BIOGRAPHIES OF JAMES McGAW COMPANY MEMBERS

James McGaw Wagon Train 1852
(Members listed as listed in the Camp Journal)
(Company Members are in Bold/Italics)

Gerrit P. Burnett -Captain of 1st Ten:

Gerrit Peterson Burnett was born July 17, 1811, in Lagrange, Dutchess, New York, the son of William Edmund (Edward) Burnett and Hannah Ellen Cole. He married ***Martha Briggs*** 1835 in New York. She was born January 16, 1815, at Fishkill, Dutchess, New York. She is the daughter of Jonathan Briggs and Abigail Van Tassel.⁸⁹ By July 1849 they were in St. Louis, St. Louis, Missouri where their second child Sophia Adaline Burnett died. A daughter ***Ellen*** was born to them June 16, 1850, at St. Louis, St. Louis, Missouri. Their fifth child Sarah Elizabeth died in 1850 in St. Louis, St. Louis, Missouri.⁹⁰ Daughter ***Harriet*** is not listed on the Ancestral File Family Group Sheet. They are in the Salt Lake City 16th Ward in the 1852 Bishop's Report. In 1880 he is a farmer in Castledale, Emery, Utah. He died in April 1884 in Salt Lake City, Utah.

Gerrit Peterson Burnett was called to be Captain of the 1st Ten in the James McGaw Company.

He is listed as ***G.P. Burnett*** age 40, with wife ***Martha*** age 36 and children ***Jane Ann*** age 11, ***Emma*** age 7, ***Ellen*** age 2, and ***Harriet*** 4 mo.

George W. Crocheron - Captain of the Guard

George Washington Crocheron was born January 10, 1825/6, in Habers, Richmond, New York. He is the son of Nicholas Crocheron and Ann Hart. He married ***Hannah Jackson Soper***. (Salt Lake Marriage Records show they were sealed April 1, 1856 in the Endowment House.) She is the daughter of ***Samuel Soper*** and Hannah (surname Bornlay or Jackson). Her father ***Samuel Soper*** is also in the McGaw Company and listed below. She was born 1829.⁹¹ ***Hannah*** was born January 7, 1828/9, in Hemstead, New York. She died August 29, 1872, in Salt Lake City.⁹² Between 1847 and 1850 they are living in St. Louis, Missouri. Here their children, George Washington (born October 8, 1847), George Edward, (born June 22, 1849) and James Joseph, (born December 21, 1850) were born and died. They are listed in the 1850 Census in St. Louis Missouri as ***George Crecherine*** age 23, a grape carrier born in New York; ***Hannah*** age 21 born in New York; and Hannah age 2.⁹³ The child Hannah is not listed on LDS IGI records. Hannah Crocheran is listed in the Council Point Branch in 1851 in Iowa. She was received from the St. Louis Branch.⁹⁴ ***George Washington Crocheron*** is listed in the Sons of the Utah Pioneers-Utah, Pioneer Companies as coming in the J. McGaw Pioneer Company. The 1880 Salt Lake City Federal Census lists ***George*** as a Clerk in Store with wife Agusta J. Crocheron age 35 born Massachusetts, with all children born in Utah.⁹⁵ ***George Washington Crocheron*** died July 17, 1910.⁹⁶ He is listed as ***George W. Crocheron*** age 26, with wife ***Hannah*** age 23. Listed with them is ***Elizabeth*** age 16 (she could be a daughter of ***Samuel Soper*** or ***Margaret Mitchell*** or sister of ***Hannah***) and ***P. Howard*** child. (P. Howard is unidentified).

Samuel Soper was born July 21, 1791, in Provincetown, Barnstable, Massachusetts. He is the son of Robert Soper and Isabel Smalley⁹⁷ or Rebecca Nickerson.⁹⁸ Both mothers are listed for Samuel Soper born July 21, 1791, in Provincetown, Barnstable, Massachusetts. Samuel's first wife could be Hannah

Bornlay or Hannah Jackson.⁹⁹ His daughter **Hannah Jackson Soper Crocheron** is in this company. **Richard Soper** is living in Spanish Fork, Utah County, Utah in 1860.¹⁰⁰ **Samuel Soper** is listed with **Margaret Mitchell**. Her parents have not been identified. She is probably his wife at this time. **Samuel Soper** is in Mud Springs Twp, Eldorado County, California in 1860. He is listed as age 66, a farmer, born in New York and wife Mary (Margaret), age 66, born in New Hampshire.

He is listed as **Samuel Soper** age 60, **Margaret Mitchell** age 57. Child **Richard Soper** age 18 is with them.¹⁰¹

Thomas Wrigley was born February 22, 1816, in Bamby-Up-on-Don, Doncaster, Yorkshire, England. He is the son of John Wrigley and Hannah Morgan.¹⁰² He married **Grace Mary Wilkinson** September 26, 1837, in Doncaster, Yorkshire, England. She was born September 24, 1819, in Doncaster, Yorkshire, England. She is the daughter of Anthony John Wilkinson and Elizabeth Judd.¹⁰³ In January 23, 1844, **Thomas Wrigley** (1816), his wife **Grace** (1819) & three small children, **John** (1838), **Joseph** (1840) and **Mary** (1842) left England on the ship “Fanny” with a group of 210 Saints.^{104, 105} They were under the direction of Elder William Kay. In 1845 they were in St. Louis, St. Louis, Missouri when their fourth child was born. A child named Precilla died in 1846 and a child Eliza Hannah died in 1851. President **Thomas Wrigley** of the St. Louis Branch is listed in 1850.¹⁰⁶ Elder **Thomas Wrigley** is listed in St. Louis in May 8, 1851.¹⁰⁷ **Thomas** held this position until April 9, 1852.

He is listed as **Thomas Wrigley** age 36, wife **Grace M.** age 33 with children **John** age 13, **Joseph** age 11, **Mary** age 9, and **Alonzo** infant. (Note: Also listed with this family is **Brigham** age 11.)

Fred Gale was born 1832, with **D. Clayton** born 1835. There is a Frederick Gale son of John Gale and Alice Fisher who came to America from England 1850 on the ship “James Pennell” with the Saints.¹⁰⁸ They were under the direction of Elders Christopher Layton and Wm. L. Cutler. His christening date is October 23, 1830, Graveley, Cambridgeshire, England, and he died August 19, 1859, in St. Louis, Missouri.¹⁰⁹ There is also an LDS IGI Individual Record for a Frederick Alonzo Gale born February 23, 1833, at Groton, Middlesex, Massachusetts, the son of Hiram Gale and Mary P.¹¹⁰ Frederick Gale is living in Salt Lake City 15th Ward in the 1852 Bishop’s Report. Frederick Gale is living in Weber County, Utah in the 1856 Utah Census. More research is needed to find who this **Fred Gale** is.

Dinah Ann Clayton was born January 11, 1835, at Paris of Farrin, Penwortham, Lancashire, England. She is the daughter of Thomas Clayton and Ann Critchely and the sister of William Clayton.¹¹¹ He was the scribe of Joseph Smith, wrote notes in his journal of his trip to Utah which is published, invented the roadometer to measure distances traveled on the wagon trail, and wrote the hymn “Come Come Ye Saints.”¹¹² William Clayton came to America in 1840 and was one of the first converts in England. **Dinah**’s brother David came to America on the ship “Hanover” March 12, 1842, and **Dinah**, her parents and the rest of the family came to America February 5, 1842, on the ship “Hope” with a group of 270 Saints under the direction of James Bumham.¹¹³ Her mother died July 15, 1848, in Nauvoo, Hancock, Illinois. Her father died June 16, 1849, in St. Louis, St. Louis, Missouri.¹¹⁴ **Frederick Gale** is listed in Salt Lake City in the 1852 Bishop’s Report. There is no record that **Dinah** and **Fred Gale** were married but they could have been. **Dinah Ann Clayton** married William Broomhead March 11, 1856, in Salt Lake City, Utah.¹¹⁵ The Salt Lake City Marriage Records list the marriage as May 30, 1868.¹¹⁶ This could

possibly be a sealing date. The Ancestral file submissions do not list a marriage to Fred Gale. In the 1880 Federal Census **Dinah Broomhead** is living in Paris, Bear Lake, Idaho.

She is head of household and listed with her children. She died June 7, 1913, in Paris, Bear Lake, Idaho. He is listed as **Fred Gale** age 20 and **D. Clayton** age 17.

Phillip Smith was born 1802. **J. (Jane) Blivens** was born in 1806. With them is **D. (Dorothy) Roberts** born 1816. **Philip Smith** came to America on the ship "Olympus" in March of 1851. He is listed as born in 1801 of Birmingham, (Warwickshire, England). Also listed on the "Olympus" roster is Thomas Smith with no information listed. This is the area in England that **William Nixon** of this Company is from. There are no Blivens or Roberts on the ship "Olympus." No Phillip Smith is listed in the 1850 Federal Census Pottawattamie, Iowa. The Sons of Utah Pioneers list Philip L. Smith came to Utah in the Isaac M. Stewart Company August 28, 1852, and four in the family. The *Deseret News* of September 18, 1852, lists Philip L. Smith and 3 persons and Thomas E. Smith and 3 persons.¹¹⁷ The 1852 Bishop's Report list a Phillip Smith living in Salt Lake City 2nd Ward; in area 22-5; and Phillip K. in area 4. In the 1856 Utah Census a Phillip Smith is living in Tooele City, Tooele County, Utah. Another Philip Smith died in Provo, Utah with no birth or death dates given.

He is listed as **Phillip Smith** age 50 and **J. Blivens** age 46. **D. Roberts** age 36, **E. Roberts** age 10, **W. Roberts** age 8, and **Mary Jane Roberts** age 4.

Dorothy Roberts or **J. Blivens** are not listed in the Mormon Immigration Index.

Dorothy Martin Roberts was born May 1, 1816, in Garstange, Lancaster, England. She is the daughter of Hugh Martin and Ellen Parkinson of Lancaster, England.¹¹⁸ She married John Roberts who was born about 1825 of Manchester, Lancashire, England.¹¹⁹ He is the son of Thomas Roberts and Ann (Unknown).¹²⁰ **Elizabeth Frost Roberts** (born September 11, 1841), **William Roberts** (born February 2, 1844) and **Mary Jane Roberts** (born August 4, 1847) in Manchester, Lancashire, England are the children of John Roberts and **Dorothy Martin**.¹²¹ **Mary Jane** married Edgar Leonidas Clark. She died February 10, 1902, in Parowan, Iron, Utah.¹²² John Roberts died 1849 in St. Louis, Missouri.¹²³ **Dorothy Roberts** is listed as living in Salt Lake City 8th Ward in the 1852 Bishop's Report.

Jane Trippets Bliven was born August 27, 1803, in Gorham, Cumberland, Maine. Her parents are Theophitus Tippetts and Sally.¹²⁴

George Thomas Woodhead was born July 3, 1831, in Great Grimsby, Lincolnshire, England. He is the son of William Woodhead and Charlotte Spencely. **George T. Woodhead** came to America from England with 245 Saints and 60 other passengers on the ship "Olympus," which sailed March 4, 1851. Elder William Howell presided over the Mormons. It was a perilous voyage. The storms were so bad that the Captain told the second mate to go tell the Captain of the Mormons that they should pray for the ship to be saved. Elder Howell told the second mate that they had embarked from Liver pool to New Orleans and they would arrive safely in that port. "Our God will protect us." The Saints prayed and the next day asked permission to hold religious services. During this crossing fifty persons were baptized. **George T. Woodhead** is listed as Fireman, age 19 and address James Street Goole.¹²⁵ Traveling in the

McGaw Pioneer Company with him is: **E. Franklin**, female, age 57 (1795) and **E. Winter**, female, age 27 (1825). **George** settled in the Salt Lake and Ogden Utah areas. He married Caroline Lane August 14, 1853, in Salt Lake City, Utah.¹²⁶ Salt Lake Marriage Records say they were sealed July 20, 1861.¹²⁷ His picture is in *Pioneers and Prominent Men of Utah*.¹²⁸ He is in the 1880 Federal Census in Salt Lake, Salt Lake Utah, as a Steam Engineer.¹²⁹

He is listed as **George Woodhead** age 23 with **E. Franklin** age 57 and **E. Winter** age 27.

There is no **E. Franklin** listed in the Mormon Immigration Index. There is an Elizabeth Franklin listed. She is born 1801 and came on the ship “Empire” in 1847. **Elizabeth Franklin** born May 5, 1795, in Bristol, Somerset, England, died September 20, 1865, in Salt Lake City, Utah.¹³⁰ This Elizabeth Franklin could be the Elizabeth Franklin (widow) who came in 1856 on the “Enoch Train” and listed born 1797 in England. Also listed is an Elizabeth Franklin who died in February 23, 1856, in Salt Lake City, Utah with no birth place listed.¹³¹

John Winter, born 1822 and **Eliza Winter**, born 1824, came to America on the ship “Ellen” in 1851. They were from Sheffield and John was a Cutler. With them was John Woodhead (age 23), a Miner from Sheffield. **Eliza Winter** was born April 12, 1823, Sheffield, Yorkshire, England. She was Baptized January 23, 1848, and emigrated January 1, 1851. She was traveling with her husband John Winter who was born July 1821.¹³² (John Winter, born January 1821, in Sheffield, Yorkshire, England, is the son of John Winter and Margaret Elizabeth Bridgehouse.¹³³) **Eliza** married Joshua Olmstead 1860 in Salt Lake City Utah.¹³⁴

William Nixon was born February 27, 1827, in Birmingham, Warwickshire, England.¹³⁵ He is the son of Joseph Nixon and Mary Higman¹³⁶ or Robert Nixon and Isabella Routledge¹³⁷. Robert Nixon age 62 (Head), Elizabeth Nixon age 32, **William Nixon** age 25, Nicholas Nixon age 22, came to America on the ship “Sidney” on September 17, 1842.¹³⁸ **William Nixon** is listed as a Grocer. His father and brother are Weavers.¹³⁹ His commercial career was first in St. Louis. “To this day the ‘Boys’ educated under him speak of **William Nixon** as the ‘Father of Utah Merchants.’”¹⁴⁰ In St. Louis he joined with the **Walker family. Nixon**, at that time, was a regular merchant doing business on Broadway, in St. Louis.¹⁴¹

There is a discrepancy, as the biography of Mary Ann Hall, his second wife, states he was born February 4, 1817, at Brampton, Cumberland, England, the son of Robert and Isabella Nixon.¹⁴² This date would correspond with the ship’s record. He was sealed to **Jane Hall** November 6, 1852, in Salt Lake City, Utah.¹⁴³

Jane Hall was born November 24, 1830, in Birmingham, Warwickshire, England, the daughter of John Hall and Mary Bates.¹⁴⁴ **Jane Hall** born 1831 came to America on the ship “Ashland” in 1849. Her mother, two brothers, and three sisters came on the ship “Charles Buck” in 1855. **William Nixon** and his wife **Jane Hall** along with children **Selina** and **William Nixon Jr.** were members of the McGaw

Company. Traveling with them was *Maria* age 12. *Maria Nixon* is listed as a daughter of William Nixon born about 1842 of Bergh Apton, Norfolk, England.¹⁴⁵ She could be his sister. When they arrived in Salt Lake *William Nixon* employed the *Walker Boys, David Candland* (of the McGaw Company), and others and began merchandising. His store became the forerunner for the “Z.C.M.I.” (Zion’s Co-Operative Mercantile Institution). He is listed in the 1860 Utah Federal Census living in Salt Lake City 14th Ward with wife Jane H. and children. He is living next to Charles H. Bassett. He also married Jane Hall’s sister Mary Ann Hall. He died in Salt Lake City, Aug. 18, 1862.¹⁴⁶

He is listed as *William Nixon* age 25, wife *Jane* age 21, children *Maria* age 12, *Selina* age 2 and *William Nixon Jr.* inf[ant].

John Pierre Scheib was born October 12, 1802, in Sobernheim, Coblentz, Prussia. He is the son of Johann Heinrich Scheib and Anna Maria Engisch. He married *Catharine Weinmann* May 17, 1835, in St. Botolph, Aldersgate, London, Middlesex, England. Catherine Weinmann was born July 17, 1809, in Bishopgate, Street Within, London, Middlesex, England.¹⁴⁷ Her parents are Johann Christoph Weinmann and Elizabeth Joyner or Joiner.¹⁴⁸ The family sailed to America from England on January 10, 1852, with a group of 333 Saints aboard the ship “Kennebec.”¹⁴⁹ Listed is *John P.*, head, age 49, a Piano Fork Maker; *Catherine*, age 42, wife; *Anna M. (Marie)* age 14, *Sabina* age 12, *Elizabeth* age 7, *Jacob* age 4, *Joseph* age 2, and Peter age 1, and 7 months. Son Peter (Pierre) died aboard ship.¹⁵⁰ They arrived in New Orleans and went to Iowa to migrate with the McGaw Company. Family Group Records have *John Pierre* married first to Sophia Magdalena Cameren in 1830.

The biography of daughter *Sabina* states the family was “quite well-to-do and *Sabina* was well educated.”¹⁵¹ Biography of *Catharina Weinmann Scheib* states she was well educated. *John Pierre Scheib* came to England from Vienna to work in a piano manufacturing plant. He was a wealthy man. He had a big home with servants, maids, a cook, a nurse, coachman, and a butler. The children went to private school. In Spring of 1841 *John* joined the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. *Catharina* joined a year later. In 1851 Elder Lorenzo Snow told *John* it was the will of the Lord for them to go to Zion. *John* and *Catharine* had three wagons and six horses to pull their wagons and Jim Hutchinson (*Hutchings*) drove the wagon in which the Scheib family rode.¹⁵² The family lived in Salt Lake City, Utah. He is listed as *John P. Scheib* age 49, *Catherine* age 42, children: *Anna* age 14, *Sabrina* age 13, *Elizabeth* age 7, *Jacob* age 4, *Joseph* age 2.

George Hutchings (Hutchins) was born May 6, 1826, in Watford, Hertfordshire, England. He is the son of John Hutchins and Edith Putman. He came to America on the ship “Olympus” on March 4, 1852, with 245 Saints under the direction of William Howell. Traveling with him was his brother Edward (1827). There is no record that he married *Charlotte Clive* who was born 1819. The only mention of *George Hutchings* is in March 18, 1886, when he was employed in a shoe factory in Zion’s Co-Operative Mercantile Institution. No proof if this the same *George Hutchings*. Possibly this *George*

Hutchings is the Jim Hutchinson listed as driver for **John P. Scheib**.¹⁵³ On October 1, 1856, **George Hutchins** was sealed to Susannah Richardson and Eliza Hall. **George Hutchins** died November 16, 1867, in Salt Lake Utah and is buried in the Salt Lake City Cemetery.¹⁵⁴

He is listed as **Geo.(George) Hutchings** age 26 with **C. (Charlotte) Clive** age 33

Charlotte Clive was born 1819 in England. She is the daughter of John Clive and Jane Barston. Her mother Jane (1799), **Charlotte** (1819), and brothers and sisters, Claude (1821), Caroline (1825), Charles (1829), Henry (1832), Jane (1834), and John (1837) came to America with 254 Saints on the ship "Berlin" which left Liverpool September 5, 1849. They were under the direction of James G. Brown. **Charlotte Clive** is the sister of **Claude Clive** listed below.

Claude Clive was born September 3, 1821, in London, Middlesex, England. He is the son of John Clive and Jane Barson.¹⁵⁵ He came to America on the ship "Berlin" with his mother and brothers and sisters. He married **Mary Ann Pullin** before 1852 and was sealed in Salt Lake November 11, 1852.¹⁵⁶

He is listed as **Claude Clive** age 31 wife **M.A. (Mary Ann) Pullin** age 24 with **M. (Mercy) Walker** age 47, **Samuel H.** age 17, **Joseph R.** age 15, **David F.** age 14 and **Henry (William Henry)** age 11. Note: not listed is; Mary Ann (age 11), Emmeatta (age 9) and Matthew Henry (age7).

Mary Ann Pullin was born March 13, 1828, in London, Middlesex, England and is the daughter of John Pullin and Elizabeth. There is no record of when they came to America. **Claude** and **Mary Ann** settled in Salt Lake City. Possibly **Claude** was driving the other wagon of **John P. Scheib** as they both are from London. **Claude** died in Salt Lake City on April 24, 1879. **Mary Ann** is listed in the 1880 Federal Census in Salt Lake City as Keeping House.

Traveling with them is: **M. (Mercy) Walker** age 47, and children **Sam (Samuel) H.** age 17, **Joseph R** age 15, **David F.** age 14, **Henry (Matthew Henry)** age 11. This family came to America with the Saints from England on the ship "Hartley," March 2, 1850, and landed in St. Louis.¹⁵⁷ Ship roster lists: Matthew, Head age 35, **Mercy or Mary** age 44, **Sharp (Samuel S.)** age 15, **Robinson (Joseph Robinson)** age 13, **Frederick (David F. Walker)** age 11, Mary Ann age 9, Emmaetta age 7, and **Matthew Henry** age 5 (ages as listed in Your Ship Roster) or Martha H. age 5 (as listed in Mormon Immigration Index). The ship roster lists Matthew as a farmer and all from Bradford, England. Names of children from *Our Pioneer Heritage* Vol 10- Banks of Early Years.¹⁵⁸ This is the **Walker Family** who were merchants in St. Louis with **William Nixon** of the McGaw Company. They were prosperous business men in Salt Lake City and formed a large bank and trust company in Salt Lake. In the 1880 Federal Census of Salt Lake City, Utah **Joseph R. and S. S. Walker** are listed as Merchants.¹⁵⁹

Mercy (Mary) Long Walker was christened December 8, 1805, in Guisely, Yorkshire, England.¹⁶⁰ Her father was John Long. She married Matthew Walker May 21, 1834, at Calverley, Yorkshire, England.¹⁶¹

Edward Milnes was born 1803. He is listed as *Ed Milnes* age 48, with wife *Betsy (Elizabeth)* age 48, and children *Martha* age 18, *Mary* age 17, *Abraham* age 15, and *Henry* age 14. Traveling with them was a female *B. Burnett* age 37.

He was moved to Captain Charles Henry Bassett's 5th Pioneer Company of 10. Then to Anson P. Winsor's Ten. (See information on *Edward Milnes* and *B. Burnett* in this company.)

Also with Captain Burnett's Ten was:

Brigham age 11 (Surname unknown. He is listed with the Wrigley children and the Samuel Soper family.)

Camp Journal lists 60 souls.

George W. Siddell-Captain of 2nd Ten:

George (Calvin) W. Siddell was born 1821.

1. Listed as Calvin W. Siddell.¹⁶²
2. Journal History list him as C.W. Siddale.¹⁶³
3. The Camp Journal Roster lists him as George W. Siddell and C. W. Siddall.
4. The Daily Camp Journal Aug 2, entry lists him Captain Sidwell.

“On August 2 Captain Sidwell left the company without notifying McGaw and hoisted his flag on his wagon and camped somewhere else.”¹⁶⁴ Four of his Ten went with him.

He is **Calvin Wesley Siddall** born in 1821. In 1850 he is a Carriage Maker, born in British America (Canada), listed as **C.W. Siddall** in the Federal Census in St. Louis Missouri, St. Louis.¹⁶⁵ His mother **Sarah A. Siddle**, in a different household, is also in this St. Louis Missouri 1850 Census. (**George W. Crocheron** of this company is living here.)

Calvin W. Siddell is living in the Salt Lake City 12th Ward in the 1852 Bishop’s Report. Siddell families are in Davis County, Farmington Ward, and Utah County, Provo City, Utah in 1856. No C. W. Siddall is listed. He applied for his citizenship in Sacramento, California, and was naturalized August 3, 1867.¹⁶⁶ He is listed as age 46, from New Brunswick.

In the 1870 Federal Census they are in Sacramento County, San Joaquin Twp., California. **Calvin** is 49 years old, a farmer, born in New Brunswick. Sarah is 69 years old and born in Nova Scotia.¹⁶⁷ He is listed as **Calvin Wesley Siddall** in The Foreign- Born Voters of California 1872 or “The Great Registry” as it was called. **Sarah Siddall** is not listed in this record.¹⁶⁸

In the 1880 Federal Census in Sacramento, Sacramento, California he is listed as **Calvin Siddall**, age 59. He is born in N.B. with his father born in N.B. and mother born in N.B. His occupation is a carpenter. He is living with his wife Sarah Siddall, age 79 and born in N.S. (Nova Scotia). Her father is listed as born in N.S and mother born in N.S.¹⁶⁹ (Note: not sure if census taker made mistake listing her as his wife as her age fits the Sarah with him in the McGaw Company.) Living in Sacramento, Sacramento, California at this time is **William Wallace** and **Levina, Addison and Franklin Waterhouse**.

Sarah H. is born in 1801. The 1850 Federal Census lists her as **Sarah A. Siddle**, age 49 and born in Nova Scotia.¹⁷⁰ Living with her in this census is **William Wallace** age 16. In 1870 she is age 69, born in Nova Scotia, with **Calvin** in Sacramento, San Joaquin, California. She is listed in the 1880 Federal Census in Sacramento, Sacramento, California as the wife of **Calvin**, age 79 and born in Nova Scotia. Her father and mother are both born in Nova Scotia.

Calvin W. Siddell was called to be the Captain of the 2nd Ten of the McGaw Company. He is listed as **George (Calvin) W. Siddell** age 31 with **Sarah H.** age 51.

W. J. Wallace was born May 8, 1835, in Halifax, Halifax, Nova Scotia. He is the son of Andrew Wallace and Mary Philipena Vickers.¹⁷¹ In the 1850 Federal Census in St. Louis, St. Louis, Missouri, he is a press man living with **Sarah A. Siddle**,¹⁷² age 16 and born in Prince Edward Island. **William Isaac Wallace**, age 30 from Prince Edward Island, was naturalized November 2, 1856, in Sacramento County, California.¹⁷³ In 1870 **William J. Wallace** is living in Sacramento, Sacramento County, California. He is a Carrier (newspaper), born on Prince Edward Island with his wife Eunice age 29, born on Prince Edward Island and children Mary, age 3, and Nellie, age 2, both born in California. In 1880 **William I. Wallace** age 45, is living in Sacramento, Sacramento, California, born on Prince Edward Island and a News Agent. His father is listed as born in Scotland and mother born in Nova Scotia. He is enumerated with his daughter Nellie age 23 and born in California. Living with them is Elvira, her mother is born in Massachusetts.¹⁷⁴

He is listed as **W.J. Wallace** age 17.

Samuel Trunkey Smith was born September 13, 1817, in Portsmouth, Sciota, Ohio, the son of Walter Foote Smith and **Mary Trunkey**. He married **Marie McFate** July 4, 1843, in Pennsylvania. She was born January 2, 1826, in Mahoney, Musser, Pennsylvania, the daughter of James McFate and Elizabeth Williams.

They were in Pennsylvania when their first child, **Mary Elizabeth**, was born in 1844.¹⁷⁵ By 1846 they are in Pottawattamie County, Iowa when the second child **Sarah Marial** is born.¹⁷⁶ The family is listed in the 1850 Federal Census in Pottawattamie County, Iowa and in the Pottawattamie Branch.¹⁷⁷ They are living with **Jonathan Partridge**.¹⁷⁸ A daughter Emma was born October 3, 1852, one month after they arrived in Utah.

He is listed as **Samuel T. Smith** age 34, wife **Maria** age 26, with children **Mary E.** age 8, **Sarah M.** age 6, **Julie Ann** age 4, **Samuel** age 2, and **Walter** age 1.

Walter Foote Smith was born July 28, 1823, in Portsmouth, Scioto, Ohio, the son of Walter Foote Smith and **Mary Trunkey**. He married **Josephine Whitaker** February 3, 1847, in Ohio.¹⁷⁹ Josephine was born March 18, 1834, in Potosi, Grant, Wisconsin. She is the daughter of Isaac Zanes Whitaker and Alvina Gillmore.¹⁸⁰ The Smith family is listed in the 1850 Federal Census in Pottawattamie County, Iowa and in the Pottawattamie Branch.¹⁸¹ Living with them is **William Somerville and family**.¹⁸²

Traveling with them is a female, ----**Whitaker** born 1817. This is **Alvina Gillmore Whitaker**. **Alvina Gillmore** was born Nov. 15, 1814, in Gerry, Chautauqua, New York. She is the daughter of James Gilmore and Sarah.¹⁸³ She is listed in the 1850 Pottawattamie county, Iowa Census as age 37 born in New York, with children **Marie**, age 14, and **Henniete** (Hennietta), age 11, both born in Wisconsin (Potosie, Grant, Wisconsin).^{184,185} **Alvina Gillmore Whitaker's** husband died in 1843.¹⁸⁶ **H. Whitaker** (Henniete) was born 1840¹⁸⁷ and is the daughter of Isaac Zane Whitaker and Alvina Gillmore. **Marie (Marianna Emily)** married **Jonathan William Partridge**.

He is listed as *Walter F. Smith* age 28, wife *Josephine* age 18, _____ *Whitaker* age 35, and *H. Whitacre* age 12.

Charles Trunkey Smith was born July 5, 1826, in Vernon, Trumbull, Ohio. He is the son of Walter Foote Smith and *Mary Trunkey*. *Mary Trunkey* was born February 12, 1788, (1791) in East Hartland, Hartford, Connecticut. She is the daughter of Charles Nicholas Trunkey and Mary Ganyard. *Charles Trunkey Smith* married *Rowena Elizabeth McFate* July 24, 1847, in Vernon, Trumbull, Ohio. She was born December 8, 1831, in Mahoning, Mercer, Pennsylvania, the daughter of James McFate and Elizabeth Williams. *Charles Smith* and family are listed in the 1850 Federal Census in Pottawattamie County, Iowa.¹⁸⁸ *Charles* and *Rowena* had two children, *Charles Marion* and *Hyrum Hyde*, born to them in Council Bluffs, Pottawattamie, Iowa. In 1880 *C.F. Smith* with wife *Roenna Smith* and *Hyrum* are living in Grouse Creek, Box Elder, Utah. *Charles* is listed as a laborer and *Hiram* and other sons are herding cattle.

He is listed as *Chas Smith* age 26, wife *Rowena* age 21, children *Chas. M.* age 3 and *Hyrum H.* age 1. With them is *Mary T.* age 61 (*Mary Trunkey Smith*, his mother).

William Charles Partridge was born July 8, 1829, in Hallurdidle, Madison, New York. He was the son of Hezekiah Partridge and Anna Pacht or Pate. He married *Mary Smith* April 8, 1849, in Pottawattamie County, Iowa. *Mary Smith* was born December 1828 in Vernon, Trumbull, Ohio, the daughter of Walter Foote Smith and *Mary Trunkey*. They are listed in the 1850 Pottawattamie County, Iowa Census. With them is *Mary Trunkey Smith* (widow), the mother of the three above entries and *Mary Smith*. Walter Foote Smith died July 16, 1849, in Keg Creek, Council Bluffs, Pottawattamie, Iowa. Listed is a daughter *Mary* age 10/12 months born in Iowa. The daughters of *Charles Partridge* and *Mary* are listed in the camp roster with the *Jonathan Partridge* family. The 1880 Federal Census locates *Charles* and *Mary* living in Goshen, Utah County, Utah, where *Charles* is a farmer¹⁸⁹.

He is listed as *Chas. Partridge* age 23 and wife *Mary* age 23.

Jonathan William Partridge was born December 8, 1827, in Hamilton, Madison, New York. He is the son of Hezekiah Partridge and Anna Pacht or Pate. He married *Marianna Emily Whitaker* April 25, 1852, in Kaneshville, Pottawattamie, Iowa. *Marianna Emily* was born June 28, 1837, in Potosi, Grant, Wisconsin,¹⁹⁰ the daughter of Isaac Zanes Whitaker and Alvira Gillmore.¹⁹¹ She is listed in the 1850 Pottawattamie Census living with her mother Alvira Whitaker and born in Ohio. Her sister *Josephine Whitacre* married to *Walter F. Smith* and *H. (Henniette) Whitaker* are traveling in the family of *Walter F. Smith*. *Jonathan William Partridge* is living with Ann Partridge age 55 (mother of *Jonathan* and *William Charles*) in the 1850 Pottawattamie County, Iowa Census.¹⁹² Living with them is the *Samuel T.*

(Trunkey) Smith family. In 1880 **Jonathan** and Mary Ann Yates Partridge (second wife) are living in Oak Creek, Millard, Utah where **Jonathan** is a blacksmith.¹⁹³

He is listed as **Jonathan Partridge**, age 25, wife **Mary** age 16, and children **Mary A.** age 2 and **Laura** age 1.

Mary A. and **Laura** are the children of **Charles Partridge** and **Mary**.

William Somerville was born April 4, 1817, in Lanark, Lanarkshire, Scotland. He is the son of Andrew Miller Somerville and Margaret Fowler. **William** came to America with 54 Saints on the ship "Alesto" from Liverpool, England.¹⁹⁴ They were under the direction of Thomas Smith and William Moss. He was 29 years old and a farmer. They arrived in New Orleans May 16, 1841. He married Eleanor Jane Davis February 4, 1844, in Nauvoo, Hancock, Illinois. She was born November 21, 1824, in Armstrong County, Pennsylvania. They had a child Andrew born 1844 in Nauvoo, Hancock, Illinois and children born in Utah. He married **Eliza Smith** February 3, 1847, in Keg Creek, Pottawattamie, Iowa. **Eliza Smith** was born February 18, 1816, of Vernon, Trumbull, Ohio, the daughter of Walter Foote Smith and **Mary Trunkey**.¹⁹⁵ In 1850 they are living with the **Walter F. (Foote) Smith** family.¹⁹⁶ **William** died April 25, 1878, in Mona, Juab, Utah. In 1880 **Eliza** is living in Mona, Juab Utah. She is listed as Keeping House and son William is a Farmer.¹⁹⁷ **William Somerville** had four wives.

He is listed as **Wm Somerville** age 35, wife **Eliza** age 36, and child **Eliza** age 1.

Jonathan Lewis Harvey was born January 15, 1786, in Clarksburg, Montgomery, Maryland. He is the son of Basil Harvey and Elizabeth Lewis.¹⁹⁸ He married **Sarah B. Harbert**¹⁹⁹ January 31, 1819, in Harrison County, West Virginia.²⁰⁰ She was born January 13, 1799, in Clarksburg, Garrison, Virginia²⁰¹ or Jones Run, Harrison, West Virginia,²⁰² the daughter of Samuel Harbert and Abigail Loofburrough (Loffbourrow). **Jonathan Lewis Harvey** was baptized a member of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on November 7, 1832. The family lived in Missouri during the persecutions and were driven from the area. They were in Nauvoo in January 1846 and were driven from there to Miller's Hollow, later named Kaneshville.²⁰³ The biography in the Daughters of Utah Pioneers states they came in Captain Cook's Wagon Train.

They are listed in *Heart Throbs of the West* Vol 11- They came in 50:
Harvey, Jonathan Lewis 64, Jan. 15, 1786, West Virginia; Harvey, Sarah Hatbert 51, Jan. 31, 1799, Virginia.

They were called to settle in Pleasant Grove, Utah.

He is listed as **Jonathan Harvey** age 64 wife **Sarah** age 55, child **Sarah Jane Taylor** age 8.

Sarah Jane Taylor is the daughter of **Cecelia Harvey Taylor**. **Cecelia** is the daughter of **Jonathan Lewis** and **Sarah B. Harvey**.

Alfred Harvey was born October 20, 1825, in Harrison County, West Virginia. He is the son of **Jonathan Lewis Harvey** and **Sarah B. Harbert**. Traveling with him was **Eliza Harbert**, age 57, born 1795. **Eliza Harbert** was born December 9, 1796,²⁰⁴ and a possible sister or sister-in-law of **Sarah Harbert**. **Elizabeth Harbert Harvey** was born July 21, 1827, in Bing Creek, Harrison, West Virginia, the daughter of **Jonathan** and **Sarah Harbert Harvey**. She married James Harvey Tidwell Aug 28, 1853, in Pleasant Grove, Utah County, Utah. Also with **Alfred Harvey** was his sister **Cecelia Harvey Taylor** and her children **James Taylor** and **Lorenzo Taylor**. **Cecelia Harvey** married Joseph Taylor March 18, 1842, in Adams County, Illinois. **James Taylor** was born May 10, 1840.²⁰⁵ He is listed as **Alfred Harvey** age 25, with **Eliza Harbert** age 57, and **Elizabeth Harbert Harvey** age 25. **Cecelia Harvey Taylor** age 34 (Widow) and children **James Taylor** age 12 and **Lorenzo Taylor** age 7.

James Miller Jones was born January 1817 in Frome, Somerset, England. He is the son of John Jones and Sarah Millar (Millard). In 1833 the family is in Essex, Ontario, Canada where his brother Hiram Jones is born. He married **Mary Ann Partridge** May 25, 1842, in Nauvoo, Hancock, Illinois. **Mary Ann** was born March 11, 1823, in Hamilton, Madison, New York. She is the daughter of Hezekiah Partridge and Anna Pacht or Pate and sister of **Charles William & Jonathan Partridge** of this McGaw Company. In 1850 they were living next to **Jonathan Partridge** in Pottawattamie County, Iowa.²⁰⁶ **James Jones** is a laborer, age 33, with wife, **Mary**, age 33, **Joseph** age 4, **James** age 3, **Timothy** age 2, all born in England, and **Franklin** age 1 born in Iowa. **James Miller Jones** and family are three families from **Levi Powell** in the 1850 Census. The family settled in Payson, Utah, Utah.

He is listed as **Jas Jones** age 34, wife **Mary A.** age 28, and children **James Edward** age 5, **George Franklin** age 3, and **Timothy** age 1. Note: Their child **Joseph Smith Jones** is with **James Jones** below.

James Jones was born November 17, 1823, in Unity, Sullivan, New Hampshire²⁰⁷ or Hillsboro, Hillsboro, New Hampshire.²⁰⁸ He is the son of Ebenezer Jones and Mary Turner Carr. **Caroline Jones** born 1826 with place and parents unknown. Child **Edward Joseph** was born in 1846. **Joseph Smith Jones**, born 1846, is the son of **James Miller** and **Mary Ann Jones** of the family above. This **James Jones** is a relative of **James Miller Jones**.²⁰⁹

He is listed as **James Jones** age 29 with **Caroline Jones** age 26 and children **Ed. Jos.** age 6 and **Joseph Smith** age 6.

Crandall Dunn- Captain of 3rd Ten

Report 3

Crandall Dunn was born August 11, 1817, in Phelps, Ontario, New York. He is the son of **James Dunn** and **Sarah or Sally Barker**. He married **Mary Ann Cahoon** December 25, 1838, in Livonia, Wayne, Michigan. Mary Ann was born 1822²¹¹ in New York.²¹² The IGI record lists her birth as October 4, 1820, in Phelps, Ontario, New York. Her parents are David Cahoon and Roxann Gillett.²¹³ **Crandall Dunn** was presiding over the branches of the church in western Michigan.²¹⁴ In 1847 **Crandall Dunn** was serving a mission from Nauvoo, Illinois, in Leicester, Leicestershire, England. January 6, 1851, the ship "Ellen" with 466 Saints under the direction of Elders James W. Cummings, **Crandall Dunn**, and William Moss left England and arrived in New Orleans March 14, 1851.²¹⁵ In Iowa he is in the Pottawattamie Branch.²¹⁶ *Sons of the Utah Pioneers Utah Pioneer Companies* individual entry lists **Crandall Dunn**, August 22, 1851, age 32, in the Captain D. Lewis Company-husband.

June 1, 1852, he is listed as the first Justice of the Peace in North Ogden, Weber County, Utah.²¹⁷ The July (Julia) Ann Maguire (McGuire) Dunn history states she was in the Uriah Curtis Company leaving in June of 1852. "The Curtis Company, under Captain Crandall Dunn, arrive in the Salt Lake Valley, October 1, 1852."²¹⁸ **Crandall Dunn** settled in Weber County.²¹⁹ The 1880 Federal Census locates **Crandall Dunn**, a farmer, living in Deweyville, Box Elder, Utah with wife Julia Ann Dunn. He died December 27, 1898, in Beaver Dam, Utah.²²⁰

He is listed as **Crandall Dunn** age 32 with wife **Mary A.** age 30. Listed in *Deseret News* as "with family."²²¹

James Dunn was born June 28, 1793, in Essex County, New Jersey. He was the son of Samuel Dunn and Phebe or Femetje Coykendall. He married **Sarah or Sally Barker** June 28, 1815, in Ontario County, New York.²²² Sally was born January 29, 1798, in Phelps, Ontario, New York, the daughter of John Barker and Betsey Leland. His sons **Crandall** and **John** are in the McGaw Wagon Train. President Brigham Young visited and established North Ogden's first permanent Ward Organization with **James Dunn** as Bishop on March 4, 1853.²²³

He is listed as **James Dunn** age 59 and wife **Sally** age 56. Listed in *Deseret News* as "with family."²²⁴

John Baker (Barker) Dunn was born April 2, 1832, in Ypsilanti, Washtenaw, Michigan²²⁵ or Plymouth, Wayne, Michigan²²⁶. (Washtenaw and Wayne counties border each other.) He is traveling with his sister **Sarah Elizabeth Dunn** who was born July 26, 1836, in Wayne County, Michigan. They are the children of **James Dunn** and **Sarah or Sally Barker**. **John** married Julia Ann McGuire in North Ogden, Weber County, Utah on February 11, 1855.²²⁷ **Sarah Elizabeth** married Jasper Thornton, March 1853 in Ogden, Weber, Utah.

He is listed as **John Dunn** age 19 with **Sarah** age 16.

Henry J. Conklin was born 1827. *Sons of the Utah Pioneers-Utah, Pioneer Companies* lists him as Henry G. Conklin age 25 in Captain D. Lewis Company and arriving August 22, 1851.²²⁸ Since he was a teamster he could have made the 1851 trip and the 1852 trip with the James McGaw Company. Possibly he could be Henry W. Conklin born June 24, 1827, in Damascus, Wayne, Pennsylvania who is the son of Benjamin Conklin and Mercy Comfort. This Henry W. Conklin married Alvalina Grover.²²⁹

Henry Conklan is listed in the Nauvoo Temple Record, his mother is Polly Miller Conklan and a relative of Henry Miller.²³⁰ This Miller Family is from Bedford, Westchester, New York. Henry Miller is in this company and probably related. He was a teamster for the **Dunn Family**.

He is listed as **Henry J. Conklin** age 25, Teamster.

Edward Vickers Millward was born June 20, 1830, in Hoyland, Yorkshire, England. He is the son of George Millward and Grace Vickers. He came to America on the ship “Ellen” with 466 Saints. The ship left Liverpool January 8, 1851, under the direction of Elders James W. Cummings, Crandall Dunn, and William Moss. He is the only Millward on this ship. His mother Grace, and brother and sister came to America in 1868 on the ship “Minnesota.” *Sons of the Utah Pioneers-Utah, Pioneer Companies* lists Edward Millward age 23 with Captain D. Lewis and arrival date as August 22, 1851.²³¹ He married Catherine Curtis Eastham February 16, 1867, in Grantsville, Tooele, Utah. They are living there in the 1880 Federal Census and **Edward** is a farmer. Edward was traveling with the **Dunn Family**.

He is listed as **Ed Millward** age 23.

Christian Krowse was born 1822. Possibly he could be Christian Crouse, christened June 2, 1821, St. Mary Reformed, Silver River, Maryland with parents Michael Crouse and Magladena.²³² **Christian** is a teamster with the **Dunn Family**.

He is listed as **Christian Krowse** age 30 and a Teamster.

Claude Rogers was born in July 23, 1820, in New Monkland, Lanarkshire, Scotland. He was the son of John Rodger and Jane Story.²³³ He married Manthida Clark on February 17, 1851, in St. Silas, Liverpool, Lancaster, England.²³⁴ She was born in 1828 and the daughter of John Clark. They traveled to America with 369 Saints on February 10, 1852, from Liverpool, England on the ship “Ellen Maria.” Elder Isaac C. Haight presided over the Saints. The ship roster lists **Claud Rodgers** age 31, **Matilda** age 24, and Kenedrin, infant age 5 weeks. The notes for the “Ellen Maria” state that the missionaries were Elders J. D. Ross, Glaud Rodger, Haden W. Church, J.W. Johnson, Henry Evans, and Lewis Robbins, all missionaries from England. All had acted as presidents of the conferences.²³⁵ On the ship roster Claude is a Minister and they are from Liverpool. Kenedrin is not listed on the Wagon Train roster. They are

also listed in the Captain David Lewis Company as arriving August 22, 1851, in Salt Lake. The 1870 Federal Census located **Glaud Rodgers** in Eureka, Humboldt County, California, with his family.²³⁶ He is listed as **Claude Rogers** age 32 and wife **Manthida** age 24.

Thomas Ross was born 1800. The only Thomas Ross in the LDS IGI is a Thomas Ross born 1800 in Pennsylvania and married Matilda Winters. Possibly he was the teamster for **Claude Rogers**.

He is listed as **Thomas Ross** age 52 Teamster.²³⁷

William Henry Foster was born June 28, 1832, in Norwich, Norfolk, England. He is the son of William Lyndow Foster and Amelia Chaplin. **William Henry Foster** came from England in 1852.²³⁸ The source is *An Enduring Legacy*, Vol. 2, page 426 with no ship listed, found in "Your Ship."²³⁹ A different William Foster, born 1830 came to America on the ship "Claiborne" in 1843 with Emma Foster born 1834.²⁴⁰ **William Henry** married Eunice Neslen December, 1855, in Salt Lake, Salt Lake, Utah. **William Henry Foster** was one of the early school teachers in Tooele, Utah.²⁴¹ He was the leading tenor singer in the Tabernacle Choir, a wood turner, and scroll sawyer.²⁴²

He is listed as **William Foster** age 20.

William Yeates was born April 22, 1813, in Newartill, Bothwell, Lanark, Scotland. He is the son of Andrew Yeates and Janet Russell.²⁴³ He married **Margaret Fife** July 21, 1848, in Kilbirnie, Ayrshire, Scotland.²⁴⁴ Their son Andrew Yeates died June 27, 1849, in Kilburnie, Ayrshire, Scotland.²⁴⁵ They left Liverpool, England with 357 Saints under the direction of Elder David Sudworth on September 4, 1850, on the ship "North Atlantic."²⁴⁶ They were listed on the ship roster as **William Yeates** age 37 Head, **Margaret Yeates** age 32, and William Yeates Jr. age 3 months. The family is listed from Ayrshire, Scotland, and **William** is a miner. They arrived in New Orleans November 1, 1850. William Yeates died August 17, 1851,²⁴⁷ after coming to America. The Ancestral File Family Group Sheet lists three children born before the marriage date. One child, Jane Fife age 7 (1843) is on the ship "North Atlantic" with them. Possibly **Margaret Fife** was married before her marriage to **William Yeates**. Elizabeth Margaret Yeates was born September 6, 1852, just after they arrive in Salt Lake with the McGaw Pioneer Company. **William Yates** died in Salt Lake City on April 29, 1879.²⁴⁸ They settled in Salt Lake City and **Margaret Fife Yates** is living there in the 1880 Federal Census with her son James Elmer Yates, a fireman on the railroad.

He is listed as **William Yates** age 37 and **Margaret** age 33. No children are listed. Listed in *Deseret News* as with family.²⁴⁹

David Stoddard was born 1832 in Scotland. There are three David Stoddards who could be this David Stoddard.

1- David Stoddard (Stoddart)- born March 2, 1832, in Imeresk, Midlothian, Scotland, the son of David Bowman Stoddard and Villotte (Violet H.) Hood.²⁵⁰ His family comes to America on the ship “Berlin” on September 5, 1849, with 254 Saints under the direction of James G. Brown. They are listed as from Dalkeith.

2- David Stodart- christened November 30, 1832, in Edinburgh Parish, Edinburgh, Midlothian, Scotland, the son of John Riddle Stodart and Jemima Henrietta Brown.

3- David Kerr Stoddard- born June 2, 1830, in Cowpits, Midlothian, Scotland, the son of John Miller Stoddard and Janet Kerr. This David Stoddard settled in Cache Valley Utah and married Mary Williamson March 23, 1855, in Cedar City, Iron, Utah.²⁵¹ There is a biography of this David Stoddard in *Our Pioneer Heritage* Vol. 13. He writes the biography, possibly there is a longer version. He is an iron miner.²⁵² In 1848 David Stoddard comes to America on the ship “Sailor Prince.”²⁵³ He is listed as age 18 and is with his parents John and Janet Stoddard and family.

David was a teamster for **William Yates** or **Charles Llewelling**. He is listed **David Stoddard** age 20-Teamster.

Charles Llewelling (Lewellin) was born 1816. **Rachel** was born 1825. The only Charles Flewelling that the Flewelling family has listed in Genforum.com is Charles William Flewelling born November 24, 1811, in New Brunswick with wife Rachel Tupper born April 18, 1821, in Canada. They were married April 28, 1852, (place Unknown) and moved to Santa Cruz, California by 1856. Possibly he is a son of Ezekiel and Charity (Craft) Flewelling as their first daughter is named Charity.²⁵⁴ The birth date for Rachel is near the birth of the Rachel of this company. He also fits the Charles Wetmore Flewelling born 1816 of Kingston, Kings, New Brunswick, the son of William Jewell Flewelling and Elizabeth Wetmore.²⁵⁵ The Family Group Sheet on this family list Charles died 1825,²⁵⁶ but the Flewelling family has no documentation.²⁵⁷ The family spelled their name Flewelling and Llewelling.

He is listed as **Charles Llewelling** age 36 and **Rachel** age 27. Listed in *Deseret News* as “with family.”²⁵⁸

Daniel Phillip Olmstead was born February 19, 1812, near Woodhouse, District of Niagara, Ontario, Canada. He is the son of Moses Olmstead and Catherine Rust or Rush. He married **Corintha Bunnell Harris** 1836 in Branch County, Michigan.²⁵⁹ (Not far from Washtenaw County and Wayne County where **James and Crandall Dunn** were living.) By 1850 they are in Nichabotry, Iowa where **Cyrus Almeron** was born. *Sons of the Utah Pioneers-Utah, Pioneer Companies* lists them in the James McGaw Company with **Philip Olmstead**, husband, born February 19, 1812, left Company, **Corintha**, wife, born September 10, 1819. **Charles D., Cyrus A., Loren M., Lorenzo,** and **Wm. Henry** are listed as sons.²⁶⁰ The children are listed in pen in the Journal History. They are listed as **Loren Marsh** (1841), **Lorenzo (Dow)** (1843),

Wm. (William) Henry (1848), **Charles Dewey** (1852), and **Cyrus Almeron** (1850). They settled in Lehi, Utah, Utah where Phillip Olmstead was buried in 1896.

He is listed as **Phillip Olmstead** age 40 and wife **Corintha** age 31. Children are: **Lorin (Marsh)**, age 12; **Lorenzo (Dow)**, age 10; **W.H. (William Henry)**, age 4; **Cyrus (Almeron)** age 2; **Charles (Dewey)**, age 5 mo. Listed in *Deseret News* as “with family.”²⁶¹

Samuel Barnett was born April 27, 1804, in Chittenden, Rutland, Vermont. He is the son of Job Barnett and Sarah Ryan.²⁶² Job Barnett was born 1767 in Merrimac, Hillsborough, New Hampshire.²⁶³ Samuel married **Lodemia Sly**, August 28, 1828, possibly in Scarborough, Ontario, Canada where she was born April 21, 1810. She is the daughter of Joshua F. Sly and Eliza Hill.²⁶⁴ They were in New York, New York, New York in 1834 when their son **Samuel** was born. They are listed in the *Sons of the Utah Pioneers-Utah, Pioneer Companies* as coming in the James McGaw Company and leaving the company, also as in the Captain D. Lewis Company arriving in August 22, 1851. **Samuel** and **Lodenna Barnett** are living in San Buena Ventura, Ventura, California in the 1880 Federal Census.

He is listed as **Samuel Barnett** age 48 and wife **Lodema** age 42. Listed in *Deseret News* as with family.²⁶⁵

William Barnett was born 1831.²⁶⁶ William was born January 27, 1832, in China, Genesee, New York.²⁶⁷ He is the son of **Samuel Barnett** and **Lodemia Sly**²⁶⁸ (see above). *Sons of the Utah Pioneers-Utah, Pioneer Companies* list him as coming in the James McGaw Company and leaving the company, also as in the Captain D. Lewis Company arriving in August 22, 1851.

He is listed as **William Barnett** age 21.

Samuel Barnett was born July 12, 1834, in New York, New York, New York. He is the son of **Samuel Barnett** and **Lodemia Sly** (see above). *Sons of the Utah Pioneers-Utah, Pioneer Companies* lists him as coming in the James McGaw Company and leaving the company, also as in the Captain D. Lewis Company arriving August 22, 1851. He died in 1910 in Phoenix, Maricopa, Arizona.

He is listed as **Samuel Barnett** age 18.

Henry Miller was born 1828. *Sons of the Utah Pioneers-Utah, Pioneer Companies* list him as coming in the Captain D. Lewis Company (age 24) and arriving August 22, 1851. There is a Henry Miller listed in the Ogden Cemetery Records. He was born in England and died March 13, 1924. His father is Timothy Miller and mother is Elizabeth Mason. Possibly related to **Henry J. Conklin** whose mother is probably a Miller. **Henry Miller** was the teamster for the **Barnett Family**.

He is listed as **Henry Miller** age 24 Teamster

William Milam born 1799 and **Elizabeth** born 1815

He is listed as **William Milam** age 53 and wife **Elizabeth** age 37

They were moved to the 5th Company of Ten under **Captain Charles Henry Bassett**.

(See information about this family in the 5th Company)

John Hart born 1807 and **Ann** born 1808 and **Alice** born 1834

He is listed as **John Hart** age 45, wife **Ann** age 44 and daughter **Alice** 18

They were moved to the 5th Company of Ten under Captain Charles Henry Bassett.

(See information about this family in the 5th Company)

William Bailey born 1804

He is listed as **William Bailey** age 48. There is a William Bailey listed in the Ogden Cemetery Records.

He died December 7, 1901, in Ogden Utah. No birth date is given.

He was moved to the 5th Company of Ten under **Captain Charles Henry Bassett**.

Alva or Alvah Benson was born December 13, 1799, in De Ruyter, Onondaga, New York. He is the son

of Benjamin Benson and Keziah Messenger. He married *Cynthia Vail* August 11, 1820, in Charlestown, Clark, Indiana. She was born February 28, 1801, in Tompkins, Cayuga, New York, the daughter of Gamaliel Vail and Lucy Manning. In 1821 they were in Rocheville, Jackson, Indiana when their son *David* is born. By 1822 they have moved to Roundtown, Hendrick, Indiana where their son William is born. In 1831 they are in Jefferson, Clinton, Indiana where their daughter Lucy is born. By 1833 they are in Independence, Jackson, Missouri where their son Moroni is born. Evidently they have joined the Church. In 1836 they are in Liberty, Clay, Missouri, when a son Ammon is born. In 1839 they are moving with the Saints to Far West, Caldwell, Missouri, where a daughter Polly is born. In 1841 they are in Clarkville, McLean, Illionis, when a daughter Cynthia is born.

The family is listed as coming west in the Uriah Curtis Company.²⁶⁹ Listed is *Alva, Cynthia* and children *David*, Lucy Benson Wilson, Moroni, Polly and Cynthia. The family settled in Hryum, Cache, Utah.

David Benson was born June 4, 1821, in Rocheville, Jackson, Indiana. He is the son of *Alva or Alvah Benson* and *Cynthia Vail*. He married *Eliza Elsa Ann Curtis* November 8, 1846, in Council Bluffs, Pottawattamie, Iowa. She was born May 14, 1826, the daughter of Uriah Curtis and Phoebe Martin. Uriah Curtis was the Captain of the 16th Pioneer Company in 1852. June 19, 1848, a daughter Jennette Phoebe was born in Big Pidgeon, Pottawattamie, Iowa. On September 6, 1849, their daughter Jane was born and died the same day. Their daughter Jennette died in May, 1849. Phebe Keziah was born November 8, 1850, in Kaneshville, Pottawattamie, Iowa. The family is listed as coming west in the Uriah Curtis Company.²⁷⁰ Only *David* is listed.

John Thomas Caine Captain of the 3rd Ten.

John Thomas Caine was born January 8, 1829, in Parish of Kirkpatrick, near Peel, Isle of Man. He is the son of Thomas Caine and Elinor Cubbon.²⁷¹ At age 6, his father emigrated to America and his mother died. He lived with his Grandfather Cubbon and his aunts. He heard of “Mormonism” in 1841 from Apostle John Taylor and William Mitchell and others. In March 17, 1846, at age 17, he set sail from Liverpool on the bark “Shanunga,” accompanied by a cousin two years younger than himself. He was baptized March 28, 1847, in the East River in New York City. In 1848 he went to join the Saints in St. Louis, Missouri. He administered to the Saints with cholera for three years, but was never attacked. There he met **Margaret Nightingale** from Preston, England. They were married October 22, 1850. Their first daughter **Agnes E. (Ellen)** was born in New York City on October 1, 1851. He became an American citizen there and worked for the “Frontier Guardian.” He was first counselor to President **Thomas Wrigley** (also of the McGaw Company). They traveled west in the Company commanded by **Captain James McGaw** with **John T. Caine** as Captain of Ten and arrived in Salt Lake City September 20, 1852.²⁷² He later became a school teacher, was in the Drama association and a clerk in the Tithing Office. On April 7, 1854, he was called to a mission to the Hawaiian Islands.²⁷³ When he returned he settled in Salt Lake and became Utah’s fourth delegate to Congress and a man prominent in public affairs and in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.²⁷⁴ The 1880 Federal Census locates the Caine family living in Salt Lake City, where **John T. Caine** is the City Recorder.

Margaret E. Nightingale was born December 8, 1833, in Preston, Lancashire, England. She is the daughter of Henry Nightingale and Agnes Leach, “her grand-mother Leach being the second woman baptized into the Church in Europe.”²⁷⁵ When Margaret was seven years old²⁷⁶ the family made the seven-week journey to America on the ship “Sheffield” with 235 Saints on February 1, 1841. Traveling with them was Henry Nightingale’s parents and his brothers and sisters. They settled in Nauvoo, but moved to St. Louis during the upheaval of the church. Her mother died of cholera and her father was killed in a hunting accident.²⁷⁷ Margaret became a competent hostess in Washington, D.C., often traveling back and forth from Utah to Washington during the eleven years her husband served as representative of the Territory of Utah from 1882 to 1893.²⁷⁸

Also listed in this Company is **Ellen Nightengale** age 16.²⁷⁹ **Ellen** was born December 2, 1835, in Preston, Lancaster, England, the daughter of Henry Nightengale and Agnes Leach of Preston and sister of **Margaret E. Nightingale**.²⁸⁰ **Ellen Nightengale** is in the Ambrosia LDS Branch in 1844-1846.²⁸¹

He is listed as **John T. Caine** age 23, wife **Margaret E. Nightingale** age 18, and daughter **Agnes Ellen** age 9, mo. He was the Captain of the 4th Company of Ten.²⁸² He is listed in the **David Candland** Report as Captain of the 3rd Ten.²⁸³

Robert Alexander- Clerk of the James McGaw Pioneer Company

Robert Alexander was born November 21, 1826, in Caledone, Tyrone County, Ireland.²⁸⁴ He is the son of John Alexander²⁸⁵ and Mary McFarland.²⁸⁶ He married **Mary Melvill** October 22, 1846, in Shankill,

Armagh, Ireland.²⁸⁷ She is the daughter of **Henry Melville** and **Elizabeth Gregg**, and was born August 13, 1822, in Lurgan, Armagh, Ireland.²⁸⁸ **Robert Alexander** (1826), **Mary** (1814) & **Elizabeth** (1847) sailed to America on the ship “Hartley” on March 5, 1849, to New Orleans.²⁸⁹ There were 220 Welsh, English, and Scottish Saints. With them were **Mary’s** parents **Henry Melvin and Elizabeth Melvin** of this Company. The roster lists **Robert** age 23 Head, **Mary** age 35, and **Elizabeth** age 2. The family is listed as from Hulme and **Robert** is a painter.

Robert Alexander, Mary Alexander, and Mary Alexander are listed in the St. Louis Missouri 3rd Ward 1850 Federal Census on page 348 with **Henry and Elizabeth Malvin (Mary’s** parents). They are all from Ireland. **Robert Alexander** is a house painter and **Henry Malvin’s** occupation is not readable. They came west in the James McGaw Pioneer Company with **Mary’s** parents **Henry Melvin and Elizabeth**. Between her marriage in 1846 and the Pioneer Roster, the surname has changed to Melvin. After living in Salt Lake City, **Robert Alexander** settled in St. Louis and was a painter there.²⁹⁰ During this time their daughter Elizabeth has died. His picture is in *Pioneers and Prominent Men of Utah 1852*. He died February 1887 in Salt Lake City. Possibly at the home of his daughter **Mary McIntyre** wife of Samuel Houston McIntyre.

He is listed **Robert Alexander** age 26, wife **Mary Melvin** age 35, and children **Mary** age 3 and **Anna** inf.

John Alexander -No age listed. The probable brother or father of **Robert Alexander**. **John Alexander** born 1828 (age 23) is listed in the St. Louis Missouri 3rd Ward 1850 Federal Census on page 401. He is listed as a saddler. He is not listed on the “Hartley” ship passenger list.

Henry Melvin (Melville) was born 1795 possibly in Shankill, Armagh, Ireland. No record has been found. His daughter was married with the surname Melvill in Shankill, Armagh, Ireland in 1846. He married **Elizabeth Gregg**.²⁹¹ She was born 1797, probably in Ireland. They sailed to America on the ship “Hartley” March 5, 1849, to New Orleans with their daughter **Mary** and her husband **Robert Alexander**.²⁹² They were listed as **Henry Melvin** (1792) and **Elizabeth Melvin** (1799). There were 220 Welsh, English and Scottish Saints. They traveled to Utah with their daughter **Mary Alexander** and son-in-law **Robert Alexander**.

He is listed as **Henry Melvin** age 57 and wife **Elizabeth** age 55.

John Kavana was born 1830. The Family History Historical Department lists him as John Kavana. He could be one of three Johns.

1-John Cavanagh christened April 27, 1830, St. Munchins, Limerick, Limerick, Ireland.

2- John Cavanagh born 1830 Merville, Donegal, Ireland

3- John Cavanagh born abt 1830 Myshall, Carlow, Ireland and married Mary Nolan. There is a John Kavenaugh listed in the 1852 State Census in Wapello County, Iowa, page 9.

He is listed as **John Kavana** age 22.

Ransom R. Potter- Captain of 2nd Division

Ransom Robert Potter was born March 4, 1807, in Waterbury, New Haven, Connecticut. He is the son of Lemuel Potter and Lois Roberts.²⁹³ He married **Rhoda Emmaline Farrell or Ferrell** September 1825 in Cheshire, New Haven Connecticut. **Rhoda** was born January 10, 1807, in Waterbury, New Haven, Connecticut. She is the daughter of Benjamin Farrell or Ferrell and Patience Terrill. Their daughter Rhoda was born 1827 in Plymouth, Litchfield, Connecticut. In 1833 and 1836 they were in Burton, Geauga, Ohio where their sons **Isaac Smith** and **Benjamin Franklin** were born. In the 1840 Federal Census they are in Quincy, Adams County, Illinois.²⁹⁴ The 1850 Federal Census locates them in Mercer County, Missouri.²⁹⁵ Thomas is not listed with them. Their daughter Rhoda married William Miller. They came in 1849 to Utah.²⁹⁶ Ransom and his family settled in Springville, Utah. In 1880 he is listed in the Federal Census in Albion, Cassia, Idaho as a farmer.²⁹⁷

He is listed as **Ransom R. Potter** age 45 and wife **Rhoda** age 46, with children **Isaac S.** age 19, **Benjamin F.** age 15, and **Thomas** age 9.

Joshua Lorenzo Ferris was born March 15, 1815, in Landaff, Grafton, New Hampshire. He is the son of Samuel E. Ferris and Nancy Smith. He married **Elizabeth B. Gardner** June 26, 1849, in Keokuk, Lee, Iowa. Her parents are probably Nelson Gardner and Sarah Ann Roach, but no Elizabeth is listed on the Family Group Sheet. She was born 1824 in Ohio²⁹⁹ and was 25 years old when she married 34-year-old **Joshua Ferris**. He possibly could have been married before as there are two earlier children, **Samuel** born in 1840 and **Mary** born in 1848. The 1850 Federal Census locates lists Joshua Ferris and family in Lee County, Iowa. The child **Samuel** born in Missouri and Mary (S.) born in Iowa. They are living next door to **Alonzo Pearce**. Joshua Ferris married Emma Phoebe Ann Beackstead abt 1845 in Hancock, Illinois, and Sarah Ann Nelson, March 4, 1847, in Des Moines County, Iowa. There is no marriage record for either of these marriages. Some Family Group Sheets have these marriages at later dates. A son William Wilson Ferris was born to **Joshua** and **Elizabeth** July 1850 in Keokuk, Lee, Iowa, where he died the same year. Son **Thomas Ferris** was born Sept 28, 1851, in Des Moines River, Iowa. **Elizabeth Gardner Ferris** died of cholera while they were coming west in the McGaw Company. In 1856 **Joshua Ferris** is living in West Jordan, Salt Lake, Utah.³⁰⁰ He married five times.³⁰¹ He died Sept 11, 1870, in Goshen, Utah, Utah.

He is listed as **Joshua L. Ferris** age 37, wife **Elizabeth** age 28, and children, **Samuel** age 12, **Mary** age 4, **Thomas** inf[ant].

Alonzo Pearce was born October 20, 1813, in Beekmantown, Clinton, New York. He is the son of Perry Horton Pearce and Betsey Owen. He married Esther Angel March 5, 1837. Esther Angel was born April 10, 1816, in Shirdington, Gloucestershire, England. The daughter of William Angel and Esther Collingbourne. Their first son **William Alonzo Pearce** was born November 1837 in Porter, Niagara, New

York. John Angel Pearce was born October 15, 1839, in Granger, Allegany, New York. Walter Amos Pearce was born May 18, 1841, in Niagara County, New York, and **Sylvester Henry Pearce** born March 13, 1843, in Grove, Allegany, New York. The family was in Burlington, Des Moines, Iowa December 13, 1846, when Perry Pearce was born. He died nine days later, and his mother Esther died seventeen days after he was born. Alonzo Pearce married **Mary Ann Gardner Hayden** March 22, 1848, in Des Moines County, Iowa.³⁰² Family records state they were married January 30, 1848. She was born 1822 in Ohio the daughter of Nelson Gardner and Sarah Ann Roach.³⁰³ She is the probable sister of **Elizabeth Gardner Ferris** (above). Possibly this is the Mary Ann Gardner born September 1822 Tuscarawas, Tuscarawas, Ohio. No parents are listed.³⁰⁴ **Mary Ann Gardner** married Nelson Hayden about 1841 of Johnson, Franklin, Missouri. One daughter is listed on Family Group Record. She is Ermina Elizabeth Haden or Hayden born March 23, 1842, in Johnson, Franklin, Missouri. The 1850 Federal Census of locates **Alonzo Pearce** in Lee County, Iowa, age 37, born in New York, **Mary A.** age 28, born in Ohio, **William A.** age 12, and **Sylvester** age 7, both born in New York, Adeline E. Heaydon, age 8, and Nelson P. Heaydon, age 6, both born in Missouri.

There is a picture of **Alonzo Pearce** in *Pioneers and Prominent Men of Utah*.

Traveling in the company with them is **Thomas Nelson** (Hayden) born 1844 and **Agnes Milsworth** born 1836.

Thomas Nelson Hayden is the son of **Mary Ann Gardner** and Nelson Hayden of Johnson, Franklin, Missouri.

Agnes Milsworth has not been identified. She could be Agnes Pearce listed in the 1856 Utah State Census in Salt Lake County 10th ward.

He is listed as **Alonzo Pearce** age 38 with wife **Mary A.** age 30, children **William Alonzo** age 14, **Sylvester** age 9, **Adeline H.** Inf., **Thomas Nelson** (Hayden) age 8, and **Agnes Milsworth** age 16.

Continuing with the 3rd Ten:

Wardman Holmes was born July 23, 1817, in Baildon, Yorkshire, England. He is the son of William Holmes and Ann Pickles.³⁰⁵ Ancestral File entry has birth July 28, 1807, in Addingham, Yorkshire, England.³⁰⁶

He married **Naomi Bland** in about 1842 in England. **Naomi** was born March 4, 1826, in Baildon, Yorkshire, England. She is the daughter of Francis Bland and Martha Thorns.³⁰⁷ They came to America with 402 Saints on the ship “Argo” under the direction of Elder Jeter Clinton.³⁰⁸ They departed January 10, 1850, and arrived in New Orleans in March 1850. The ships roster lists **Woodman** age 32, head, **Naomi** age 23, Frederick, **Mary** age 2, and **Miranda** age 1. (Note: Frederick is not listed in the Mormon Immigration Index, but is listed in the LDS Emigrant Roster & Voyage History “Your Ship.”) Wardman was a weaver and the family place of origin was Bradford. The family was in St Louis, Missouri, March 8, 1852, when their son **William Wardman Holmes** was born. **William Wardman** died one year after they arrived in Salt Lake. **Wardman Holmes** was sealed to **Naomi Bland** on October 29, 1852, in Salt Lake City, Salt Lake, Utah.³⁰⁹ In 1856 the family moved to Cedar City, Iron County, Utah.³¹⁰ By 1861 the family had settled in San Bernardino County, California. Their son James was born there April 20, 1861. **Wardman Holmes** died December 28, 1869, probably in San Bernardino County, California. His wife **Naomi** remarried Amos Stiles January 4, 1873, in San Bernardino, California.³¹¹

He is listed as **Wardman Holmes** age 35, wife **Naomi** age 26, children **Mary** age 6, **Marinda** age 3 and **Wardman** inf[ant].

Richard Hall (Hale) was born August 10, 1817, in Wakefield, Yorkshire, England. He is the son of Joseph Hall and Harriet Barlow.³¹² He married Anne Bordley November 13, 1837, of Wakefield, Yorkshire, England. Their son **John Hall** was born November 21, 1839, in Eathe Commons, Yorkshire, England. On April 23, 1843, a daughter **Elizabeth (Ann)** was born in Scarborough, Yorkshire, England. Their son **Richard (Jr.)** was born February 14, 1846, in Liverpool, Lancashire, England. Daughter **Rebecca** was born May 3, 1848, in Liverpool, Yorkshire, England. His family came to America with 402 Saints on the ship “Argo” under the direction of Elder Jeter Clinton. They departed January 10, 1850, and arrived in New Orleans in March 1850. They are listed as **Richard** age 30, Ann age 30, **John** age 9, **Elizabeth Ann** age 7, **Richard Jr.** age 4, and **Rebecca** age 2. They all came from Liverpool and **Richard** is a mason. Their daughter Martha Hall was born February 1, 1851, in St. Louis, St. Louis, Missouri, February 9, 1851. Martha and her mother Anne Bordley died. He married **Eliza Brooks** who was born 1826.³¹³ **Eliza Brooks** is the daughter of Edward Brooks and Jane (Unknown). She was christened September 26, 1826, at Sutton under Brailes, Warwick, England. Her father is listed as Edward and mother is Ann.³¹⁴ She came to America on the ship “Ellen” January 8, 1851, with 466 Saints under the direction of James W. Cummings. She is listed as **Eliza Brooke** age 28, of Birmingham. With her is **Emma Brooke** age 21, of Birmingham. **Emma Brooks** daughter of Edward Brooks and Jane, who married **George Barnfield Snow** of this company. Harriet Brook, age 22 and Origin: Whitwick is on the ship with them and a possible sister.

Ten weeks before the McGaw Company left, **W. W. Hall** was born to **Richard and Eliza Hall**. **Eliza Brooks** died September 15, 1852, before they reached Salt Lake.³¹⁵ The September 15, 1852, Camp Journal entry states “Eliza Hale, wife of Richard Hale, died at Weber River.” After he arrived in Salt Lake **Richard Hall** married Sarah Brereton and she died in Manti Utah.³¹⁶ He married Catherine Jack and they had seven children. He settled in Manti, Sanpete, Utah. The 1880 Federal Census located **Richard** in Manti, Sanpete, Utah, where he was a stone cutter. He learned the trade from his father. Many buildings in Manti were erected by him, he also worked on the Manti and St. George Temples.³¹⁷

He is listed as **Richard Hale** age 30, wife **E. Brooks** age 26, children: **W.W.** 10 weeks, **John Hall** age 13, **Eliza A.** age 10, **Richard** age 7, and **Rebecca** age 4.

John Whiting was born January 15, 1821, in Weedon, Northampton, England. He is the son of James Whiting and Mary Pickering.³¹⁸ He married **Ann Pinfold** July 1, 1844, in Weedon, Northampton, England. She is the daughter of James Pinfold and Sarah Cross. She was born January 18, 1827, in Weedon, Northampton, England. They came to America with a group of 357 saints on the “North Atlantic” under the direction of Elder David Sudworth. The ship left Liverpool September 4, 1840, and arrived in New Orleans on November 1, 1850, where the Saints transferred to a steam boat for the journey up the Mississippi to St. Louis.³¹⁹ The ship roster lists Mary Whiting age 57, Head, **John** age 28, **Ann** age 25, **William Jr.** age 3, and **Sarah** age 2. With them was William Whiting, age 33, who was born June 1816, the brother of **John Whiting**. William is a plate layer and **John** is a bricklayer. They all came from Birmingham. The family settled in the Salt Lake City area. **Ann** died in 1872 and **John Whiting** is living

with his daughter and her family. **Sarah** married John B. Marvin of New York. John is listed as a Mason B.J.S.

He is listed as **John Whiting** age 30, wife **Ann** age 26, with children **William** age 6, **Sarah** age 3, and **John B.** (Brigham) inf[ant].

George Barnfield Snow was born January 1, 1826, in Elkstone, Gloucester, England. He is the son of Daniel Snow and Ann Barnfield. He is listed in the Birmingham, England LDS Branch.³²⁰ He came to America with 402 Saints on the ship “Argo” under the direction of Elder Jeter Clinton. They departed January 10, 1850, and arrived in New Orleans in March 1850. The ships roster lists **George Snow** Family #1 and one in the family.³²¹ Traveling on this ship was **Wardman Holmes** and family. Also on the ship was Elizabeth Brooks age 49 Head, Mary age 41, Ann age 17, John age 9, and Margaret age 3.³²² All of above were from St. Albans. **George Snow** married **Emma Brooks**. She is the daughter of Edward Brooks and Jane. She was born June 12, 1830, in Birmingham, Warwick, England.³²³ She came to America on the ship “Ellen” January 8, 1851, with 466 Saints under the direction of James W. Cummings. She is listed as **Emma Brooke** age 21 from Birmingham. She is with **Eliza Brooke** age 28, wife of **Richard Hall (Hale)** of Birmingham and Harriet Brooke age 22 from Whitwick. There are two George Snow families listed in the 1852 Pottawattamie County Iowa 1852 Federal Census. Their first son George Barnfield Snow was born January 10, 1853, after they arrived in Salt Lake. The 1880 Federal Census locates the family living in Salt Lake, where **George. B. Snow** is a well digger.

He is listed as **George Snow** age 26 and wife **Emma** age 22.

James Brimmel Ellis was born 1813. He married **Lenora** who was born 1815.

He is listed as **James B. Ellis** age 39, wife **Lenora** age 37, children **William** age 15, **Daniel** age 7, and **Emily** age 7.

James B. Ellis and family are listed along the side of this Candland Report.

He was moved to the 5th Ten.

(See information about this family in the 5th Company)

Charles Henry Bassett - Captain of 4th Ten

Charles Henry Bassett was born March 14, 1828, in Ossian, Allegany, New York. He is the son of **Elias Bassett** and **Matilda Salter**,³²⁴ of this McGaw Pioneer Company. He married **Permilia Mindwell Dayton** March 18, 1845, in Nauvoo, Hancock Illinois.³²⁵ She is the daughter of Hyrum Dayton and Permilia Bundy and was born February 11, 1823, in Farmington, Geauga, Ohio. In December 13, 1846, they are in Montrose, Lee, Iowa where their daughter **Helen Maria** was born. By August 5, 1848, they are in Council Bluffs, Pottawattamie, Iowa with the Saints when their daughter **Flora Elizabeth** was born. They are not listed in the 1850 or 1852 census in Iowa. **Charles Henry Bassett** was called to be Captain of the 4th Ten in the James McGaw Pioneer Company. A picture of **Charles Henry Bassett** is in *Utah Pioneers and Prominent Men*. He was a High Priest and a missionary to Ohio in 1854.³²⁶ “He was a brilliant, scholarly, gentleman. At the age of 15, he taught school. In Council Bluffs, Iowa, he clerked in a store. He developed an interest in merchandise sales and purchasing. After his arrival in the Salt Lake Valley he went, by horse team, to Los Angeles and San Francisco, California, to obtain goods for retail sales, becoming a very successful merchant. He later became a bookkeeper in the Bishop’s General Storehouse. He served on a mission to Ohio in 1864. He became a High Priest in the Liberty Stake of Zion.”³²⁷ **Permilla** died April 9, 1876, in Salt Lake City, Utah of pneumonia.³²⁸ The 1880 Federal Census locates **Charles Bassett** living in Salt Lake City, where he is a clerk in store.

Charles H. Bassett wrote an essay called “Death and Burial on the Plains.”³²⁹ This essay tells of life and death on the plains while they are camped on the Wood River in Iowa. He records the death of Joel Sprouse, how he died and was buried. Permela is mentioned in this report.³³⁰

He is listed as **C.H. Bassett** age 24, wife **Permela** age 29, and children **Helen** (Marie) age 6, **Florinda** (Elizabeth) age 3, and **Charles** (Julius) aged 8 months.

Uriah Martin Curtis was born March 1837 in Clay County, Missouri. Some records show he was born in Crooked River, Daviess, Missouri.³³¹ He is the son of Uriah Curtis and Phoebe Martin.³³² Uriah Curtis, his father, was the Captain of the 16th Pioneer Wagon Train in 1852. The 1851 Census of Pottawattamie County, Iowa, lists both Uriah M. Curtis and son Uriah Curtis. They are listed in the Mt. Pisgah Branch of the church 1846.³³³ The Sons of Utah Pioneers lists Uriah Curtis Jr. age 16 came with Uriah Curtis. In 1856 and 1860 he is in Springville, Utah.³³⁴ He settled in Ft. Duchesne, Uintah, Utah and died there in March 18, 1899.

He is listed as **Uriah Curtis** age 18.

Daniel L. Grenig (Greenig) was born May 16, 1826,³³⁵ in Stoeckstadt, Hessen, Starkenburg, Germany.³³⁶ Birth place also listed as Toehsdadt, Tostedt, Hannover, Preussen.³³⁷ The 1880 Federal Census locates his birth place as Gluckstead FR, which must be in Germany. All other records list his birth place as Germany. He is the son of Johannes Gruenig and Anna Maria Friedrich.³³⁸ Johann Greenig, a native of

Stockstadt on the Rhine, who had emigrated to the United States where he embraced the gospel and was called in 1843 on a mission to his native land. He founded a branch of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Hennen-Darmstadt and returned to Nauvoo early the next year.³³⁹ **Daniel** married **Sarah Ann Allen** on April 15, 1848, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.³⁴⁰ They were sealed in Salt Lake September 4, 1853. **Sarah Ann** was born in 1832 in Pennsylvania. Her patriarchal blessing lists her birth as April 10, 1832.³⁴¹ Her parents are **Thomas Allen** and **Margaret** of this McGaw Company. **Daniel** and his wife **Sarah A.** and son Franklin, age 1, are living with **Thomas** and **Margaret Allen** in the Pottawattamie County, Iowa, census in 1850³⁴² and in the Kanessville Branch.³⁴³ **Daniel** is listed as a baker. **Daniel and Sarah A.** are living in Pottawattamie County, Iowa, in the 1850 Federal Census with their daughter **Mary C. Greenig**. The child Franklin is not listed. **Daniel Grenig** is listed in the Kanessville Branch in 1851 with **Levi Powell** where they are both in the Lesser Priesthood. In the 1860, 1870, and 1880 censuses the family is in Salt Lake City with **Sarah's** parents living with them. **Daniel** is listed as a baker and he has a private boarding house. An interesting note is the family is living next to **Charles H. Bassett** in 1860. It is interesting how friends made on the trail moved and stayed near each other. **Daniel** died December 13, 1888, in Salt Lake City Utah.³⁴⁴

He is listed as **D.L. Grenig** age 26, wife **Sarah** age 20 and child **Mary**, 18 mos.

Hiram Grenig - Probably Daniel's brother.
He is listed as **Hiram Grenig**. (no age listed)

John McMurray was born 1830. There is a John Murray who died in Ogden, Weber, Utah, November 20, 1916. No parents or birth date are given. John Murray is listed in the Isaac M. Stewart company as coming to Utah with 2 persons.³⁴⁵ John McMurray born July 12, 1830, in Tongland, Kirkcudbright, Scotland, the son of John McMurray and Isabella Shaw is from an early IGI entry. John Thomas Murray born Oct. 13, 1827, in New Castle County, Delaware, son of Seth Murray and Elizabeth.³⁴⁶ More research is needed to identify **John McMurray**.

He is listed as **John McMurray** age 22- Teamster

W. Jacob Houseman was born 1816 in Switzerland. The June 28th entry in the **David Candland** McGaw Pioneer Company Journal lists **W. Jacob Houseman** of Switzerland. There is a J. Houseman in the 1870 Census in Morgan County, Utah. More research is needed to identify him.
He is listed as **Jacob Houseman** age 36- Teamster

Charles C. Waterhouse³⁴⁷ was born 1806 in New York.³⁴⁸ He married **Levina** before 1840 but the children could be from a first marriage. **Levina** was born 1810 in New York. A Charles Waterhouse married Mary Ann Holbert in Hunterdon County, New Jersey, November 6, 1830. There is a Charles C.

Waterhouse in the 1840 Federal Census in New York City 11th Ward. In 1850 the Charles Waterhouse living in Des Moines County, Iowa is married to Jane.³⁴⁹

In the McGaw Company **Charles Waterhouse** had three wagons. Traveling with him as teamsters are **R. Sagers, W. Jenkins** and **Nicholson**.

Charles Waterhouse is living in the Salt Lake City 14th Ward in the 1852 Bishop's Report. The 1860 Federal Census of Sacramento County, Third District, lists L.G (**Levina**) **Waterhouse** Female, age 52, **Cornelia G.** age 20, **Addison C. G.** 18, **Franklin B. G.** age 10, all born in New York and Andrew Welch age 30, bom in Connecticut.³⁵⁰ Her occupation is listed as a Hydropathic Physic. **Levina's** maiden name probably begins with a "G."

Their son **Addison Waterhouse** is living in Sacramento, Sacramento, California with his family in the 1880 Federal Census and is a pattern maker. Both he and his parents were born in New York. Their son **Franklin** is listed in the 1880 Federal Census in Sacramento, Sacramento, California, a few pages up from **Addison**. He is listed as **Frank G. Waterhouse** a clerk in office with his wife Nellie, with both parents born in New York.

Levina is located in the 1880 Federal Census in Sacramento, Sacramento California, age 69 and born in New York. Her father born in Massachusetts and mother born in Connecticut. She is living with a group of unrelated persons.

Living in Sacramento, Sacramento, California at this time is **William Wallace** and **Calvin and Sarah Sidall**.

He is listed as **C.C Waterhouse** age 46 with **Levina** age 42 and children **Corneila** age 12, **Addison** age 10 and **Franklin** age 2.

R. Sagers born 1817. Richard Sagar was born September 10, 1815, in Bank Newton, York, England, father Richard Sagar and mother Deborah.³⁵¹ Possible brother of Harrison Sagers who is listed in the 1850 Federal Census in Tooele County, Utah, also listed in that census is Harrison, Harriet, and William Sagers.³⁵² Harrison Sagers married Lucinda Madison December 22, 1834, in Clay County, Missouri.³⁵³ **R. Sager** is a teamster for **Charles C. Waterhouse**.

He is listed as **R. Sagers-** age 35 -Teamster

W. Jenkins was born 1812.³⁵⁴ Probably he is William Jenkins. There is a William T. Jenkins in the 1851 Pottawattamie County, Iowa Census. He could be William Jenkins born September 14, 1812, of Dutchess County, New York, the son of Llewellyn Jenkins and Patience Woodward. He could be the William Jenkins born December 23, 1812, in Risia, Monmouth, South Wales [England]. His parents are Edward Jenkins and Emma Edwards.³⁵⁵ This William Jenkins is living in Salt Lake City, Salt Lake, Utah and listed in the 1880 Federal Census as a carpenter. This William Jenkins is living with his wife Eliza G. Jenkins age 43 and born in England. His death records lists his birth as January 1813 in Resca, So. Wales,

and died May 6, 1892, in Salt Lake City.³⁵⁶ There is also a William Jenkins on the ship “North America” in 1840 born in 1810.³⁵⁷ William Jenkins, born February 13, 1813, in Ohio, is a relative of Charles Shumway.³⁵⁸ He is a teamster for *Charles C. Waterhouse*.

He is listed as *W. Jenkins* age 40- Teamster

_____ *Nicholson* was born 1828. There are many Nicholsons that came on the ships, “Berlin,” “Zetland,” “Ellen Maria,” and “James Pennell” in 1849, 1850, and 1852. One possible match could be Adam Nicholson born 1829, head and only Nicholson on the ship “Ellen Maria.” There are also many Nicholsons in the 1852 Federal Census, but none in Pottawattamie County, Iowa. Uriah Nickelson is in the LDS Shirts Branch in Iowa.³⁵⁹ He is a teamster for *Charles C. Waterhouse*.

He is listed as _____ *Nicholson* age 24- Teamster

James Toms was born March 3, 1823, in Cheltenham, Gloucester, England.³⁶⁰ He is the son of Robert Toms and Susan. He married *Caroline* who was born in 1826 from Chettenham, England. She has not been identified. *James and Caroline* came to America from England with 245 Saints and 60 other passengers on the ship “Olympus,” which sailed March 4, 1851. *James* is listed as a carver and polisher. Elder William Howell presided over the Mormons. It was a perilous voyage. The storms were so bad that the Captain told the second mate to go tell the Captain of the Mormons that they should pray for the ship to be saved. Elder Howell told the second mate that they had embarked from Liverpool to New Orleans and they would arrive safely in that port and “Our God will protect us.” The Saints prayed and the next day asked permission to hold religious services. During this crossing fifty persons were baptized. With them was McGaw Company member *George T. Woodhead, William Bailey & Phillip Smith*. They arrived in New Orleans April 27, 1851.³⁶¹ The 1860 Federal Census locates *James Toms* in Salt Lake City.³⁶² He is 37 years old and a gunsmith, his wife is Elizabeth, age 25. He married Elizabeth Beecroft September 6, 1862, in Salt Lake City Utah.³⁶³ In December 13, 1871, *James Toms* and three other men were arrested for the murder of Dr. J. King Robinson in 1866.³⁶⁴ On April 30, 1872, “Hosea Stout, Wm. H. Kimball, Brigham Y. Hampton, John L. Blythe, Alexander Butt, and *James Thoms* were released by the Third District Court, on the strength of the Supreme Court decision, at Washington, D.C., John Brazier had previously been released.”³⁶⁵ *James Toms* died March 27, 1880, in Salt Lake City and is buried in the Salt Lake City Cemetery. They do not have a wagon and are in the company of *Charles C. Waterhouse*.

He is listed as *James Toms* age 29 and wife *Caroline* age 26. (He is not listed in the Historical Department McGaw Company list.)

Elias Bassett was born February 16, 1800, in Stephentown, Rensselaer, New York. Some records have he was born in Pittsford, Monroe, New York.³⁶⁶ He is the son of Oliver Bassett and Betsy.³⁶⁷ He married **Matilda Salter** about 1820 of Oak Orchard, Orleans, New York, where their first child was born. **Matilda** was born July 16, 1800, in Northfield, Ontario, New York, to parents John Salter and Phebe. When their last child **Mary Matilda Bassett** was born in 1837 they are in Knowleville, Orleans, New York.³⁶⁸ **Elias and Matilda** received their endowments in the Nauvoo Temple January 12, 1846.³⁶⁹ Their son, Hiram Davis Bassett died in Council Bluffs, Pottawattamie, Iowa on March 12, 1847. They are listed in the 1850 Census in Pottawattamie, Iowa, in the North Pidgeon LDS Branch.³⁷⁰ The census records **Elias Bassett** age 50, **Matitala** age 50, and **Mary** age 13, all born in New York.³⁷¹ They are the parents of **Mary Matilda Bassett** who married **James McGaw**, the Captain of this Pioneer Company. **Elias** was the company blacksmith. In 1856 they located with **James and Mary Matilda McGaw** in Fillmore, Millard County, Utah in the Utah State census.³⁷² In 1860 they are living with **James and Mary Matilda McGaw** in Ogden, Weber County, Utah.³⁷³ **Elias** died May 14, 1869, in Ogden, Weber, Utah and **Matilda** died October 18, 1878, in Ogden, Weber, Utah.

He is listed as **Elias Bassett** age 52 with wife **Matilda** age 52.

George Gregory no age given. No George Gregory in Utah 1856 State Census.
He is listed as **George Gregory**- no date given

Susan Maria Cardin Kirby (widow) was born March 6, 1829,³⁷⁴ in Randolph County, Georgia. She is the daughter of Freeman David Cardin and Elizabeth.³⁷⁵ She married a Mr. Kirby probably in Randolph County, Georgia. This is where their son **Andrew Jackson Kirby** is born August 10, 1845.³⁷⁶ The only Kirby in the 1851 Pottawattamie County, Iowa Census is Joseph. A Susan Maria Cardin was sealed to Dimic Baker Huntington May 18, 1853, in Salt Lake City. Ancestry World Tree Entry lists Susan Maria Cardin married to Dimick Baker Huntington May 18, 1823. (Too early for this Susan Maria.) Another sealing record in Salt Lake City lists a Susan Maria Cardin married John Crane Whitbeck July 31, 1854. In 1856 in the Utah State census there is a Susan M. Kirby listed in Tooele County, Utah page 825 Grantsville Twp. A **Susan Maria Cardin** was sealed to William Hinton Crawford March 28, 1857, in Salt Lake City. These entries are interesting because they all use her middle & maiden names. In 1856 William Hinton Crawford is in Salt Lake City. IGI entries list William Hinton Crawford as related to **Andrew Jackson Kirby**. The 1860 Federal Census locates Wm H. Crawford and **Susan Maria** in Washington County, Utah.³⁷⁷ **Andrew Jackson Kirby**, who would have been 15, is not living with them. In 1880 the family is living on Greers Ranch, Apache, Arizona. **Susan M.** is a tailoress, bom in Georgia and her mother born in Georgia. **Susan Maria** died November 1896 in Silver City, Grant, New Mexico. She would have been 16 when **Andrew Jackson Kirby** was born.

She is listed as **Susan Kirby** (Widow) age 23 and **Andrew Jackson** age 7.

Joseph (Joel) Sprouse (Spronco) was born 1827. He is the son of Elijah A. Sprouse and Mary E. (Polly) Sanders. He married **Sarah Burney** who was born 1832/34 in Grimes County, Texas. She is the daughter of William Burney and Susanna Holland.³⁷⁸ He died of cholera on the trail on July 11/15, 1852. He was called Joel Sprouce in Second Ward. The essay “Death and Burial on the Plains” by Charles H. Bassett³⁷⁹ is about life and death in the 11th Immigrant Company, 1852, while camped on the Wood River in Iowa. It concerns the weekend of July 11, 1852, when Joel Sprouse contracted cholera and died. It includes insights into camp life and burial on the plains.³⁸⁰

In 1802, the Sprouse family is located in Union County, South Carolina. They moved to Noxubee County, Mississippi, then to Grimes County, Texas.³⁸¹ The Elijah Sprouse family moved to Grimes County, Texas by 1850 and they are listed in the 1850 Census. **Joel Sprouse** is age 22 and born in Alabama. **Sarah Barney** age 18, born in Texas is living with the Sprouse family. **Joel Sprouse** married **Sarah Burney**, August, 11, 1850 in Grimes, Texas.³⁸² He is born “about 1828 in Alabama, the son of Elijah A. Sprouse and Mary E. (Polly) Sanders.”³⁸³ **James McGaw** served a mission in Texas in 1851. Possibly he converted this family. This Elijah is in Tooele County, Utah in 1856. There is a Joseph Sprouse born about 1827 in Neshoba County, Mississippi (near Noxubee County).³⁸⁴ An LDS IGI individual entry lists Joseph Sprouse death July 1852, of USA.³⁸⁵ The Family Historical Department lists him as Jacob Sprouse.

He is listed **Joseph (Joel) Sprouse** age 25 and wife **Sarah** age 18.

John Gooch Jr. was born August 6, 1824, in Concord, Middlesex, Massachusetts. He the son of John Gooch and Anna Maria Mercer.³⁸⁶ He married **Mary Ann Cleary** 1845 in Nauvoo, Hancock, Illinois.³⁸⁷

Mary Ann Cleary was born September 1822 in Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada. She is the daughter of John Cleary and Ann Mary Peck.³⁸⁸ They were in St. Louis, St. Louis, Missouri, December 1, 1848, when their son **John Orson Gooch** was born. Before they came west **John Gooch** and Orson Hyde worked in the office of the *Frontier Guardian* newspaper.³⁸⁹ The family is listed in the Block House Branch 1846-1849.³⁹⁰ Their son **Charles Henry Gooch** was born November 4, 1851, in Kanesville, Pottawattamie, Iowa. This family is listed four families down from **Levi Powell**, of this McGaw Pioneer Company, in the 1850 Pottawattamie Iowa Federal Census. **John Gooch** died September 20, 1852, on the route west.³⁹¹ He died July 15 while the Company was camped on Wood River, Nebraska.³⁹² **Mary Ann Cleary Gooch** married Frederick Palmer 1853 in Salt Lake City, Salt Lake, Utah. They settled in Salt Lake City and had a large family.

He is listed as **John Gooch** age 27, with wife **Mary A.** age 28, and children, **John** age 4, and **Charles H.** age 7 months.

James McGaw- Captain of the Eleventh Pioneer Wagon Train

James R. McGaw was born August 27, 1823, in Clisiliva, Niagara, Upper Canada. He is the son of Charles McGaw and Susan Taylor.³⁹³ He married **Mary Matilda Bassett** May 15, 1852. She was born January 18, 1837, in Knowleville, Orleans, New York. Her parents are **Elias Bassett** and **Matilda Salter** of this company. **James McGaw** was baptized October 11, 1841, by William Corey in Hancock County, Illinois. He served missions for the Church in 1842, 1848, 1851, 1854, and 1865.

The family settled in Filmore, Millard County; American Fork, Utah County; and then moved by 1863 to Ogden, Weber, Utah. He died January 15, 1872, in Ogden, Weber, Utah.

See the history on **James and Mary McGaw** in Part II of this book.

He is listed as **James McGaw** age 28, and wife **Mary** age 15.

David Candland- Clerk of the James McGaw Company

David Candland was born October 1819 in Highgate, Middlesex, England. He is the son of Samuel Candland and Sarah Betts.³⁹⁴ He came to America with 214 Saints September 25, 1842, on the ship “Medford” under the direction of Orson Hyde.³⁹⁵ “Baptized into Mormon Church in England, 1841. Emigrated to Nauvoo, 1842. Preached. Taught school, 1844-45. Clerk for Brigham Young.”³⁹⁶ He married Mary Ann Barton March 27/28, 1844, in Nauvoo, Hancock, Illinois. They were sealed January 10, 1846, by Brigham Young. She was born February 6, 1814, in Northumberland, Pennsylvania. She is the daughter of Noah Barton and Mary Cooley.

David Candland was called to serve a mission in England after being married a year, leaving Mary Ann with ten-day-old Sarah Emily. She went to Winter Quarters with her brother and two sisters and their families in 1846. When he returned they moved to Pottawattamie, Iowa.³⁹⁷ They are living three houses from **Levi Powell** in the 1850 Pottawattamie County, Iowa Federal Census. Living with them is Mary (Jane) Webb, age 16, whom he married October 29, 1852.³⁹⁸ **David** is listed as a Clerk. Here, when Mary Ann was expecting their fourth child, **David** was called to serve a mission to the Eastern States and Canada.³⁹⁹ Mary Ann Candland came to Utah in 1851.⁴⁰⁰ Mary J. Webb, age 20, came to Utah in the Uriah Curtis Company in 1852. On his way home from his mission to the East he was called to be the Clerk of the James McGaw Pioneer Company.

David Candland settled in Salt Lake City where he worked as a Clerk for **William Nixon** of this McGaw Pioneer Company. He was assistant stage manager of the Deseret Dramatic Association, Assessor, Postmaster of Fort Supply. He moved to Sanpete County in 1861. He was there in 1880 in the Federal Census where he is listed as the County Prosecuting Attorney. He died March 4, 1902, in Mt. Pleasant, Utah.⁴⁰¹

He is listed as **David Candland** age 30.⁴⁰²

Thomas Allen was born March 24, 1784, in Castlehaven, Cork, Ireland.⁴⁰³ He is the son of Thomas Allen

and Hannah. He married **Margaret Williams** who was born February 14, 1789,⁴⁰⁴ in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.⁴⁰⁵ She is the daughter of John Williams and Catherine.⁴⁰⁶ The 1850 Federal Census locates Thomas Allen in Pottawattamie County, Iowa.⁴⁰⁷ They are living with their son-in-law **Daniel Grenig** and **Sarah Allen**, their daughter. **Thomas Allen** was sealed to **Margaret Williams** November 6, 1852, in Salt Lake City, Utah. In the 1860 Federal Census they are living with their daughter **Sarah** and her family. The 1870 Federal Census lists only **Margaret** with her daughter and family. Every census lists **Margaret** as born in Pennsylvania. **Thomas** died May 31, 1870, in Salt Lake City.⁴⁰⁸ **Margaret** died February 18, 1871, at Salt Lake City.⁴⁰⁹ The sexton records lists her birth as February 14, 1789, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

He is listed as **Thomas Allen** age 68, and wife **Margaret** age 63.

Charles Henry Bassett- Captain of the 5th Ten

David Candland Report of June 27, 1852, has William Winsor nominated by JW McGaw, Captain of the 5th 10 which was carried.

Anson P. Winsor- Captain of the 5th Ten.

Anson Perry Winsor was born August 19, 1818, in Ellicottville, Cattaraugus, New York. He is the son of Abraham Winsor and Sophia Bigelow.⁴¹⁰ He married **Emmaline Zennetta Brower** March 20, 1842, in Pike County, Illinois.⁴¹¹ **Emmaline Zennetta** was born March 21, 1824, in Sullivan, Madison, New York. She is the daughter of John Brower and Delight Smith. “**Anson** was baptized (in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day [*sic*] Saints) four days before their wedding and Emeline one year after.”⁴¹²

The 1850 Federal Census locates them in Pike County, Illinois, in Perry Township. They are living on the property of Emmaline’s father, John T. Brower. This is the same township in which **Levi Powell** and his family owned property. They are in Section 21 and Levi Powell’s family remaining in Pike County are in Section 17, which is diagonal from Section 21.

“Getting ready to follow the Saints west took ten years. Well provisioned with two wagons and two good teams of oxen, cows for milk, butter and cheese. So well prepared were they that some less fortunate were invited to go with them. **Anson** driving one wagon and **Walter John**, eight years old, driving the other team and wagon. Not long into their travels **Emeline** became very ill, too ill to be moved. The train waited a few days to see if it would help her but she did not improve. The Indians had become more and more hostile, the McGraw Company felt exposed and vulnerable, they knew they must move on leaving behind **Emeline’s** family and two other wagons, friends who would not leave them alone on the prairie. Fasting and praying, fearful yet trusting they stayed. In a few days **Emeline** miraculously recovered, and by the end of five days the rested animals were able to over take the McGraw train to the delight of everyone.”⁴¹³ **Emeline’s** daughter **Alva or Slvira** was born May 9, 1852, just a month and a half before they left Kanessville.

Upon their arrival in Utah Territory they settled at Provo, Utah.⁴¹⁴ This was where **Levi Powell** settled also. In 1857 **Anson** was appointed wagon master of the B.Y. Express Company and on a trip to the Missouri River. That summer he heard of the westward movement of “Johnston’s Army” and sent a message to President Brigham Young notifying him of this fact.⁴¹⁵

They were sent by Brigham Young to settle many areas in the Dixie Area. They were called in 1861 to build a fort, improve the spring, and take care of tithing cattle for the church. **Anson** finished the fort by 1870 and named it Winsor Castle. Later the name was changed to Pipe Springs. They furnished the temple workers on the St. George Temple with beef, butter, and cheese.⁴¹⁶ His picture is in *Utah Pioneers and Prominent Men*.⁴¹⁷ He died June 17, 1917, in St. George, Utah and is buried there.⁴¹⁸

He is listed as **Anson P. Winsor** age 34, wife **Emiline** age 26, and children **Walter** age 8, and **Babe** 2 weeks.

Lucius Brandon was born 1814. He is listed with Elizabeth. An individual entry in the IGI record lists Lucas Brandon born 1819 in Iconium, Appanoose, Iowa with spouse Mrs. Harriet Brandon.

He is listed as **Lucius Brandon** age 38, and **Elizabeth** no age listed.

William Wheeler was born February 13, 1815, in Himbleton, Worcestershire, England. He was christened February 10, 1816, in Himbleton, Worcestershire, England. He is the son of William Wheeler and Ann Stringer. He married **Mary Coombs Bradley** September 7, 1842, in Worcestershire, England.⁴¹⁹ **Mary** was born 1802⁴²⁰ or December 26, 1803, in Worcestershire, England,⁴²¹ the daughter of Thomas Coombs and Sarah Honeybound. She married first Thomas Bradley on March 6, 1826, in Claines, Worcester, England.⁴²² There is no proof this is the same Mary Coombs. She married **William Wheeler** Sept 7, 1842, in Saint Martin, Worcester, Worcester, England.⁴²³ They traveled to America with 378 Saints on February 1, 1851, from Liverpool, England on the ship “Ellen Maria.” Elder George D. Watt presided over the saints. The family is listed as **William Wheeler** Head (1817), **Mary** wife (no birth date listed), **Mary** (1838), and **Elizabeth** (1848).

On the ship “Ellen Maria” on this sailing was Thomas Bradley born 1812 and Octavia M. Bradley born 1819. They are probably relatives. This Thomas could be the Thomas Bradley christened March 22, 1812, in Leigh with Bransford, Worcester, England.⁴²⁴ **William Wheeler** and family joined the Saints in the McGaw Company to go west. **Mary Wheeler** and her daughter **Mary** died July 21/22, 1852, of cholera. They were about 14 miles west of Spring Creek.⁴²⁵ David Candland reports **Mary** was “buried by side of her mother between the road and river.” This child **Mary** is Mary Bradley Wheeler on the christening record, born December 24, 1837, Himbleton, Worcester, England, the daughter of **William Wheeler and Mary** (no surname given). This would make this child **Mary** the daughter of **William** (or possibly **Mary**) from another marriage, since they were not married until 1842.

William and his daughter **Elizabeth** settled in Salt Lake City. **William Wheeler** married **Elizabeth Case Milam**, widow of **William Milam**, who had died in this McGaw Company in Salt Lake City on June 10, 1855.⁴²⁶ In 1880 William is living in Salt Lake with his wife Ann Houseman Wheeler. He is listed as a gardner. **William Wheeler** died January 27, 1893, in Salt Lake⁴²⁷ and **Elizabeth Case Milam Wheeler** died July 1, 1891, in Salt Lake City, Utah.⁴²⁸

He is listed as **William Wheeler** age 37, wife **Mary** age 50, and children **Mary** age 15, and **Elizabeth** age 5.

Levi Powell was born June 29, 1806, in Smith County Tennessee. He is the son of Charles M. Powell and Nancy Smith. He married **Mary Elizabeth Parker** about 1824 in Smith County, Tennessee. She was born 1805/6, in Tennessee. Her parents have not been identified. **Levi** and his family moved to Illinois about 1827. Their son James Evans Powell was about one year old. **Levi** purchased property in Pike County, Illinois from the United States February 19, 1836. March 22, 1840, Joseph Wood organized a Branch of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints with eighteen members in Brown County, Illinois called

the Union Branch. **Levi Powell** is listed as a Teacher. Sunday, February 28, 1841, this Branch was reorganized and joined with the Brown Branch.

Levi Powell and his wife **Mary** are listed as members where **Levi** is a Priest. Between 1843 and 1847 **Levi** and his wife **Mary** sell their property in Pike County. **Levi** sells to his father on October 28, 1847, his last piece of property. This is probably when they moved to Nauvoo. His daughter **Eliza M.** in her biography states that he was a carpenter on the Nauvoo Temple. There is no record of them owning property in Nauvoo. In 1850 they are living in Kanessville, Pottawattamie, Iowa. Living near them was **David Candlin** and **John Gooch** and families of this company. **Levi** is listed as a cooper (barrel maker). On February 7, 1851, a fire broke out in Kanessville and **Levi** and his son helped put it out. He was listed in the Lesser Priesthood with **Daniel Grenig** (of this company) March 16, 1851. “An advertisement in the Frontier Guardian Sept 5, 1851, is the first we see of **Levi Powell** going into the Retail Business in Kanessville. The advertisement is for the Kanessville Meat Market and the People’s Provision Store.”⁴²⁹

“Pottawattamie County Deed A: 61 (Abstract): **Levi Powell** mortgaged to William Hawks, lot on northwest side of Main Street, 66 feet in front, extending back to [Indian Creek], bounded northeast by Mr. Packard’s saw pit lot and northwest by Mr. Brown’s dwelling house lot, 1 acre, October 23, 1851.” November 11, 1852, W. P. Hancock opened the Kanessville Meat Market. **Levi Powell** and family are listed in the 1852 State Census of Iowa. They joined the McGaw Pioneer Company to come west with the Saints. On July 18th **Mary Elizabeth Parker Powell** contracted cholera. and she died that evening at 7 o’clock. She was on the trail only 24 days. She died 19 miles east of Cold Spring.⁴³⁰ Her husband made a casket out of one of his wagons. The family settled in Provo, Utah. **Levi Powell** remarried Jane James Dack by 1856. They moved to Montana in 1864 with Mrs. Dack, her family, and his daughter **Eliza M.** and her family. **Levi** drowned in the Jefferson River June 20, 1865.⁴³¹

He is listed as **Levi Powell** age 46, his wife **Mary E.** age 46, and children **Joseph L.** age 14 and **Eliza M.** age 11.

Thomas Ashley was born 1825. The McGaw report lists him as age 27 in 1852. There is a Thomas Ashley who came from England in 1842 on the ship “Hope” with a group of Saints. He is listed as age 15 in 1842 which make his birth 1827.⁴³² He is listed as the son of Richard Ashley and Elizabeth Jones or Hughes in LDS Ancestral File entries.⁴³³ They are from Overton, Flint, Wales; Peuley, Green Flint, Wales, or Overton, Cheshire England, depending on the source. The ship register lists three Ashley families on this ship. William and Elizabeth Ashley and their children, numbers 147-153. Elizabeth age 21 is listed as number 235 and Thomas age 15 (1827) is number 236. Richard Ashley age 23 and wife and children are listed numbers 222-225. This source is LDS Emigrant Roster & Voyage History by “Your Ship.” The Mormon Immigration Index lists this Thomas Ashley as age 5 and born in 1837.⁴³⁴ A copy of the ship roster shows the number one very faint, but Thomas is age 15.⁴³⁵ Other children on this very faint ship roster are extracted differently in both sources. This family has many discrepancies in the birth dates of the children as different sources record different birth dates for this family. No original christening dates have been found. Consistently, the father is listed as Richard except on the ship roster where he is listed

as William.

This same Thomas Ashley, age 24 and born in England, is listed as living with his sister Elizabeth (age 28) and her husband Richard Hatton (age 26) and family in the Warren County, Illinois 1850 Federal Census. Living near them is their brother John Ashley age 26 of England and wife Sarah Ashley, age 18, also born in England. Their sister Margaret Ashley is listed in the 1856 Utah Census in Millard County, Utah. She married Allen Russell in Salt Lake City in 1857. Allen Russell is in Pottawattamie County, Iowa in 1852. The three daughters of this Richard/ William Ashley and Elizabeth Jones/Hughes family are in Millard County Utah by 1856. They spend their lives there. Their sister Ann died in 1842 in Missouri or Nauvoo, Illinois.⁴³⁶

There are Ashley families from New York, Dearborn County, Indiana, Massachusetts and from South Carolina who could fit this Thomas. There are many Ashley families in the 1850 -1852 Federal Census in New York, Iowa, Illinois & Missouri. More research is needed. This **Thomas Ashley** died at the Elk Horn July 25, 1852, of cholera.

He is listed as **Thomas Ashley** age 27.

Edward Milnes was born 1803 of Clayton Heights, Bradford, Yorkshire, England and christened December 26, 1803, Great Horton, Yorkshire, England. He is the son of Charles Milnes and Martha Ackroyd. He married **Elizabeth Smith** January 15, 1824, in Bradford Cathedral, Yorkshire, England. She was christened December 7, 1802, in Wibsey, Yorkshire, England. She is the daughter of Thomas Smith and Billy Worthrop.⁴³⁷ They traveled to America with 369 Saints on February 10, 1852, from Liverpool, England on the ship "Ellen Maria." Elder Isaac C. Haight presided over the saints. The ship roster lists: **Edward** Head (1803), **Betty** (1803), **Martha** (1834), **Mary** (1835), **Abraham** (1837), and **Henry** (1838). **Edward** is a broker and the family are all listed as from Bradford.

Traveling with them was Thomas Child,⁴³⁸ his wife, Tabitha Milnes Child, and son Willard.⁴³⁹ Tabitha is the daughter of **Edward Child** and **Elizabeth**. Missing is daughter Elizabeth Milnes who married John Hailey. Thomas Child and family came west in the Albert O. Smoot Wagon Train. Also traveling with **Edward Milnes** was **Betty Burnett** (1817) of Bradford. **Edward** was a well-to-do furniture dealer in England. When he heard the Gospel he was baptized within three months. They joined the McGaw Company to come to Utah June 24, 1852. His wife **Betsy** contracted cholera and died July 5, 1852. Within four days of her death **Edward Milnes** contracted cholera and died July 7-17, 1852.

Traveling with them was a female **B. Burnett** age 37.

Elizabeth (Betty) Webster Burnett was born March 15, 1815, in Tong, near Leads, Yorkshire, England. She is the daughter of John Webster and Betty Barker. She married Thomas Burnett about 1843 in Tong, Yorkshire, England.⁴⁴⁰ **Betty Burnett** came to America with the **Milnes** family on the ship "Ellen Maria." She is listed as age 35 (1817) of Bradford. Also traveling on the "Ellen Maria" is Ann Webster age 19 (1833) of Sheffield. **Elizabeth Webster Burnett** married George Gates October 20, 1852, in Salt Lake City, Salt Lake, Utah. She died August 22, 1885, in Mill Creek, Salt Lake, Utah.

He is listed as *Ed Milnes* age 48, with wife *Betsy (Elizabeth)* age 48, and children *Martha* age 18, *Mary* age 17, *Abraham* age 15, and *Henry* age 14. *Edward Milnes* was moved from Captain Gerrit P. Burnett's 1st Ten to Captain Charles Henry Bassett 5th Pioneer Company of Ten.

John Hart was born June 29, 1806,⁴⁴¹ in Hemingford Abbots, Huntingdon, England. He is the son of Thomas Hart and Elizabeth Marriott.⁴⁴² He married *Ann White* 1832 in Hemingford Abbot, Huntingdon, England. *Ann White's* birth date and parents have not been found. They came to America with their daughter *Alice Hart* who was born May 4, 1834, at Saint Martin in the Fields, Westminster, London, England.⁴⁴³ *John, Ann and Alice* departed to America on June 23, 1851, on the ship "George W. Bourne" which sailed from Liverpool, England with 281 Saints, under the direction of Elders William Gibson, Thomas Margetts, and William Booth.⁴⁴⁴ Traveling with them is Henry White born 1821 of London, a boiler maker and wife Sarah White born 1826. *John Hart* age 44, his wife *Ann Hart* age 43, and *Alice Hart* age 17. They are all listed from London and *John Hart* is a shoemaker. They arrived in New Orleans, Louisiana, March 20, 1851.⁴⁴⁵ The 1880 Federal Census locates *John Hart* and family living in the 2nd Ward, Ogden, Weber, Utah. He is listed as age 74, a boot maker, his wife *Ann* is 71, and daughter *Alice Hart* is age 30. *John Hart* died December 2, 1895, in Bloomington, Bear Lake, Idaho. *John Hart* and family were originally listed in the Crandall Dunn 3rd Ten and moved to the 5th Ten.

He is listed as *John Hart* age 45, wife *Ann* age 44, child *Alice* 18.

Hiram Fillmore was born April 6, 1801, in Paris, Oneida, New York. He is the son of Simeon Fillmore and Susanna Gleason.⁴⁴⁶ He married Julia A. Baldwin on December 13, 1838, in New York.⁴⁴⁷ Julia A. Baldwin was born September 29, 1802, in Hebron, Onondaga, New York. She married first Daniel Webster. She is the daughter of Cyrus Baldwin and Susan Door. The 1840 Federal Census locates *Hiram Fillmore* as living in Lapeer County, Michigan. In the 1880 Census *Julia A Baldwin Webster Fillmore* is living with her son William Webster in Hadley, Lapeer, Michigan. *Hiram Fillmore* is not listed in the 1880 Federal Census. Julia died in June 28, 1890, in Lansing, Bingham, Michigan.

He is listed as *Hiram Fillmore* age 51.

William Bailey was born 1804.⁴⁴⁸ He might be one of the two William Baileys below.

1- William Bailey who came to America on the ship "Olympus," was born 1801 in Cambridge and a labourer. This William Bailey is located in the 1880 Federal Census as living in Salt Lake City, Utah. He is age 77 (b. 1803), born in England, and his occupation is gardener. He is living with his wife Ann Bailey age 45, who is born in England. He is also listed as William Bailey who was born September 20, 1802, in Alburgh, Norfolk, England and died in Salt Lake City August 21, 1881.⁴⁴⁹ This William Bailey is the son of John Bailey and Jemima Barrett. Other spouses of children of John Bailey and Jemima who came to America are listed on the ship rosters as from Cambridge. They are Lois Locke Bailey (wife of

John Bailey) and Mary Ann Gowen Bailey (wife of Jeremiah Bailey). The Early Church Information lists his birth as 1804 and Sept 1806.

On the ship "Olympus" also is Thomas Bailey, born 1814 and his wife Catherine Todd and their family.⁴⁵⁰ They are listed as from Grantham, England. The only listing of this family is an LDS IGI entry of a Thomas's son Ammon L. Bailey, born May 2, 1850, in Spittlegate, Grantham, Lincoln, England. This family does not seem to be related to the William Bailey above.

2- William Bailey is born March 6, 1803, in Grantham, Lincoln, England. He is the son of Joseph Bailey and Mary.⁴⁵¹

The only William Bailey listed in the 1856 Utah Census is in Provo City.

More research is need to prove which **William Bailey** came in the McGaw Pioneer Company.

He is listed as **William Bailey** age 48.

James B. Ellis was born 1822. This is the birth date listed along side the journal in the John T. Caine 4th Ten. He is listed as: **James B. Ellis** age 30, **Lenora** age 37, and children, **William** age 15, **Daniel** age 7, and **Emily** age 7. He appears again in the Charles Henry Bassett 5th Ten. James B. Ellis is listed as living in Salt Lake City 16th Ward in the 1852 Bishop's Report. James Brimmel Ellis born 1815 in England married Laura Marie Walleigh Jan Dellenrieder. He died June 1853 at Gold Canyon, Nevada.⁴⁵²

He is listed as **James B. Ellis** age 30. (His family is not listed here.)

William Milam was born March 18, 1799, in Spencer County, Kentucky. He is the son of George Milam and Jane Crafton.⁴⁵³ He married **Elizabeth Case** about 1830 in Indiana,⁴⁵⁴ (probably Greene County).⁴⁵⁵ She was born 1815 in White River, Knox County, Indiana. She is the daughter of Abraham Case and Sarah Hogue. The family joined the LDS Church in Green County, Indiana, in 1831 and moved to Missouri in 1834.⁴⁵⁶ Child **Mary Emma** was born 1837 in Far West, Caldwell, Missouri. The family moved to Nauvoo in 1839 with the Saints, where child Enoch L. is born in 1842. In 1847 they are with the Saints in Montrose, Lee County, Iowa and in 1850 in Kaneshville, Pottawattamie County, Iowa.⁴⁵⁷ They are listed in the Block House Branch in Iowa.⁴⁵⁸ Son Francis A. Milam did not come west at this time with the family. He is married in 1854 in Pottawattamie County, Iowa. During this time children, Sarah Jane and Enoch L. have died and Joseph S., William J., and Elizabeth do not travel with them. The McGaw Daily Journal, on July 23, records that Brother Milam withdrew to Russel's Company because of sickness of his son.⁴⁵⁹ **William Milam** died in 1853, the year after they arrive in Salt Lake City, Utah. **Elizabeth Case Milam** married second **William Wheeler** of this company, whose wife had died coming to Utah on the plains. They were married on June 10, 1855, in Salt Lake City, Utah. Two children were born to them. **Elizabeth** died July 1, 1891, in Salt Lake City, Utah.⁴⁶⁰

He is listed as *William Milam* age 53, wife *Elizabeth* age 37. With children *Mary E.* (Emma) age 14, *George B.* (Bennett), *Martha* (Ellen) age 2.

Robert Chapman - The Historical Department has him listed in this company. He died July 11, 1852. He could be Robert Chapman born 1812 in Deptford, England and with the Saints coming to America on the ship "Olympus" in March of 1851. With this Robert Chapman was Harriet Chapman born in 1801. He also could be Robert Chapman born 1832 in Kentucky and died 25 Aug 1852 who was the son of Solomon Chapman and Sarah Render. There is a Robert Chapman listed as died February 22, 1891, in the Ogden, Utah cemetery records. No birth date is listed.
