

# The CHAPMAN Line

The purpose of this report is to collect, organize and share my present knowledge about one line of descent in the family of my son-in-law. For this reason, collateral lines are not emphasized. I'm sharing this information in the hope of encouraging further research, yielding additions, corrections and more accurate genealogy. Please help me improve this.

1. **THOMAS CHAPMAN.** This family is listed in the 1850 census of Greenville Co., SC (page 469, entry 2206):

The next family is that of Enoch Chapman, age 57, with Elizabeth, 56, and children.

An 1870 census of Reidville twp, Spartanburg County, family 294, page 548, shows:

Huldy	18, f.
John	15, m.
Henry	12, m
[name missing in notes]	13, m.

All except Charlotte are shown as working in a cotton factory.

According to the death record of their daughter Cornelia, Charlotte's maiden name was Smith.
