Memphis, Tenn., July 23, 1863

Mr. Editor----Thinking our friends would like to see a list of the remains of Company D, 27th O.V.I. I send you the same to be copied and beg room in the columns of your paper. We left Camp Chase, August 20, 1861, with 80 men and out of that number, including 10 recruits, we have 49 men left, Capt. J.W.M. Brock, a faithful, as well as a brave officer, who left his residence, which was in Stafford, Monroe County, and came out as a Lieutenant of the same, was promoted to Captain at the time of the siege of Corinth, as Mr. Wells, the first Captain, resigned after the battle of New Madrid. Captain Brock still commands his brave Monroe, Noble and Washington County boys.

Cline Reunion Highlights for 2006

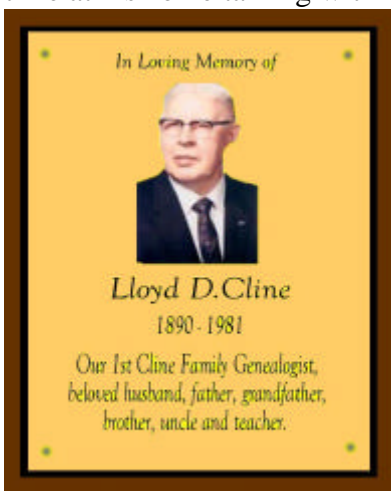
Friday-July 7th, 2006
