"Ivery. Nicholas Ivery was in Northampton County, Virginia, in 1652 (Wise, Accawmacke, pp. 135-6) Nicholas Ivery was father of (1) Margaret, b. Hungar's Parish, Northampton County, Virginia, July 27 1654; m. in Somerset County, Maryland, January 6, 1668/9, William Turpin; (2) Mary, b. Machepongo in Accomack [Virginia], February 5, 1656/7; m. in Somerset County, Maryland, May 24, 1674, Richard Chambers (IKL). Margaret and Mary Ivery (daughters of Nicholas Ivery) came to the Manokin settlement (later Somerset County) in 1662 with Philip Barre. Wise, Accawmacke, pp. 135-6 gives the name as Juerye; but comparison of the name with original source shows it to be Iuerye, while finally the spelling of Ivery was apparently adopted."

She married **(2) William Furnis** 06 Feb 1662/63 in Northampton, Virginia, son of Unknown Furnis. He was born 1635 in England, and died Aft. Jun 1689 in Manokin, Somerset Cty, MD.

Name appears variously spelled: Furnis, Furness, Furnish, Furnace, Furniss, Furnes

Alexander Draper assigns and sets over to William Furnis all rights to 900 acres of land called "Amitte", Nov. 22, 1675 (Allied Families of Delaware) surveyed 13th day of Oct., 1673

Petitioned for 300 acres of land in Somerset Area March 12, 1663 (old-style year) - Furnis' Choice, 300 acres.

Entitled to 50 acres of land, for transport of persons:  
August 12, 1662 -- Phillip Bairee\* for himself, wife Olive\*, Geo. Lane,\* Margaret\*, and Mary\* Ivory and Elizabeth Bairie\*;  
Wm. Furnish\* for himself and wife Olive\*

In 1674 Henry Smith sold to Wm. Furniss 100 acres of 'Poole's Hope' (Deed Liber O 4) Therefore the original 300 acres of Pool's Hope' tract was by 1678 in the hands of Gideon Tillman and William Furniss.

A list of men being 'churchmen' (adherents to the Church of England) found in Manokin in the beginning, ie, by may, 1662: William Furniss, Randall Revell, John Elzey, nicholas Fountain (or Fontaine), Thomas Poole, George Mitchell.

Also found in a list of first settlers of Manokin: William Furnish (Furnis, Furnes) and his wife.

Notes for Stephen Costen II:

Stephen Costen's father, Stephen was brought to the colonies about 1640 by Nathaniel Littleton, Esquire. He was in service to him in 1642-43. Later he had a small plantation on the Eastern shore of Virginia, near Eastville.

Stephen owned "Merchant's Treasure", 150 acres, surveyed 9 June 1679 and "Bear Point," 500 acres surveyed 10 July 1679
