Last Will and Testament of Howard Cash

In the name of God Amen! I, Howard Cash, of Amherst County, being sick and weak of body but of sound and perfect state of mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed to all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament, Imprimis I lend to my beloved wife Ruth eight negroes during her nateral life, namely Joseph, Cate, James, Charles, Sall, Dinah, Dick and Davis. Item, I lend to my beloved wife during her life the land and plantation whereon I live (which said land and negroes I lend to my said wife during widowhood and natural life)

Item, I give to my son Joel one hundred acres of land joining the land on which he lives & two negroes named Fil & Dick a boy which said boy Dick I give to my grandson Howard, the son of Joel Cash after the death of my said son Joel to him and his heirs forever, Item I give to my daughter Mary Lively a negro wench named Sarah, Item I give to my Son ~ Benjamin four hundred acres of land adjacent to land that is at present the property of Capt. Aaron Higginbotham, and the land whereon I live, & also a negro fellow named James, whom I purchased of W. Thomas Mitchell, to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I lend to my daughter Rosanna a negro wench named Fillis during her life and after her decease to my grandson, Micajah (her and her ~ Increase to him and his heirs forever)

Item I lend to my daughter Ann Powell a young negro wench named Peg during her life and after her decease to the heirs of her body and if she dies without heirs my will and desire is that the said negro & her increase may decend to the children of my daughter Rosanna,

Item, I give to my son Robert two hundred and forty acres of land lying between the land whereon I live and Stephen Cashes land, moreover I give and devise to my son Robert the four hundred acres of land which I have left to my wife after her Decease, & a negro fellow named John to him and his heirs forever, and also a bed and furniture & two cows, Item I give to my daughter Maryann a negro boy named Ralph, & also a Bed and furniture, & a cow & calf. Item, I give to my daughter Ruth a negro girl named Nell and (her increases) (to her & her heirs forever) and also a Bed and furniture and a cow and calf,

Item, my will and desire is that my daughter Elizabeth Nuckles may have thirty pounds to be Raised out of my Estate which I have willed to my wife, to be paid in ten years, by an order for three pounds a year upon some merchant as soon it it becomes due.

Item, I give to my son Stephen five shillings & I give to my daughter Sarah Mause five shillings. Item, my will and desire is that after the decease of my beloved wife Ruth that two negroes namely James and Charles may decend to my son Joel, and Joseph and Cate to my Son Benjamin & two negroes namely Sall and Davis to my Son Robert (to him and his heirs forever)

Item, my will and desire is that after the decease of myself and my wife the increase of Sal if any may be Equally devided between my daughters Maryann and Ruth & if either of my --- Daughters should depart this life unmarried or before they arrive at lawful age the sirvivors of them should possess the issue of the negro wench, Item, my will and desire is that the Residue of my

Estate which I haven't already devised may go to my beloved wife during her life and after her decease to be devided between my three sons Joel, Benjamin, & Robert.

Item, I do not desire that my estate may be appraised and I appoint my beloved wife executrix and my sons Joel, Benjamin and Robert executors of this my last will and Testament, and I do hereby Utterly Revoke and Disanul all former wills and ordain this my last will and Testament, In witness I have hereunto set my hand and seal, this

twenty eighth day of February anno Domini 1772

In a court held for Amherst County at the court house the sixth day of October 1772 This last will and Testament of Howard Cash deceased was presented in Court by Ruth Cash, Joel Cash, Benjamin Cash and Robert Cash, the executors herein named ----- whereupon the same was proved (?) by the oaths of David Crawford and Roderick McCulloch gent who deposed that there were no interlineations in the said will except in the bequest to Ruth Cash in the twenty second line (to wit) her increase) at the time of the said decedents executing the said will; Edmund Wilcox also deposes that at the request of the said the other Interlineations were made and approved of by the said decedent after being read to him in the presence of the said Edmund Wilcox, and thereupon the said will is ordered to be recorded and on the motion of the said executors who made oath according to law, certificate is granted them for obtaining probate thereof in due form, giving security, on which they with Richard Powell and Gabriel Penn their securities entered into and acknowledged Bond in the Penalty of two thousand pounds with the conditions required by law.

The condition of this obligation is such that if the above bound Ruth, Joel, Benjamin and Robert Cash executors of the last will and Testament of Howard Cash deceased do make or cause to be made a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said deceased which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Ruth, Joel, Benjamin and Robert Cash or to the hands and possession of any other person or persons for them and the same so made do exhibit into the county court of Amherst at such time as they shall be thereunto required by the same court and same goods chattels and credits of the said deceased which at any time after shall come to the hands and possession or knowledge of the said Ruth, Joel, Benjamin and Robert Cash or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for this the last will and truly administer according to the law and futher do make a just and true account of the actings and doings therein when thereto required by this said court and also shall will and duly pay and deliver all the legacies contained and specified in the said testament as far as the goods chattles and credits will hereunto extend and the law shall charge then this obligation to be void and of none effect or else to remain in full and virtue. her Ruth X Cash mark

Born in Amherst County- married Polly Nuckles 11/30/1796. It is evident that Jesse did not remain in Amherst County, as we hear no more of him in that county after the register of the marriage. By referring back to William Bibb, brother of Jesse, we find him in South Carolina at the head of a group of the Bibb family. There is some rather clear evidence that Jesse Bibb went with his brother William, to South Carolina and from there into Mississippi where he settled near Natches. In 1807 William Harper died leaving an estate in which Jesse Bibb shared. In 1808 we find Jesse Bibb giving power of attorney to Thomas Bibb then living in South Carolina, said document empowering Thomas Bibb to look after his interest in the estate of William Harper. This Thomas Bibb was a son of William Bibb who came from Amherst County VA and in some way this Jesse Bibb was willed a part in the estate of William Harper, which estate Thomas Bibb seems to have administered on. Thomas perhaps married Miss Harper, dau of William Harper. His eldest son Henry Harper became a judge in Arkansas later on.

We have no record of any children of Jesse and Polly Bibb, though most likely there were sons and daughters of this couple.

Of these four sons, William, Jeremiah, and James chose to use the surname NICHOLS, while their brother Robert used the surname NUCKLES. Robert NICHOLS/NUCKLES (the father) is found with both surnames in court documents in Amherst County VA, whereas he is listed as NICHOLS in his will in 1826 in Mercer County KY. I put this down to illiteracy (both on the part of Robert and those who wrote the documents). There is a series of land transfers in Amherst County VA, in which Robert and his wife Fanny (Whitten) buy out the inheritance of her sisters (the other daughters of Jeremiah WHITTEN, in which Robert is called NUCKLES. However, his two marriage records in Amherst County list him as NICHOLS. I believe that this Robert NICHOLS/NUCKLES is a grandson of Howard CASH of Amherst County VA per Howard Cash's 1773 will in that county, in which he mentions a daughter Elizabeth NICKLAS.

In the name of God Amen. I Robert Nichols of the county of Mercer and ste of Kentucky finding my days are drawing to a close but in my perfect senses, do make this my last will and Testament in manner following. I desire that all my first debts be paid for the purpose subject my whole Estate both real and personal I give & bequeath to my wife Fanny Nicles my negro woman Susanah and one negroe named Chips & sixty acres of land including my Dwelling house and other necessary buildings sensible thereto--the land to be laid off suitable so as to give her timber sufficient to support the place. I give her two horses such as she may make choice of with as much of every kind of all my other stock as she may see proper to keep, as much household & kitchen furniture & farming utensils as she wishes to keep during her natural life.. I Devise to my son William Nichols on negroe boy named John & seventy acres of land including the place where he now lives to be laid off in a manner most suitable so as not to interfere with the other land I give to my other sons. I devise to my son Jeremiah Nichols one negroe boy named Powell, seventy-six acres of land including the place he settled & formerly lived on. I devise to my son Robert Nichols one negroe boy named Dick & seventy-six acres of land including the place he now lives on. I devise to my son James Nichols one negroe girl named Sally and sixty-two acres of land adjoining his mother's land & at my wife decease he is to have the land I give to her. I desire that my wife shall keep possession of James's land and negroe until he is twenty-one years of age, unless he gets married before. I further desire that my son James shall have a horse, saddle & Bridle as near the value of that I gave my other sons as can be made so soon as he shall need them, allso one cow & calf, two sheep, one sow & pigs, two fat hogs equal to those given to my other sons, also one bed & furniture. I desire that the balance of my personal property shall be sold & equally divided amongst my children after so much shall be taken therefrom as will be sufficient to pay for schooling James one year. I do hereby appoint my beloved wife Fanny Nichols and my son William Nichols executors of this my will with joint & separate powers for carrying the same into effect in witness whereof I hereunto set my hand & seal this 14th day of Feby one thousand eight hundred twenty-six.

Vermillion Co, IN, Dec 9, 1829; he removed with his parents in 1838 to Edgar Co, before the organization of the township of Ross, where he engaged with his father in farming until 18 years of age, when he went to Iowa and worked upon a farm one year; then to Mississippi for one winter; returning to Edgar Co, ILL; he worked as a farm laborer about two years when at the age of 21 he married and worked upon a farm until March 1865, when he enlisted as private in the 28th ILL and went forward to battle for the Union; he was sent to Mobile, from there to Texas, when on account of sickness he was sent to New Orleans and service with his regiment in the spring of 1866, when he again engaged in farming. He owns 80 acres, valued at about \$35 per acre. He married in 1851 to Elizabeth Peirce; she was born in Indiana; one child now living from that Union, Caroline; Mrs N died Feb 27 1854. His marriage with Margaret E Clark was celebrated Nov 8 1855; they are the parents of eight children now living- Mary E, Dorinda E, Charles, Edgar, William H, Albert, Nancy J, James H

William NUCKLES- There is nothing in the world more pleasant to contemplate than a well-spent life- the career of a man who has done good as he has had opportunity and who presents an example worthy of emulation. These thoughts involuntarily arise in reviewing the career of Mr Nuckles, a man scarcely having an enemy in the world and who is well spoken of by the people of his community. He is one of the pioneer settlers of this county, coming within its limits when it had been invaded by comparatively few white men and the greater portion of its land lay in its primitive condition. He came hither without resources other than his own resolute will and the habits of industry which had been taught to him from his childhood, but these proved the qualities most needed and which have enabled him to secure a good homestead and spend his later years in comparative ease. His farm comprises 160 acres of well-cultivated land on section 16, where Mr Nuckles has effected good improvements and added measurably to the taxable property of his township. Our subject is the offspring of an old New England family and the son of Robert Nuckles, a native of Virginia who, when a young man, emigrated to Mercer County Kentucky, where he was married. Later he removed to Vermillion County Indiana where he purchased land and sojourned a few years, then sold out and came to this county. Here he became the owner of land in Ross township, where he opened up a farm and was one of the first settlers in his neighborhood. Later he removed to a point on the State road north of Chrisman, where in connection with farming he opened his home to travelers and for several years officiated as "mine host". Finally selling out he removed to Ridge Farm and established a grocery business in connection with a meat market, which he conducted until once more selling out and removing to the vicinity of Urbana. In that vicinity he purchased another farm upon which he remained until his death, several years ago. He was for many years a member of the Presbyterian Church and prior to the war affiliated with the Democratic party. During the conflict between the North and the South, he considered that he had reason to change his political views and wheeled over into the Republican ranks. Mrs Rachel (Martin) Nuckles, the mother of our subject was a native of Rhode Island and died in Ross Township, this county, prior to the decease of her husband. They were the parents of eight children- Fanny, deceased; Jefferson, now a resident of Kansas; Elijah, deceased; William, the subject of this notice; John, living in Oregon; Rhoda, Mrs Loop of Metcalf; Rachel, living in Ridge Farm, this state; and James, a resident of Missouri. Jefferson and Elijah served as Union soldiers during the late Civil War. William, our subject was born in Montezuma, Vermillion County, Ind, Dec 9, 1829, and lived there with his parents until a lad of ten years. He then came with them to this county and was reared to manhood in Ross township. He remembers the time when wild game was plentiful and when he traveled with a sack of grain on his horses' back. He remained under the home roof until a youth of nineteen years, then starting out for himself, worked by the month for several years. IN 1849, our subject crossed the Mississippi into Jackson County Iowa, making the journey by team and purchased a claim. This subsequently he traded for a horse and resumed his labors of farming for other parties one year, then went south into Mississippi. He chopped wood there during one winter and in the spring came up the river prepared to establish a home of his own. On the 7th of Feb 1850, he was married in Ross township to Miss Elizabeth Pierce; this lady was born in Vermillion County Ind and only survived her marriage but a brief time; dying in 1853. Of this union there were born two children- Caroline who is now the wife of Mr Brownfield of Missouri and Lucretia who died when about fourteen years old. From this time on until 1859 Mr Nuckles engaged in farming on rented land in this township, but that year purchased his present farm which was then a tract of school land without any improvements. In the meantime, he had been married again. Nov 8, 1855 in Prairie township to Miss Elizabeth, daughter of Edmund Clark, a native of Vermont. Mr Clark left the Green Mountain State at an early day, emigrating to Fleming County Kentucky, where he sojourned until 1831. That year, coming to Illinois, he entered a tract of land in Prairie township, this county, upon which he labored very successfully and became well-to-do and the owner of a large extent of land. He had married Miss Nancy Graves a native of Virginia

and whose father emigrated to Kentucky, where he engaged in farming and met his death at the hand of Murrell's gang, who at the time were committing many acts of violence in that region. Mrs Nuckles father died in Prarie township, and the mother some years after in the same place. She was a woman of many estimable qualities and a member of the Baptist Church. Her family consisted of eight children- Alex, deceased; Mary, a resident of Oregon; Marinda, in Kentucky; Susan living in Edgar Co, ILL; Elizabeth, Mrs Nuckles; Emily, deceased; James, a resident of Chrisman and Lucy, residing in Prarie township. Mrs Nuckles was born in Fleming County Kentucky April 4, 1827 and was four years old when her parents came to this state. She remained under the home roof until her marriage and by her union with our subject has become the mother of nine children. The eldest, a daughter Mary is the wife of H Wood, a well-to-do farmer of Ross Township; Dorinda is at home with her parents; Charles married Miss Laura Womack and is farming in Bruelett twonship; Edgar married Miss Jennie Blackburn and is engaged in hop-raising in Oregon; John died when a child; William is farming in Ross township; Albert , Nannie and James H remain under the parental roof. ON the 7th of March 1865 Mr Nuckles laid aside his personal interests in roder to assist in the preservation of the Union. Enlisting in Company G, 28th Illinois Infantry, he was mustered into service at Danville, soon after which the regiment was sent south to Mobile. Next they were ordered to Ft Balkely and from there into Texas. At Brady's Island, our subject was taken ill and confined in the hospital for some time. Upon his recovery he was assigned to the duty of a nurse in the hospital at Sedgwick, LA and was thus occupied until being mustered out at Springfield, Ill. He received his honorable discharge in April 1866. Upon his return from the army, Mr Nuckles resumed in earnest the cultivation of his land and effecting the much-needed imporvements around his homestead. He is a warm advocate of temperence and some since time allied himself with the Prohibition Party. Both he and his excellent wife are active members of the Methodist Episcopal Church at Mt Olive and Mr Nuckles contributed liberally toward the erection of a church office. He has officiated as Steward and Trustee, also as Class-Leader and for some time has been Superintendent of the Sunday School. Although his life has been comparatively uneventful, he has ever maintained that uniform regard to duty and principle which have had a sensible influence upon those around him. His land is largely devoted to the raising of grain and he is especially interested in god horses, of which he owns about fifteen head, mostly draft animals. He uses two temas in his farm operations

Fred was born 19 Sep 1918 in Whitetail, Daniels County, MT. This is from my mother's copy of their marriage license. He died 12 Nov 1996 in Happy Camp, Del Norte County, CA. He was cremated and, last I knew, his urn was buried on his property in Happy Camp. They had three children together, who are still living; hence, I will not name them here. Two males and one female. They were married 11 Jun 1939 in Central Lake, Antrim County, MI by their marriage license. They divorced 2 Dec 1946 in Petosky, Emmet County, MI.
