I, *Jamian Herrich* do swear that the facts set forth in this my petition are true, and that I will support the Constitution of the United States, and that I do absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state or sovereignty whatever, and particularly do absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to the *King of Prussia* of whom I was heretofore a subject.
