## DATES

For the most part, many conflicting dates were easily straightened out by simply rechecking the source material or official records. In some cases, however, marriage dates may vary from other published works because the researcher used the date of a marriage bond, or the date a marriage license was issued, instead of the actual marriage date. Even though some of the source material I used did not specify the origin of the marriage date given, I have tried to differentiate the marriage dates as accurately as possible. In a number of cases an approximate date of marriage, using the abbreviation "ca." for circa (about), is shown based upon information provided in various census documents.

Another dating problem involves the recording of marriage banns. A couple's intentions to marry, or banns of marriage, were generally proclaimed in church on three consecutive Sundays, and if no legal impediments precluded the couple from being married, their marriage would be sanctioned after the third proclamation. Unfortunately, the first or second proclamation will often be cited as the marriage date instead of the third. I must admit, however, that this is difficult to avoid in some cases because of missing or damaged records.

Death dates may also vary in that the date of burial, or the date a will was written or submitted for probate, will sometimes be cited by others instead of the actual death date. In those cases where I was unable to verify which of two dates was correct, I generally went with the one that referenced the most credible source material, or simply used the year only.

One of the most common dating conflicts involves the use of the Julian Calendar versus the Gregorian Calendar. On 14 September 1752, the Gregorian Calendar was adopted in both Great Britain and its colonies in North America, and the first day of the year then became January 1. Prior to that date, the Julian Calendar was in effect and the first day of the year was March 25. As a consequence, many dates found in the 1600's and first half of the 1700's for the months of January, February, and March reflect, or should reflect, a double date, such as 15 February 1735/1736. Even though both dates may be perfectly acceptable based upon the calendar that was in use at the time, to be consistent with current dating procedures the second date is most accurate.

## **LOCATIONS**

With respect to the location at which an event took place, there were many cases when it was not possible to find any record giving the exact location that a birth, marriage or death took place. Because I feel quite strongly that dates should always be accompanied by places, if for no other reason than to aid future research, I made a number of assumptions regarding location based upon available information. For instance, if a family is found in the Fayette County, Indiana census records for 1840 and 1850, and they also show up in the deed and tax records of that county for the same period, I did not feel that it was unreasonable to assume that any children they had during this period were probably also born in Fayette County. In some cases, however, my comfort level with assuming a possible location was limited to a state only.

**GENERATION ONE**

1. **David Lindsey.** \*

David Lindsey (also written Lindsay, Linsay, and Linsey) is the earliest known progenitor of our Lindsey / Lindsay family to have been positively identified to date. Although very little is known about David, the earliest references which were found that pertain to him were found in the Frederick County, Virginia Court and Militia records. Those entries are as follows:

**Court Records**

1749 - Terrance Carrol ordered to pay David and Catherine Lindsey 50 pounds of tobacco each for three days attendance in court on his behalf. <sup>1</sup>

June 1752 - David Linsey ordered to pay John Funk 1 pound, 16 shillings. <sup>1</sup>

3 June 1767 - William Dempster ordered to pay David and Catherine Lindsey 50 pounds of tobacco each for their attendance in court to testify in a suit with Ralph Withers. <sup>1</sup>

**Militia Records**

2 September 1755 - David Lindsey is listed as a member of the Frederick County Militia in the Company commanded by Captain Marquis Calmes. David was one of the Militia members living in that part of Frederick County that later became Clarke County, Virginia in 1836. Also listed were: Captain John Lindsey, and privates John Lindsey, Abraham Lindsey, Isaac Lindsey, and Edmund Lindsey. <sup>2</sup>

Based upon these entries, David and his family were evidently residing in Frederick County

during the period 1749-1767, but how long before or after this period is not known. Although it is known, based upon the above court records, that David was married prior to 1749 to a woman named Catherine, nothing else has been found concerning her, or her parents. <sup>1</sup> David and Catherine are believed, however, to have been married in Frederick County, Virginia.

Even though it has yet to be proven, it is very possible that David was related to the other Lindseys / Lindsays listed above, and that Captain John Lindsey may even have been his father. Captain John Lindsey was found in some of the earliest Frederick County records as taking up land in 1735, and David named a son John. Regardless of the above, all available data suggests that David was probably born someplace other than Frederick County, Virginia and moved there as a child with his parents.

It is believed that sometime in the early 1770's, David took his family and moved southwest into that part of Virginia that was later formed into Greenbrier County, Virginia in 1777. <sup>3</sup> David and his family settled on a 400 acre parcel of land on the north side of the Greenbrier River, and it is there that he appears to have resided up until the time of his death. <sup>4</sup> David and Catherine, as well as several of their children, are found in a number of Botetourt County, Virginia and Greenbrier County, West Virginia records during the 1770's and 1780's, including the ledger books of the Mathews Trading Post. <sup>5</sup> Catherine and her son, John, and daughter, Jane, are later shown in the "Virginia Heads of Families, Greenbrier County, 1783-1786." <sup>6</sup>

In one particular document, evidence was found that David and Catherine were indeed the parents of our John. A bill of sale was discovered in the deed records of Greenbrier County which states:

"I hereby acknowledge that I have sold unto Catherine Linsay, my mother, a Negro Woman named Nan (which I had of Rob't Allen), all the bed and household Furniture thats in the House, and all the working Tools of whatever kind, on the plantation of my property, the Right of which I hereby deliver unto said Catherine, her heirs and assigns for ever, for and in Consideration of a Bond she had on me of Five hundred pounds penalty, for her dower as Widow and Relict of David Lindsey, my Father, as Witness thereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this 11th July 1785." <sup>7</sup>

David Lindsey died during the latter part of 1772, or possibly early 1773, in that portion of Botetourt County, Virginia that is now within Greenbrier County, West Virginia. This is confirmed by the 1773 entries in the Mathews Trading Post ledger, which refer to Catherine Lindsey as being a widow.<sup>5</sup> The following children were identified from the ledger entries of the Matthews Trading Post.<sup>5</sup>

## GENERATION TWO

**NOTE:** Only the author's pedigree ancestor and known siblings are covered in this generation.

### 2. Robert Lindsey.

Robert Lindsey (also written Lindsay, Linsay, and Linsey), the son of David and Catherine Lindsey, was born in Frederick County, Virginia. <sup>1,5</sup> He was later found in the records of the Mathews Trading Post making purchases of various and sundry goods during the years 1771 through 1774. <sup>5</sup> A subsequent entry dated 1776, however, indicated that he was deceased. <sup>5</sup> Robert was also shown in the March and August 1775 list of Botetourt County, Virginia titheables who were residing in the Greenbrier area. <sup>13</sup>

Robert appears to have died in 1776 in Botetourt County, Virginia. <sup>5,8</sup> Although he was shown on a 1776 roster of men called into service during the Revolutionary War, a notation by his name stated he was exempt from service because he was deceased. Robert is believed to have been unmarried at the time of his death.

### 3. John Valentine Lindsey. \*

John Lindsey (also identified in various records as John Lindsay, Linsay, and Linsey), the son of David and Catherine Lindsey, was calculated to have been born in Frederick County, Virginia in about 1757. <sup>1,5,9</sup> This year was calculated from a deposition he gave on 13 December 1803 at the Boone County, Kentucky Courthouse, in which he stated he was "about 46 years" of age. <sup>14</sup> John is thought to have remained in Frederick County with his parents until sometime in the early 1770's, at which time the family appears to have moved southwest into that portion of Virginia that was later formed into Greenbrier County, Virginia (now West Virginia) in 1777. <sup>3</sup> John was shown in the March and August 1775 list of Botetourt County, Virginia titheables as living in the Greenbrier area. <sup>13</sup>

While residing in Virginia, John was married to a woman named Anna Christy. <sup>9</sup> Anna, who was a native of Culpeper County, Virginia, was the daughter of Julius Christy and Agatha Barnett. <sup>15,16</sup> Although no record of their marriage has been found, it is believed to have taken place in about 1777 in Greenbrier County, Virginia (now within West Virginia). <sup>9</sup>

In January 1780, the Greenbrier County Court granted John 800 acres of land on the north side of the Greenbrier River "by right of settlement prior to 1 January 1778," the date



Greenbrier County became functional.<sup>4</sup> According to available court records, John and two of his sisters were involved in a number of lawsuits during the 1780's, and John served on several juries during 1783 and 1784.<sup>11</sup> In 1785, John obtained an additional 236 acres of land by Warrant.<sup>7</sup>

Although the disposition of all of John Lindsey's land holdings has not been determined, on 26 February 1788 he sold a portion of his lands to Andrew Hamilton and William Elliot.<sup>7</sup> Soon after this, he and his family appear to have moved further west into the State of Kentucky, where they settled in Scott County.

Unfortunately, little information concerning John has been found covering the time he spent in Kentucky. His will, which was written on 29 September 1805, was admitted for probate before the Scott County Court during the January 1806 term, thereby indicating the period within which he passed away.<sup>10</sup> An Inventory of his estate was submitted to the Scott County Court on 27 January 1806.<sup>10</sup>

John's widow, Anna, remarried several years after John's death to a man named Spencer Stone.<sup>9</sup> Although this marriage is believed to have taken place in about 1818 in Scott County, Kentucky, many of the Scott County records were destroyed in a fire and no documents have been found to confirm this.<sup>9</sup> Spencer Stone was the father of the Elias Barbee Stone who married Catherine Houston Lindsey, one of John and Anna Lindsey's daughters.<sup>9</sup>

Although Anna and Spencer probably resided for a short time in Scott County, they eventually moved to Lincoln County, Kentucky, where Spencer owned a small farm on the banks of the Dix River which he was granted for his service in the Revolutionary War.<sup>9,17</sup> This farm was located in that portion of Lincoln County, Kentucky that was later formed into Boyle County in 1842.<sup>3</sup> It was there that Spencer Stone passed away on 1 January 1838.<sup>18</sup> Shortly after this, Anna moved to Fayette County, Indiana to be near some of her children from her first marriage to John Lindsey. Anna died in Fayette County, Indiana in 1844. Her last will and testament, which had been written on 8 October 1844, was subsequently submitted for probate before the Fayette County Court on 19 November 1844.<sup>19</sup>

The children listed below have all been identified through correspondence and other documents and records as being John and Anna's.

#### 4. Sarah "Sally" Lindsey.

Sarah Lindsey (also written Lindsay, Linsay, and Linsey), the daughter of David and Catherine Lindsey, was born in Frederick County, Virginia. <sup>1,5</sup> She was later married in Greenbrier County, Virginia (now part of West Virginia) to a man named William Lockridge (also written Loughridge) on 10 April 1778. <sup>11,12</sup> William, who is believed to have been born in about 1748 in Augusta County, Virginia, was the son of William Lockridge and Agnes Gwinn. <sup>32</sup>

Prior to 1790, Sarah and William moved to Kentucky, where they settled in Nicholas County. <sup>33</sup> Both Sarah and William may have possibly died in Nicholas County.

#### 5. Jane Lindsey.

Jane Lindsey (also written Jean Lindsay, Linsay, and Linsey), the daughter of David and Catherine Lindsey, was born in Frederick County, Virginia. <sup>1,5</sup> She was shown in the "Virginia Heads of Families, Greenbrier County, 1783-1786," along with her mother, Catherine, and brother, John. <sup>6</sup> She was also found in the Mathews Trading Post ledger under the years, 1772 and 1774. <sup>5</sup> No additional information has been found concerning this individual.

## 6. **Rebecca Lindsey.**

Rebecca Lindsey (also written Linsay, Linsey, and Lindsey), the daughter of David and Catherine Lindsey, was born in Frederick County, Virginia. <sup>1,5</sup> She was shown in the Mathews Trading Post ledger under the year 1773 as "Miss Rebecka Lindsey." <sup>5</sup> Rebecca was also listed in the Greenbrier County Court records as a defendant in a lawsuit, along with her brother, John, and sister, Sarah, in May of 1784. <sup>11</sup> No additional information has been found concerning this individual.

### GENERATION THREE

#### 7. Elizabeth Lindsey.

Elizabeth Lindsey (also written Lindsay), the daughter of John Lindsey and Anna Christy, was born on 10 May 1778 in Greenbrier County, Virginia (now part of West Virginia).<sup>9</sup> She was later married in Scott County, Kentucky to a man named Henry Dicken on 24 April 1800.<sup>9</sup> Henry, who had been born on 23 March 1775 in Culpeper County, Virginia, was the son of Richard Dicken and Martha Lewis.<sup>9,34,35</sup>

Elizabeth subsequently died on 31 July 1842 in Fayette County, Indiana, while Henry died on 11 April 1857 in Wabash County, Indiana.<sup>9,34</sup> Henry was subsequently buried in the Daniels Cemetery at Servia in Wabash County, Indiana.<sup>34</sup>

#### 8. Robert "Robin" Lindsey.

Robert Lindsey (also written Lindsay), the son of John Lindsey and Anna Christy, was born in Greenbrier County, Virginia (now part of West Virginia). <sup>9</sup> Although the name of Robert's wife has not been determined, he is believed to have been married in about 1806/1807 in Scott County, Kentucky. <sup>9</sup>

Robert and his brother, John, purchased land from Spencer Stone and their mother, Anna (Christy) Lindsey Stone, on 28 May 1818. <sup>42</sup> Robert was later enumerated on the 1820 census of Scott County, Kentucky. <sup>43</sup> The last document in which our Robert Lindsey was found, was a mortgage between Robert and Mr. B. S. Chambers. <sup>42</sup> This mortgage was for \$600 and dated 20 December 1826. <sup>42</sup>

9. **Mary "Polly" Lindsey.**

Mary Lindsey (also written Lindsay), the daughter of John Lindsey and Anna Christy, was born in Greenbrier County, Virginia (now part of West Virginia). <sup>9</sup> She was later married to a man named Titsworth. <sup>9</sup> No additional information has been found concerning this couple.

10. **Rebecca Lindsey.**

Rebecca Lindsey (also written Lindsay), the daughter of John Lindsey and Anna Christy, was calculated to have been born in 1784 in Greenbrier County, Virginia (now part of West Virginia). <sup>9,22,23</sup> She was residing with her niece, Ann Lindsey Fox, at the time of her death. <sup>44</sup> Rebecca apparently remained single throughout her life and died without issue on 15 April 1854 in Trimble County, Kentucky. <sup>22,23</sup> Her death record indicates that she was Seventy years of age, the daughter of John and Ann Lindsey, and that she was born in Greenbrier County, Virginia (now within West Virginia). <sup>23</sup>

11. **Sarah "Sally" Lindsey.**

Sarah Lindsey (also written Lindsay), the daughter of John Lindsey and Anna Christy, was probably born in Greenbrier County, Virginia (now part of West Virginia). <sup>9</sup> She was later married to a man named Mitchell. <sup>9</sup> No additional information has been found concerning this couple.

## 12. Frances Lindsey.

Frances Lindsey (also written Lindsay), the daughter of John Lindsey and Anna Christy, was calculated from his tombstone to have been born on 12 February 1787 in Scott County, Kentucky.<sup>24</sup> Frances was apparently married twice during her life. She married first to a man named James Bryant in Kentucky.<sup>9</sup> No issue are known from Frances Lindsey's first marriage to James.

Sometime after her first husband passed away, Frances married for a second time to a man named John Embree (also written Embry) on 24 May 1820 in Lincoln County, Kentucky.<sup>24</sup> John, who is believed to have been born in Orange County, Virginia, was the son of John Embree and Frances "Fanny" Burris.<sup>47</sup> This was John's second marriage as he had previously been married on 5 November 1792 to a woman named Susannah Frances Prewitt in Mercer County, Kentucky.<sup>48</sup>

Frances and John later moved to Indiana, where they were found residing as late as 1848 according to a deed record.<sup>49</sup> Because they were not found on the 1850 census of Wayne County, Indiana, however, they probably moved prior to that date to Missouri, where they settled in Howard County.<sup>50</sup> John Embree died in Howard County, Missouri during the month of September 1852.<sup>50</sup> After John died, Frances apparently moved back to Wayne County, Indiana, where she died on 18 December 1862.<sup>24</sup> She was subsequently buried in the King Cemetery at Richmond in Wayne County, Indiana.<sup>24</sup> No issue are known from Frances' second marriage either.

## 13. Agnes Lindsey.

Agnes Lindsey (also written Lindsay), the daughter of John Lindsey and Anna Christy, was probably born in Scott County, Kentucky.<sup>9</sup> No additional information has been found concerning this individual.

## 14. Catherine Houston Lindsey. \*

Catherine Lindsey (also written Lindsay), the daughter of John Lindsey and Anna Christy, was born in Scott County, Kentucky on 17 September 1795.<sup>9,26</sup> She was later married in Scott County, Kentucky to a man named Elias Barbee Stone.<sup>9,26</sup> Although no record of their marriage has been found to date, based upon the date of birth of the eldest child, it is thought to have taken place in about 1812/1813. Elias, who had been born in Lincoln County, Kentucky on 20 February 1790, was the son of Spencer Stone and Nancy "Sally" Smith.<sup>9</sup>

Although Elias and Catherine were married in Scott County, Kentucky, when the 1820 census was taken they were found residing in Lincoln County, Kentucky.<sup>51</sup>

Two years later, however, Elias and Catherine moved to Indiana, where they resided first in Fayette County, but later moved into Wabash County.<sup>52,53,54,55</sup> Elias Stone, who had been a miller and farmer throughout his life, died on 27 July 1870 in Wabash County, Indianan.

<sup>9,26</sup> Catherine, on the other hand, died at the home of her nephew, Hiram Lindsey, in Liberty Township in Wabash County on 21 August 1873.<sup>9,26</sup> Both Elias and Catherine were subsequently buried in the Boundary Line Church Cemetery near La Fontaine in Wabash County.<sup>9,26</sup> This cemetery, which was situated upon land that Elias had acquired for such a purpose, was originally established as a private burying ground in 1863. Its use was later opened to the general public, however.

### 15. John Valentine "Jack" Lindsey.

John "Jack" Lindsey (also written Lindsay), the son of John Lindsey and Anna Christy, was born in Scott County, Kentucky on 5 September 1797.<sup>9</sup> He was later married to a woman named Catherine Miller on 21 August 1827 in Lincoln County, Kentucky.<sup>9,25</sup> Catherine had been born in Kentucky on 14 September 1809.<sup>9</sup>

Sometime prior to when the 1830 census was take, John and Catherine Lindsey moved north into the state of Indiana, where they settled in Fayette County.<sup>52</sup> John resided in Fairview Township in Fayette County until his death in 1861.<sup>9</sup>

#### 16. Jane Lindsey.

Jane Lindsey (also written Lindsay), the daughter of John Lindsey and Anna Christy, is thought to have been born in about 1799 in Scott County, Kentucky.<sup>9</sup> She was later married on 28 October 1824 in Lincoln County, Kentucky to a man named Cuthbert Burton.<sup>25</sup> Cuthbert, who was calculated to have been born in 1769 in Virginia, was the son of Charles Burton and Mary Hunt.<sup>65</sup> This was Cuthbert's second marriage, as he had previously been married to a woman named Martha Willis.<sup>65</sup>

Shortly after their marriage, Jane and Cuthbert moved to Allen County, Kentucky, where Jane is believed to have subsequently died. Jane was last found on the 1840 census of Allen County, Kentucky.<sup>27</sup> Cuthbert, on the other hand, died in Allen County in 1864.<sup>65</sup> His will, which had been written on 17 May 1855, was later probated during the July 1864 term of the Allen County Court.<sup>65</sup> Although Cuthbert and his first wife, Martha, are known to have had a large family, no issue are known from Cuthbert's marriage to Jane.<sup>65</sup>

#### 17. Permelia Lindsey.

Permelia Lindsey (also written Lindsay), the daughter of John Lindsey and Anna Christy, is thought to have been born in about 1801 in Scott County, Kentucky.<sup>9</sup> She was later married on 5 December 1818 in Lincoln County, Kentucky to a man named William R. Feland.<sup>28</sup> William, who had been born in about 1795 in Lincoln County, Kentucky, was the son of James Feland and Isabella Robinson.<sup>66,67</sup>

After their marriage, Permelia and William resided on a farm along the Hanging Fork tributary of the Dix River in Lincoln County. William Feland is believed to have died in about 1836 in Lincoln County, Kentucky.<sup>68</sup> This is based upon the will of James Feland, which was dated 2 March 1837, in which he mentions "William Feland of Lincoln County, Kentucky, lately deceased."<sup>68</sup> Whatever became of Permelia is not known.

The offspring listed below as (male) or (female) were abstracted from available pre-1850 census records. These are all believed to be William and Permelia's children, but their identities have not been determined as yet.

#### 18. **Martha "Patsy" Lindsey.**

Martha Lindsey (also written Lindsay), the daughter of John Lindsey and Anna Christy, was calculated to have been born in 1803 in Scott County, Kentucky.<sup>29</sup> She was later married on 21 December 1824 in Lincoln County, Kentucky to a man named Ludwell Duncan.<sup>28</sup>

Several years after their marriage, Martha and Ludwell moved to Oldham County, Kentucky, where they are residing on the 1830 census.<sup>70</sup> Ludwell subsequently died in Oldham County in 1836.<sup>70,71</sup> His will, which was written on 29 August 1836, was submitted for probate before the Oldham County Court on 17 October 1836.<sup>70,71</sup>

After her first husband passed away, Martha married for a second time to a man named

Jesse Sage on 11 April 1838 in Oldham County.<sup>29,30</sup> Jesse, who was a brick maker by trade, was calculated to have been born in Kentucky in 1815.<sup>29</sup> He was the son of Alexander Sage and Lucy Bennett. Jesse appears to have died in Oldham County sometime prior to 1860, as he does not show up on the census enumeration for that year.<sup>31</sup> Martha was last found on the 1860 census of Oldham County.<sup>31</sup>
