all the Rest of my property I Leave to be Equally devided between the Rest of my Children Except Garner Broooks I Leave him Nothing but his son William tomson Broocks I Leave him a Equal shear with the Rest of the last mentioned Children

Lastly I Constitute and appoint Richard Madden and Isaac Steat my Exexutors

of this my Last will and testament in witness of an each of these things.
