial from Friends in Virginia, concerning William Ladd."

"William Ladd, son of John and Mary Ladd, both from old-England, was born near Curles in Virginia, in the sixth month 1679, and about the time of his marriage he removed to Wainoak, became a member of that meeting, and resided there the remainder of his days. He had an acceptable gift in the ministry, and was a great sufferer for bearing a testimony against the hireling ministers. In one instance, a very exorbitant seizure was made upon his effects, yet he lived to see the officer who made it, reduced to such low circumstances, that he charitably contributed to supply his necessities. He continued a faithful sufferer to the end of his days, encouraging his children to faithfulness saying: 'The truth is more to me, than my all in this world.' The night of his decease, one of the family saying: 'This was to be a night of great sorrow to them,' he replied, 'It was a night of great joy to him,' which was one of the last of his expressions. He died 27th of the ninth month, 1751 and was buried in the family bury-ing-ground near his own house, aged 72, and a minister about 25 years."

19. John³ Ladd (William², John¹) was born Bef. 1704, and died Bef. 1763. He married **Mary Crew** 21 Nov 1724, daughter of John Crew and Sarah Gattley/Gately. She was born Abt. 1706, and died 27 Jun 1786.

Lived in Charles City County, VA and had 2 daughters and four sons. (One Ldd's Family)

21. Elizabeth³ Ladd (William², John¹) was born Bef. 1725, and died 13 Sep 1779. She married **(1) Matthew Ellyson**. She married **(2) Andrew Crew** 04 Nov 1752, son of Andrew Crew and Hannah Ellyson. He was born 25 Jun 1725 in Charles City, Va, and died 27 Jun 1786.
