

## FUNERAL AT WILMORE.

Patrick McGovern, Who Died at Derry, to Be Buried There.

Wilmore, July 5.—Patrick McGovern, of Altoona, forty-six years of age, died at 2:45 o'clock this morning at the home of his mother, Mrs. Catherine McGovern, at Derry, where he had been visiting for three weeks.
