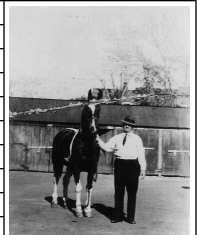

Mrs. Coleman had been an invalid for the past two and one-half years and bedfast for the last 10 weeks. She was born December 11, 1860, in Concord Township.

In addition to Mrs. Shaffer is another daughter, Mrs. Mary Miller, Columbus; three sons, J. P. Coleman, West Liberty; W. S. Coleman, Iowa, and Claude Coleman, Urbana; two brothers, S. W. Bruner, Dialton, and Claude Bruner, Flushing, Ohio; three sisters, Mrs. S.E. Lipse, Springfield, Mrs. L. K. Botkin, North Hampton, and Mrs. J. L. Abbott, Cleveland. Twenty-eight grandchildren and 34 great-grandchildren also survive.

The body will remain at the residence until time for service at 2 p.m. on Thursday in the Concorn Methodist Church. Interment is to be made in Concor Cemetery by Judd W. Wilkins funeral service of West Liberty.
