Whereas, there has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a CERTIFICATE of the Register of the Land Office at Springfield Missouri, whereby it appears that pursuant to the Act of Congress approved 20th May, 1862, "To secure Homesteads to actual settlers on the public domain," and the acts supplemental thereto, the claim of George ~~Butterbort~~ Butterborth has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law for the South East quarter of the North West quarter and the North East quarter of the South West quarter of Section fifteen, in Township thirty, of Range twenty one, in the district of lands subject to sale at Springfield Missouri containing Eighty Acres.

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the General Land Office by the SURVEYOR GENERAL.

Now know ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said George Butterborth the tract of Land above described: To Have and to Hold the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said George Butterborth and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In Testimony whereof, I, Ulysses S. Grant, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
