3. ADAM<sup>2</sup> DE STANLEIGH (*LYDULPH (LIULF)*<sup>1</sup> DE ALDITHLEY) was born 1125 in Staffordshire, England, and died 1200 in Staffordshire, England.

Notes for ADAM DE STANLEIGH:

Adam de Stanleigh was born circa 1125, and was the brother (or brother in law) of Lydulph de Aldithley, who was born circa 1115. They were both thanes (the early equivalent to knights) and they held the freehold tenancies of their respective estates in Staffordshire from the Norman De Verdun family by socage, i.e. military service, which required them to defend their Overlord and his possessions. Lydulph held Aldithley and Balterley, whereas Adam held Talk on the Hill. It is unlikely that either held a surname during their actual lifetime. Surnames were introduced into England by the Normans, but they were still rare at the time of the Great Survey in 1086, when only the more important barons used them. These surnames were generally derived from their Normandy estates. The minor barons and knightly families began adopting surnames during the 12th century and these were generally derived from their new English estates.

4. ADAM<sup>3</sup> DE ALDITHLEY (*LYDULPH FITZ LIULF*<sup>2</sup>, *LYDULPH (LIULF)*<sup>1</sup>) was born 1135 in Staffordshire, England, and died 1211 in Staffordshire, England. He married EMMA.

Notes for ADAM DE ALDITHLEY:

He appears to have been the first member of his family to have used the surname 'de Aldithley' in official documents, when in 1155 and again in 1160 he witnessed Charters of his Overlord, Bertram de Verdun. His two brothers, Liulf and Roger, still continued to sign themselves as 'Liulf fitz Liulf' and 'Roger fitz Liulf' respectively, when they witnessed Charters in 1160-1202.

In 1184 and 1185, Adam de Aldithley succeeded Bertram de Verdun as Sheriff of Warwickshire and Leicestershire.

When Bertram de Verdun departed for the Crusades in 1190 with Richard I, as special evidence of his favor, granted the Manor of Stanleigh to Adam de Aldithley.

During the latter part of his life, Adam decided to rearrange his estates by granting to his cousin, William (the son of his uncle, Adam de Stanleigh), all the Manor of Stanleigh and half of the Manor of Balterley in exchange for his cousin's tenancy of the Manor on Talk of the Hill. Thus it was that the two separate lines began, with the Audleys at Aldithley and the Stanleys at Stanleigh.

Notes for WILLIAM DE STANLEIGH:

The eldest son, succeeded to his father's Manor of Talk on the Hill, and to the manor of Bagnall, near Leek, which had been passed to his father by Adam de Aldithley. (Talk on the Hill was one of three manors held by Gamel, a Saxon Thane at the time of the Domesday Book of 1086.)

After the death of his father, his cousin, Adam de Aldithley, wished to rearrange his estates by exchanging his Manor of Stanleigh (which was near William's Manor of Bagnall), and half of the Manor of Balterley, for William's Manor on Talk on the Hill, (which adjoined Adam's Manor of Aldithley). The Manors concerned were all held from the De Verduns, and their exchange had to have the Overlord's consent. Since Stanleigh was an additional tenancy held by special favor, Adam de Aldithley proposed that if that Manor could not be warranted, he and his heirs would give as much in value to William and his heirs. Stanleigh would be held by William from Adam de Aldithley for a yearly rent of 12 pence.

A Charter was arranged and the Manor of Stanleigh passed to William. He now being in possession, he adopted the surname "de Stanleigh" and thus became the ancestor of the House of Stanley. He used the surname when he witnessed the Charter in 1203 as "William de Stanle". Adam de Aldithley and William de Stanleigh were the first members of their respective families to use surnames in official documents. It is highly unlikely that their respective fathers, Lydulph de Aldithley and Adam de Stanleigh, possessed surnames during their actual lifetimes.

Notes for JOHN DE STANLEIGH:

He took Holy Orders and rose to the distinction of Magister. Nothing is known of his early clerical career, but between 1265 and 1267, he was presented to the important and valuable living of Astbury in Cheshire, by the Abbot of Chester. He was said to have been a special friend of Simon, the Abbot of St. Werburgh, and he occurs frequently in the Abbey Records until his death in 1288.

It was John who conducted the marriage of his nephew William to Joan de Bamville in 1282 at Astbury Church.

Notes for WILLIAM DE STANLEIGH:

The marriage of William to Joan has become one of Cheshire's legends. The story relates that Sir Phillip and his wife Lettice, were being entertained at a banquet given at Stourton in Cheshire. A marriage had been arranged for Joan (who was her father's heir) with the son of his wife (who was Joan's stepmother). She had no liking for that marriage, and while the festivities were at their height, she slipped out of the Hall to where William de Stanleigh was waiting with saddled horses. Together they galloped to Astbury where they were wed in the Church by William's uncle, John de Stanleigh, William saying: "Joan, I plight thee my troth to take and hold thee as my lawful wife until my life's end," and she replying, "I, Joan, take thee William, as my lawful husband."

In 1284, on the death of his wife's father, William de Stanleigh acquired the hereditary office of Master Forester of Wirral together with the Manor of Stourton and the bailiwick of Wirral.

In 1306 and 1307, he is mentioned as Hereditary Forester of Wirral. In the year 1316, by grant of Edward II, he assumed the Armorial Bearings, viz. 'Arg, on a bend asure, three Stags Head, cabossed, Or', in place of those previously borne by his ancestors. These arms are carried by his descendants to this day.

Notes for WILLIAM DE STANLEIGH:

He was the probable builder of Stourton Hall.

On 10 January 1376, William signed an agreement with William de Hooton, relating to the marriage of his elder son, William (then eight years old) to William de Hooton's only child and heiress, Margery. The actual marriage took place ten years later in 1386, and when his father-in-law died on 14 September 1396, William (junior) acquired the Manor of Hooton in right of his wife and subsequently became the founder of the Stanleys of Hooton.

Notes for SIR JOHN DE STANLEY:

As a young man, Sir John was an ardent soldier, when travels and martial exploits took him all over Europe. He had an exceptional military record, and distinguished himself in tournaments and single combat; such was his fame that knights travelled long journeys just to challenge him.

Sir John was prominent in Court, and he was given the Controllorship of the Wardrobe which brought with it the responsibility for the military organization of the Chamber of Knights and the Bearers of the White Hart Badge.

In 1399, when Henry, Duke of Lancaster, revolted against the King, Sir John was among the first to join him and was rewarded with the Manors of Mold and Hope in Flintshire, large possessions in Cheshire and the Lieutenancy of Ireland.

In 1403, in the rebellion of Owain Glendower, Sir John was recalled from Ireland, and fought brilliantly for Henry IV at Shrewsbury, for which service he was rewarded by the King with several of the forfeited estates of the Earl of Northumberland's followers, including certain lands of his nephew, Sir William Stanley of Hooton, who, together with his son had participated in the rebellion.

In the same year, Sir John was appointed Steward of the Household of Henry, Prince of Wales; and granted for life the office of Steward of Macclefield and Surveyor of the Forest thereof. He was also made Governor of Chester and granted the avowson of Chester Cathedral.

In 1404, as the King's Knight and Steward of the Household, he was granted a pardon of all his debts and in 1405 the King made him a Knight of the Garter.

On April 6, 1406, the King granted him the important Lordship of the Isle of Man which had been forfeited by the Earl of Northumberland for his treason. It was to be held by Sir John for himself and his heirs and their successors with all royalties and franchises, together with the patronage of the Bishopric, to be held by leige homage for the service of two falcons, payable to the King at his coronation.

In February 1406, Sir John Stanley was granted free warren of the Manors of Lathom and Knowsley in his wife's right. (The Manor of Knowsley is still held by his descendant, the Earl of Derby, while the Manor of Lathom remained in the Stanley family until 1717, when it was sold by the daughter of William Stanley, 9th Earl of Derby.) It was about this time that Sir John Stanley adopted the crest of an eagle and child which has been used by his descendants ever since.

In 1409, Sir John was granted the office of Constable of Windsor Castle for life. On June 8, 1413, he was appointed Lieutenant of Ireland for six years.

On 10 January 1376, when William was only eight years old, his marriage to Margery, daughter and heiress of Sir William Hooton of Hooton, Cheshire was arranged by his father and the father of the bride. The actual ceremony took place ten years later, in 1386. When his father-in-law died on 14 September 1396, William acquired the Manor in right of his wife.

Notes for SIR JOHN STANLEY:

In November 1414, he was elected Knight of the Shire and a Justice of Chester. He served in the French Wars, being part of a considerable contingent from Lancashire which accompanied Henry V in the campaign which ended at Agincourt in 1415.

His father, the first ruler of the Stanley line, never visited the Isle of Man. Sir John, however, took a keen interest in his kingdom, visiting it on several occasions, with beneficial results for the island. He began the first systematic record of the history of Man, and he introduced written laws for the first time, drawing up a sort of Magna Carta defining the rights and duties of King, Church and People. Sir John also substituted trial by jury for trial by combat.

In 1428, Sir John was made Constable of Caernarvon Castle and Sheriff of Aglesey in 1439, when he secured peace in Wales and loyalty to the English King.

Notes for THOMAS STANLEY:

High Sheriff of Staffordshire from 1433 to 1438 and King's Squire in 1438. In 1441 he was a Justice of the Peace and Privy Councillor for 1453-1454.

He was married first to Maude de Arderne. On this marriage Sir Thomas became possessed of the estates of Elford, Haselour, Clifton Campville and Pipe Ridware in Staffordshire; Camplen super Wild in Gloucestershire; Sibbertoft in Northamptonshire; and Alford, Nether Alderley and Echells (in the Parish of Northended) in Cheshire.

In 1433, he founded a chantry at Elford Church, where there is a window to his memory.

On January 20, 1456, Sir Thomas was created Baron Stanley by special writ and was made a Knight of the Garter, and Chamberlain to Henry VI. Ambassador to Scotland.

Sir Thomas Stanley, second Lord Stanley, was created 1st Earl of Derby by Henry VII after his support during the Battle of Bosworth in 1485 which secured Henry's throne.

Thomas first married Eleanor Neville, sister of Richard Earl of Warwick, (their eldest son George, Lord Strange, who was poisoned at a banquet in Derby House, London, in 1497, also had a son named Thomas, who became the next Earl in 1504). His second marriage was to (the previously twice married) Margaret Beaufort, daughter and heiress of John, Duke of Somerset and widow (by her first marriage) of Edmund Tudor, Earl of Richmond and thereby becoming the mother of Henry VII.

In 1495 Henry VII visited Knowsley, whilst there he bestowed the Earldom of Derby on Thomas. He also received estates in the North forfeited by the Yorkists who had remained loyal to Richard III. These comprised the Hundred of West Derby plus over 70 other properties. The 1st Earl died on 29th July 1504 and was buried at Burscough.

THOMAS II. AFTERWARDS THE FIRST EARL OF DERBY, ELDEST SON OF THOMAS I., BARON STANLEY, BY HIS WIFE JOAN, ONLY DAUGHTER AND HEIRESS OF SIR ROBERT GOUSHILL, succeeded his father in 1460. He was

summoned to Parliament in the first year of Edward IV. (1461), and in 1472 he was made Judge of Chester. In the Civil war he did good service for the Yorkist cause, his most conspicuous feat being the taking of Berwick by assault. During the greater part of his reign he was steward of the Royal Household, and, having been one of Edward's most devoted adherents, he naturally transferred his allegiance to his son Edward the fifth. When Edward the fourth died, Richard Duke of Gloucester, who was plotting to supplant his nephew on the throne, saw that Stanley would be one of the chief obstacles in his way, and so he contrived to get rid of him by having him arrested on a charge of treason.

When, however, he had succeeded in ascending the throne, he decided that his best policy would be, if possible, to purchase Lord Stanley's allegiance, which he endeavoured to accomplish by making him Constable of England for life and conferring upon him the Order of the Garter. It is well known that this scheme failed and that Lord Stanley largely contributed to Richmond's success at the battle of Bosworth field, after which he is said to have placed the dead Richard's crown on his head,\* and to have proclaimed him king as Henry VII. The new king shortly afterwards created him Earl of Derby, and constituted him one of the Lord's Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Steward at his coronation. In 1486 he was made Constable of England for life. In 1487 he was one of the godfathers of Prince Arthur, Henry VII.'s eldest son.

He took a prominent part in arranging the treaty of Etaples between England and France in 1492. It would seem that he used his wealth nobly, both in relieving the burdens of his people and in promoting public works such as the bridges at Garstang and Warrington, for their welfare. He was the builder of Latham House which became famous through its defence by the 7th Earl's noble consort 150 years later.

Lord Stanley married, firstly, Eleanor 4th daughter of Richard Nevill, Earl of Salisbury, and sister to the Earl of Warwick, the famous " king-maker, " and secondly, Margaret, daughter of the Duke of Somerset and Dowager-Duchess of Richmond, who was King Henry VII.'s mother. By his first wife he had issue 6 sons and 4. daughters, by his second, there was no issue. He died in 1504. It does not appear that he ever visited the Isle of Man, and during his reign the Statute book is a blank.

\*It is not certain whether the crown was placed on Henry's head by Lord Stanley or by his brother Sir William Stanley

It is recorded that twice a day, he fed from his kitchen at Knowsley, sixty old, aged and decrepit poor, and that every Good Friday for thirty-seven years, he fed 2,700 persons with food and drink, and gave them money. He had a reputation for being a just and generous master who honoured his tenants and refused to increase their rents. His motto was 'Let the undergrowth flourish, for the tenants are the support of the family and commonality the strength of the kingdom.'"

Exerpts from A Manx Notebook:

Born c.1561, died 1642 but transferred estates and Lordship of Man to his son James in 1627, though it would appear that he had passed control of the Island at least to his wife c.1610 as she is associated with reforms in household officers at that period - she died in 1626. According to Seacombe :

"This earl married the Lady Elizabeth, daughter to Edward Earl of Oxford, by whom he had issue two sons, James and Robert; also three daughters : first, Elizabeth, who died young; second, Ann, who married Sir Henry Portman, of Orchard in the county of Somerset, and after his death Sir Robert Carr, Knight and Earl of Ancram, in Scotland ; the third daughter, another Elizabeth, who died young. James, eldest son and successor, we shall take notice of in another place. Robert, his second son, married a daughter of Lord Witherington, by whom he had issue, which are all long since extinct; as hereafter appears.

This noble lord died in his retirement, at his house near Chester, on the twenty-ninth of September, 1642 ; from thence was conveyed to Ormskirk, and there deposited with his noble ancestors."

The following short biography, taken from Aspen's Historical Sketches of the House of Stanley (1877) is included for its enjoyment rather than guaranteed accuracy:

On the death of the fifth earl a serious difficulty arose in reference to the succession, in consequence of a default of male issue, and the absence of his brother William, who had not been heard of for years. During the lifetime of his father, William displayed an ungovernable love for travel, and the earl consented to his going abroad for three years-

But as soon as Sir William was get on ship board  
He to himself did secretly say,  
I'll make a vow to the living Lord.  
That three seven years I'll make away.

He remained three years in France, where he took laurels in many of the chief tournaments, and subsequently proceeded to Spain, where he was challenged by a Spanish nobleman to single combat. In the first encounter the Spaniard succeeded in wounding Sir William on his right arm, and causing him to fall to the ground, but he was soon upon his feet again. In the second round the Spaniard aimed three deadly blows at the wounded Englishman, but they were all skillfully averted, and Sir William gave his adversary a thrust on the right breast, inflicting a severe wound, and causing him to reel to the ground. Blood flowed freely, and the friends of the Spanish nobleman counselled his withdrawal from the contest, but he was too enraged to heed their advice, and in the third encounter rushed at Sir William with the force of desperation, but the blows were successfully parried, and the representative of the house of Stanley once more secured the crown of victory by inflicting a second wound on the breast of the Spaniard, and thus effectually disabling him. Sir William next visited Italy, where he assumed the garb of a mendicant friar for the purpose of gaining information and the more readily getting through the country. Afterwards he proceeded to Egypt, and with the assistance of a native guide, went to reconnoitre the River Nile. Whilst on their journey, a large male tiger suddenly appeared from behind a thicket, and with a hideous howl came rushing towards them. Sir William had two pistols, and discharged one as the tiger was making a spring at them. Unfortunately he missed his aim, and it was only by dexterously stepping aside that he eluded the grasp of the ferocious brute. Before the animal had time to take another spring, Sir William drew a second pistol, discharged the contents into the tiger's breast, and as it reeled drew his sword and killed it. After paying a visit to Palestine, he journeyed to Turkey, and had a narrow escape of becoming a victim to the bigotry of the followers of Mahommed. In a discussion with one of the Paschas he defended Christianity and the Bible, and denounced the religion propounded in the Koran as false and deceptive. He was arrested for "blasphemy against the religion of Mahommed," and after being kept a long time in a filthy and dismal prison, a date was fixed for his execution, but a lady interceded on his behalf, and three days before the appointed time he was liberated. Having remained some time at Constantinople, he visited Russia, and it is said that whilst at Moscow he was informed by an English physician of the death of his father and brother, and that he thereupon returned to his native land with all speed.

On Sir William reaching England, he found that all the estates of the earldom had been settled upon his brother's daughters, under the guardianship of four bishops and four temporal lords, who possessed every branch of it to their ward's uses, and refused to

admit his right to any share of it. Having few friends and less money, and having powerful adversaries to contend against, his case was somewhat distressing ; but some of the old tenants in and about Latham, Dalton, Newburgh, &c., who knew him from a child to be their natural and rightful lord, supplied him with money to recover his title and so much of the estates as properly belonged to him. A law suit, therefore followed, in reference to all the late earl's estates in England and also in the Isle of Man. During the dispute the real title of the Stanley family to the Isle of Man was called in question, on the ground that when Henry IV. granted it for life to Sir John Stanley, the Earl of Northumberland (the former possessor) had not been attainted by Parliament nor his possessions adjudged to be confiscated, and that the subsequent gift of it to Sir John, being founded upon the grant for life, was invalidated. Ultimately it was decided by the law lords that the right to the Isle of Man belonged solely to Queen Elizabeth ; but Her Majesty, in consideration of the "many eminent services performed to herself and to her royal predecessors by the honourable and noble House of Stanley," withdrew her right and referred the contending claimants to the decision of the courts. The law proceedings were continued with vigour on both sides for six or seven years, and would have extended over a still longer period, but the Queen proposed a reference, and this being accepted, the whole matter was considered by Lord Burleigh, Lord Buckhurst, the Earl of Dorset,, the Earl of Cumberland, Lord Hunsdon, and the Earl of Salisbury, who appointed and yielded to the Right Honourable William, Earl of Derby, the ancient seats of Lathom and Knowsley, with all the houses, lands, castles, and appurtenances in Lancashire, Cumberland, Yorkshire, Cheshire, and many in Wales ; also the manor of Meriden, in the County of Warwick, with the old seat in Cannon Row, Westminster (afterwards called Derby Court), and also the advowson of the Parish Church of the Holy Trinity, in the city of Chester. To the daughter of Earl Ferdinando, the arbitrators granted the Baronies of Strange of Knocking, Mohun, Barnwell, Basset and Lacy ; with all the houses, castles, manors, and lands thereto belonging, with several other manors and large estates lying in most counties of England, and many in Wales. With regard to the Isle of Man, Ferdinando's daughters claimed possession of it as heirs general to their father, and the judges in the law courts decided in their favour ; whereupon Earl William agreed to purchase their several shares and interests, and afterwards got a new grant of the island from James 1st.

In 1594, Earl William was married at Greenwich to Elizabeth, the eldest daughter of Edward Vere, the seventh Earl of Oxford, by whom he had three sons and three daughters. Queen Elizabeth conferred upon him the noble Order of the Garter, and James I. appointed him Lord Chamberlain of Chester for life, and on the christening of his first son ("James, Lord Strange,") presented him with a costly piece of plate. The Countess died in 1626, and a few years afterwards the Earl, being " old and infirm, and desirous of withdrawing himself from the hurry and fatigue of life, in which he had been very largely engaged and greatly encumbered, " assigned and surrendered all his estates to James, Lords Stanley and Strange, his eldest son, reserving to himself only £1,000 per annum during his life. The Earl purchased a convenient house on the side of the River Dee, near Chester, whither we are told he retired and passed the evening of his life in quiet, peace, and pleasing enjoyment of ease, rest, and freedom of body as well as mind. He died on the 29th September, 1642.

#### Association with Shakespeare

One of the more interesting claims associated with William was that he either singly or in conjunction with others, wrote the plays commonly ascribed to William Shakespeare (other contenders for this are Frances Bacon and Edward de Vere, 17th Earl of Oxford.) No plays acknowledged to by William exist, though there is a 1599 report by the Jesuit spy, George Fenners that he was 'busyed only in penning commodyes for the commoun players'. The theory that William was the bard was, according to Michell, most strongly proposed by Professor Abel Lefranc in 1918, though J.H. Greenstreet had made the same suggestion in the 1890's. William is supposed to be Aetion ('Eagle Man') in Spenser's poem Colin Clouts come home again of 1594 in which all the major dramatists of the period make their entry under disguised names (the 'eagle' both from the Stanley crest of Eagle and Child as well as Lathom's Eagle tower).

POLITICAL ACTIVITY: He was returned for Augher at the general election of 1790. Augher had been recently purchased by the Marquess of Abercorn, who supported, and Stanley voted for John Foster (1805), the government candidate for Speaker. In 1793 Stanley was described as 'an expectant lawyer'. He voted for the Convention Bill, and in December 1793 he was appointed 3rd Serjeant. At the 1797 election he was returned for Lanesborough by Luke Dillon, Lord Clonbrock. In 1798 he voted against Sir Laurence Parsons' (1636) holding motion for an investigation into 'the present discontents'.

In 1799 he was described as: 'a very distinguished legal character, who ranks as Third Serjeant. He is a man of the most laborious industry, by means of which he has introduced himself into considerable practice. He was, at his outset, patronised by the celebrated Counsellor O'Kelly [Kelly, 1143], who is supposed to have done more business than any barrister of his time, in Ireland. Mr. Stanley first distinguished himself as counsel for the late George Robert FitzGerald.' (George Robert FitzGerald was executed at Castlebar on 12 June 1786. He was a brother-in-law of Thomas Connolly and a nephew of the Earl-Bishop of Derry. He terrorised the countryside and his own family. He was certainly bad, but probably also mad.)

Stanley voted for the Union in both 1799 and 1800, and was appointed Prime Serjeant in 1801 and a Commissioner of Accounts (£800) in 1802. He was in straitened financial circumstances, and sold the office of Accounts Commissioner for £5,000. Subsequently he pursued his legal career abroad, but before his removal abroad he was knighted in 1807. After various overseas appointments he was finally Chief Justice of Madras 1820-34. He died on 28 April. 1843, aged 82 years.

(Sir) EDMOND STANLEY. (1761 - 1843)

Edmond qualified as a Barrister and in 1786 married Lucy Jane Talbot, daughter of the Reverend John Talbot of Kirklington in Yorkshire. She spent most of her youth, however, with her grandmother at Mount Talbot in Roscommon. The Talbot's were an influential family and helped Edmond to obtain a seat in the Irish parliament and later in his appointment as Prime Serjeant (and a Judge. He wrote a detailed account of most of his married life (copied by a professional writer) a copy of which is contained in this book. He also wrote an account of the Talbot family which is contained in the family box file. Edmond and Lucy had one child, Mary Anne, born in 1801.

Edmond's successful career in the Irish Parliament came to an end with the union of Ireland with England and the resulting end of

home rule. Elizabeth Longford states in her book on Wellington that "...this douceur ( to Catholics) had been more than matched by a golden rain of titles and cash for the Protestants who would lose their seats and patronage. The rate for the job was £8000 a seat and Lord Longford collected this tidy sum" No doubt Edmond did likewise.

He sold Low Park and bought a property at Roscrowther in Pembroke which included a coal mine. They went to live in London where he would seek another job.

It was not until 1807 that he received an appointment to the East India Company. He was the first Recorder of Prince of Wales Island (Penang) and his first task was to take the Charter of Justice to Penang, which had previously been administered from Madras. Bringing the British legal system to Penang was clearly not straightforward, as his letters to Lord Minto, then Governor General of India, reveal (National Archives, Edinburgh MSS 11688). The new system, as compared to the Old Penang System, was clearly unpopular with the local population and there was considerable resistance. "...but it would seem an object of jealousy to some who wish to have power in their own hands, and not to have the check or control of regular law. As to my own part I have long felt myself acting on the defensive here, but I go on my own steady course and as conciliatory as possible, even when attacked", and "...a great part of the System of Revenue seems to arise from holding out inducements and temptations to commit crimes such as gaming and intoxication and then to inflict severe corporal and other punishments for the crimes which those vices generate". One such person quoted as involved in such activities is the 'Collector', perhaps of taxes, a proportion of which one imagines he retained. He also had some difficulty obtaining permission to appoint magistrates. It is clear that Lord Minto had confidence in him to which the following letter attests (Scottish National Archives MSS 11690)), and it is also of interest to note that Stamford Raffles was then working closely with both individuals and had been appointed Registrar to the Recorders Court (Sir Edmond Stanley's position in Penang), in addition to Assistant Secretary to the government of the East India Company in about 1805, the year Edmond Stanley arrived there. (Oxford Dictionary of National Biography)

"Malacca 3 June 1811

My Dear Sir Edmond,

The Thetis, Company's Cruiser, brought me yesterday, your letter of the 29th March from Calcutta any particular reply to the principal topic of that communication is, I am happy to say, superseded by all that passed during my short visit to Prince of Wales's Island; but it offered me the opportunity of repeating my perfect conviction and knowledge of the correctness and of the discretion and delicacy of your conduct in all transactions and controversies that have fallen under my observation. I seize also the occasion of expressing anew the cordial satisfaction with which I reflect on the comparative relief of your affairs from embarrassment, and of your mind from discomfort, which has been lately operated. That you may continue to enjoy every degree of public satisfaction and private happiness is my very sincere wish.

Everything is assembled here, and ready to start for the object, except for the last Division from Madras, and that is looked for every day. You will learn with pleasure that the apprehended difficulty of the passage to Java at the present period of the year has been removed by investigation and surveys, and that we have reason to hope not only for a secure but a quick voyage. May I beg Lady Stanley to accept my best and kindest respects, and I have the honor (sic) to be

The latter part of this letter refers to the Company's invasion of Java with the intention of seizing it from the Dutch. Much of the planning was done by Raffles (Oxford DNB), who became Lieutenant Governor of Java.

A copy of a letter to Sir Edmond is held, making provision for a courthouse in Georgetown, and signed by Thomas Raffles on behalf of Lord Cornwallis (during the latter's second term as Governor General) on 15th June in an illegible year, but probably 1805, as Cornwallis arrived in the summer of that year and died in October.

Sir Edmond Stanley rose to the post of Chief Justice of Madras and retired in 1825 at the age of 64. Lucy (Jane) certainly did not go to India before 1815 and it seems unlikely that she went later as he does not refer to her joining him there. However the above letter from Lord Minto suggests that she was indeed with him in Penang, and so it is hard to believe that she did not spend some time in Madras. With a young daughter in England, however, she would have also spent some time there, and was certainly so in 1815, at the time of her daughter's precipitate marriage. Edmond died in 1843 but we have no record of Lucy after 1815.

Mount Talbot house was still standing in 1974 but without a roof. The church at the gate was locked and the churchyard with Talbot graves was derelict.

Notes for EDWARD STANLEY:

Served with distinction in the Army of the Queen of Portugal during the Civil War in that country.

On his return to England, he obtained a Commission in the British Army in somewhat romantic circumstances. Many years previously, Prince William Henry, afterwards King William IV, when serving as a midshipman in the Royal Navy on the North American Station, was present at a ball in Halifax, Nova Scotia, and was struck with the charms of his dancing partner. He promised her that if at any time she sent him a request accompanied by the music of the dance, he would, if possible grant it. Many years passed; the young midshipman became an elderly King, and the young lady a grandmother. Her grandson was Edward Stanley. When he told his grandmother of his desire to obtain a commission, she remembered the King's promise and wrote to him, enclosing a copy of the music. He remembered his pledge and granted her grandson an Ensignancy without purchase in the 57th Foot, and he served in that Regiment for nineteen years, rising to the rank of Captain.

He is mentioned in the "History of the British Army" as leading the charge of the Middlesex Regiment in the Battle of Inkerman during the Crimea War.

Edward was later slain at the Battle of Sebastopol in 1854, but was said to have killed many Russians with his sword before he himself was killed.

Notes for MARY ANN STANLEY:

AN EXTRACT from " THE MORNING CHRONICLE " June 7th, 1815.

"The lady and gentleman were Miss STANLEY, daughter of Sir EDWARD STANLEY, now in a high official situation in the East Indies, and Captain BONTEIN, of the Life Guards, son of Sir James BONTEIN. Lady STANLEY was well aware of the intimacy which subsisted between her daughter and Captain BONTEIN, but never suspected that it had so nearly approached to a crisis, on account of her youth, she not being quite fourteen years of age. On Sunday morning, the 21st ult. the parties went to the Chapel Royal, and thence to the house of Lady BONTEIN, where they partook of a cold collation; they then proceeded in a tilbury to Barnet, under pretence of taking an airing before dinner, where a coach and four was in waiting, and bent their way for Gretna Green, with all the dispatch possible. Lady STANLEY waited dinner till 7 o'clock, and her daughter not coming home as usual, inquiries were made, and circumstances came to light which rendered it evident that the lovers had taken their flight for Gretna. Lady S. accompanied by a person, immediately commenced pursuit, and they traced the flying couple every stage-but they "flew on the wings of Love," and could not be overtaken. They passed through Carlisle about 3 o'clock on the Tuesday morning, and went on to Gretna. where they were married; and on their return, coming out of Longtown, they saw their pursuers approach, but avoided them by taking an unfrequented path, and remaining until Lady STANLEY'S coach went past-when they came on to the Bush Inn, in Carlisle where in consequence of advice, the Captain determined to await the event of an interview with Lady STANLEY, which took place, and all parties were reconciled, and they proceeded to town together by easy stages. The Lady will have a very large fortune. There were no objections to the match, but those which arose from her extreme youth."

THE LATE MRS. BONTEIN-STANLEY.

A Brussels English language newspaper cutting 1881

The remains of this much respected and deeply lamented lady, were conveyed from her late residence 17 Rue Belliard and interred in the Evere Cemetery on Monday last.

The high esteem in which the deceased lady was held, was indicated by the large numbers who assembled at her house, and afterwards joined in the funeral service in the English church Rue Belliard. The Rev. A.K Harlock, assisted by the Rev. J.C . Jenkins,

officiated, and among those present to pay a last tribute of regard to one who is so deservedly regretted, we observed his Excellency Sir J. Savile Lumley, K.C.B., and Sir Henry Barron, Bart, the Committee of the British Charitable Fund, many distinguished Belgian artists and the principal members of the English Community in Brussels. Several beautiful wreaths of flowers were laid upon the coffin by mourning friends, and it was quite evident that all present were deeply-affected on bidding a final farewell to one who had been such a universal favourite, and whose generous efforts in the cause of charity will long be remembered.

Notes for CAPTAIN EDWARD TRANT BONTEIN:  
British Army Officer.

Edward Bontein was the son of Sir James and Lady Bontein (nee Trant) who came from Scottish families. They had two other offspring, James Pitt Bontein and Mary Pitt Bontein. The former had three children, mentioned in the family 'old book'.

Edward married, first, Mary Sims by whom he had two children, John Sims Bontein and Mary Sims Bontein. Their mother died prior to 1815. He served in the army as follows;

Ensign 57th (West Middlesex)1803  
Lieutenant 43rd (Monmouth)1804  
Captain 92nd (Gordons)1805 - 1811  
Captain 9th Light Dragoons1811  
Cornet 1st Lifeguards1811 - 1813

Most or all of these appointments would presumably have been obtained by purchase, as was the normal custom at that time. His portrait in the uniform of 92nd is with James Edward Stanley (2007). A copy hangs in Edinburgh castle but the tartan of the kilt lacks the yellow line.

On 21st May 1815 he took Mary Anne Stanley, whose home was probably close to that of Sir James Bontein, to church at the Chapel Royal after which, according to the report in *The Morning Chronicle*, they had lunch at the Bonteins house before setting off in a coach and four for Gretna Green, pursued, in due course by Lady Stanley. Having satisfactorily eluded her, they were married according to the law of Scotland then returned to Carlisle where they met and made their peace with Lady Stanley. The only objection she apparently had concerned Mary Anne's age, which was slightly under fourteen at the time. It is interesting to note that The 1st Lifeguards fought at Waterloo, which was only about 4 weeks after their elopement. A check with the Lifeguards museum has confirmed that he was not present at that battle, although there is a record of his position in the regiment.

Mary Anne had two children, Edward Stanley (Bontein) in 1818 and James Talbot (Bontein) in 1819. Her Husband died in 1819 at the age of 34, after which it seems likely that the Bontein family took financial care of the family of the first wife and the Stanley family for that of Mary Anne and her children. The older son, Edward was educated at Eton and Cambridge and James also, according to Edmond Stanley's will. In about 1838 they assumed the surname of STANLEY and Mary Anne referred to herself as Mrs Bontein Stanley. This was effectively a condition of their inheritance, from Edmond Stanley's will, and in this he refers to the change being registered with the College of Arms.

It was probably after her sons had grown up and her parents died that she went to live in Brussels where she died in 1881 having outlived her elder son. Press cuttings indicate the respect with which she was held in later years. A portrait of her as a child with a skipping rope is with James Edward Stanley, as is one in middle age (2007).

Such elopements were not uncommon and a description of a similar one is in the family box file in case it is of interest.

There is a question as to the identity of Frederick. There is some speculation that he was the son of Henry Valentine Stanley and Anna Delilah Warner and his full name was Henry Frederick Stanley. When Anna Delilah Warner Stanley immigrated to the United States, one of her sons remained behind to finish his education. No one knew exactly which Stanley family Henry Frederick resided with. Henry Valentine Stanley and Edward Bacon Stanley were close first cousins. Edward Bacon Stanley was also associated with Dr. Murdock at the Meath Hospital who later recommended Henry Frederick Stanley to the Dublin Police force. In census records, this Frederick Stanley appeared in the household of Edward Bacon Stanley. It is uncertain if this is in fact Henry Frederick Stanley or another son of Edward Bacon.

Henry Stanley (1805) was the son of John Bacon Stanley (a merchant trader and the Marshal of Dublin). This Henry Stanley was the father of three sons by Anna Warner, Henry Frederick, Francis Edward and Frederick William. (As an interesting note on name relationships, John Bacon Stanley's second wife, Barbara Lynch's father was Henry Francis Blossie Lynch.)

It is uncertain as to Henry's profession. He may have been an attorney at law, an architect or a merchant. Research has revealed that he may have been a merchant trader, following his father's trade. The marriage documents of his son Henry Frederick Stanley and his wife Isabella Haines, indicate that he was an "architect." However, we have been unable to confirm Henry senior's "real" profession. Since Henry Sr died when Henry Frederick was young, the junior Henry may have confused the trade of his father with that of his grandfather, Peter Warner who was an architect-builder and who was instrumental in the design and building of St. Mary's Cathedral in Natchez, Mississippi.

During our investigation on Henry V. Stanley, special interest was given to a Dr. Murdock who was the associate to Edward Bacon Stanley (son of Sir Edward Stanley and the nephew of John Bacon Stanley) at the Meath Hospital. This Dr. Murdock was influential in recommending Henry Frederick Stanley (son of Henry V. Stanley) to the Dublin police force. This Dr. Murdock was also a resident in the same neighborhood as the senior Henry Stanley.

Research is continuing relating to the family of Henry Stanley. Our study indicates him being descended from Edward Stanley of Athlone who is a descendant from the "first" Stanley, Adam de Stanleigh of the year 1125.

The Stanley presence in Ireland may extend back to the 14th century and earlier. Sir John de Stanleigh, who served Henry IV in Irish battles, had been appointed Lieutenant of Ireland in 1413 and may have been among one of the first Stanleys to settle there.

Another noted service was by Robert Stanley, a great-great-grandson of Sir John de Stanleigh, who served as Captain in King William's Army. Robert fought in the Battle of the Boyne on July 1, 1690, and at Athlone Castle in 1691.

Stanleys have been predominant in the military and legal professions in Ireland and were in service to the English Crown.

Since it has been most difficult to locate any records on the marriage of Henry V. Stanley and Anna Delilah Warner (1834) and the births of their three sons, one speculation has developed. Namely, Henry may have never married Anna Warner. Henry was considerably older than Anna. It is said, as a young girl, Henry Sr had visited her father at their home. On leaving, he patted Anna on the head. She told herself "one day I will marry that man." In the absence of any official record of marriage, the union between Anna and Henry may have been one of convenience. Henry and his first wife Elizabeth Vincent had two children, a daughter Lydia and a son George. For whatever reason, Anna may have become a mistress to Henry. This may explain the lack of any official records on their marriage or births of their three sons.

Among family members, it is a most curious observation that Anna never made serious mention of Henry Stanley Sr, after her coming to the States. It was until recent research, some 60 years after her death, that we were able to confirm the true name of Anna's "husband" and to identify Henry Stanley Sr as the father of her three sons.

(As a further note on family name relationships, it is also interesting to note that Henry's daughter, Lydia had sons named: "Frederick," "Henry," and "Frederick William.")

In seeking the answers to the life of Henry Stanley, we have had to face the fact that numerous records in Ireland have been destroyed for the period that spans much of the life of Henry...from 1830s to 1860s.

A few years after the death of Henry Stanley, it is said that Anna Delilah sought assistance from other Stanley family members in Dublin. They would not support her family but agreed to take in Henry Frederick Stanley, the eldest son and help him finish his education. It is believed that this family was that of Edward Bacon Stanley. Thereupon, Anna came to America to be with her father, Peter Warner. It seems whatever means that Henry V. Stanley had left Anna, had run out and she had very little choice. She did not come to the US until after the Civil War. That was almost nine years after the death of Henry V. Stanley. She did not remarry until she came to the US.

Henry Stanley died in 1856 at his address on Grand Canal Street in Dublin. Henry is buried in Mt. Jerome Cemetery in Dublin.

As a young boy, Henry attended Trinity College in 1816. He did not graduate from this school.

Anna Delilah Warner was a very prim and proper lady and according to her granddaughter, Mamie Stanley Smith, was no "country" lady. She had city roots and city grace.

Upon the death of her "husband" Henry Stanley in Ireland, she immigrated to the United States with two of her three sons, Francis and Frederick Stanley, to live with her father Peter Warner in Mississippi. Her eldest son, Henry Frederick Stanley, remained in Dublin to finish his education.

There is some speculation as to the "official" marriage of Anna Delilah to her husband Henry Stanley who was nearly 30 years her senior. The Henry Stanley mentioned here was the son to John Bacon Stanley, an attorney in Dublin. He was married prior to his relationship to Anna Delilah to Elizabeth Vincent. Since there have been no marriage records found for Henry and Anna Delilah, it is felt that the relationship between Henry and Anna was one of convenience to allow Henry offspring.

Upon his death, a few years past before Anna and two of her three sons came to America. Anna no doubt had some means of support from her husband's estate to sustain her for these years. However, as the funds seem to run out, it is said that Anna Delilah sought assistance from other Stanley family members in Dublin. They apparently could not support her family but agreed to take in Henry Frederick Stanley, the eldest son and help him finish his education. This is the reason Anna came to America to be with her father. It seems she had very little choice. She did not come to the US until the Civil War was over. That was almost nine years after the death of Henry F. Stanley. She did not remarry until she came to the US. She later remarried to Sebastian Lasswitz, an Austrian immigrant.

Her arrival in the States was on November 20, 1866, aboard the SS Tarifa. She arrived in New York along with her two sons, and her sister Jane and brother Thomas.

Notes for REV. EDMOND BONTEIN STANLEY:

Family named changed from Bontein to Stanley.

Edmond, who was the elder son was born in 1818 and christened Edmond Stanley with the surname of Bontein. His father died some two years later and in due course his surname was changed to Stanley in addition to his christian names. He was educated at Eton where he became Captain of boats in 1835 and went on to Jesus College, Cambridge. He rowed (No 3) for Cambridge against Oxford in 1836 when Cambridge first adopted the light blue (Eton) colour and won the race. A dispute has lasted for many years as to whether responsibility for the choice of colour rested with a man named Philips who landed and bought the ribbon or with Edmond, the only Old Etonian in the boat, who asked him to buy light blue ribbon.

There was no university boat race in 1837 and that in 1838 was terminated without result. In 1839, Cambridge, stroked by Edmond won handsomely by 1 and 3/4 minutes.

Edmond was undoubtedly a great oarsman, valued as a coach and oarsman for the rest of his life. A silver oar, won at Mortlake in 1846 is with James Edward Stanley, and also a tankard won at Pembroke regatta in 1860. Having graduated BA. In 1839 he took Holy Orders and presumably had to undertake some clerical duty for a time, but we have no evidence of him ever having a parish. He certainly had an estate at Roscrowther, Pembrokeshire, which he may have inherited from his grandfather, and he was a J.P. for the County. The family's frequent moves, which are referred to later, suggest that he lived a life of leisure.

We have no record as to whether Sir Edmund and Lucy lived at Rhoscrowther after Sir Edmond's retirement or whether Mary Anne ever lived there nor as to with whom ownership of the estate rested. It seems probable, however that Edmond lived in or near London between graduating and his marriage in about 1850. It must have been thereabouts that he met Annie, one of the younger daughters of Robert Hand and his wife Anne (nee Learmonth), observing that Robert Hand was a clerk in the Lord C hancellor's department at the House of lords.

Annie has recorded in the 'old book' where she spent most of her time in each year of her life from 1832 onwards. It is not until 1858 that they apparently

settled down in Pembroke. In 1864, after their youngest child was born, they moved to France for three years, then to Jersey, perhaps to take advantage of inexpensive education for their children.

Edmond died in 1875 at the age of 57. Unfortunately we have no portrait or photograph of him, although we have a very pleasing one of Annie (with Diana Lilian Stanley)

Notes for GEOFFREY BROWNE STANLEY:

Geoffrey was borne in London in 1855 and educated like his brothers at Victoria College, Jersey. In 1874 he gained second place out of sixteen successful candidates in the entry exam for the Control Department of the army. (Subsequently R.A.S.C . and R.C.T.).

Much of his army service was spent in South Africa where he took part in the Zulu war in 1879, First Boer war in 1880 and the South African war of 1899 to 1902, during which he held the appointment of Director of Transport. He was awarded the C. B. for this latter service.

He retired from the Army with the rank of colonel in 1910 but was recalled in World War II in which he served as Assistant director of Supplies and Transport in Malta.

In the 1940's when the R.A.S.C. operated a number of coastal transport vessels one was named Geoffrey Stanley. She was offered to the Navy in 1952 and E.T.S., who was serving in the Admiralty had regretfully to recommend rejection of the offer.

Following his final retirement, Geoffrey lived a bachelor life in London, frequenting his club and Lords cricket ground. Each year until 1934 he visited South Africa for big game shooting and, until 1940, he also paid an annual visit to Wales for shooting, sometimes taking his nephew E.A.B.S. with him.

The author of his obituary in a Pembroke paper wrote that it would be difficult to find a personality more kindly and genial, or a greater sportsman, this agreed with his great nephew's recollection of him. He had a reputation with the family as a miser and probably enjoyed it and played up to it. In his last years, during World War II, he went to live in Pembroke where he died in 1943.

Notes for JAMES STANLEY:

James was born at Pembroke on 16th March 1860 and educated at Victoria College, Jersey like his brothers. He does not appear to have entered the regular Army and we can find no record of any profession to which he belonged. He was probably at the wedding of his cousin, Alice Murray reported in a press cutting in the 'old book' dated 19th April 1882. His brother, Talbot, was described as chief groomsman and among the bridesmaids was another cousin, Harriet Prust, whom James later married although we have no record of the date or place.

James presumably became a member of the Militia or Territorial army as he served in world War I despite advancing years, and was awarded a Mention in Despatches at the end of the war when he held the rank of Temporary Major on the general list.

In later years, at least, they lived at 19 Victoria Terrace, Dover. Edward Talbot Stanley has agreeable memories of being visited by them at school in about 1926 in a remarkably primitive car but never saw them again.

Belissa Stanley visited them several times in the 1930's with her father when she was in her early teens. She has written that "They lived in a lovely house with beautiful furniture and adequate servants. I was allowed to stay up to dinner and wore my party dress which was a great treat'.

'Aunt Harriet always used to send me lovely Christmas presents - I gave a necklace to Rosemary (Dinwiddie) of little aquamarines and diamonds which I always wore at parties. My recollection is that she looked rather like Queen Mary and was very gentle'.

Belissa Stanley last went to Dover in 1949 after Harriet died and at that time James was being cared for by a lady named Leslie who was understood to have been a natural daughter of his brother, Geoffrey and beneficiary under his will.

Henry Frederick Stanley, the eldest son of Henry V. Stanley and Anna Delilah Warner, remained in Ireland to complete his education. He was a Groom before joining the Municipal Police of Dublin in 1874. He was recommended to the police force by a Dr. Murdock. This Dr. Murdock was an associate to Edward Bacon Stanley, who was the son of Sir Edward Stanley, and the cousin of Henry V. Stanley Sr. Also of special note, this Dr. Murdock resided in the same neighborhood as Henry Stanley Sr. When his mother immigrated to the United States along with his two brothers, it assumed that Henry Frederick resided with Edward Bacon Stanley in his household.

He married Isabella, daughter of Charles Haines, on the 9th October 1876, in the Parish Church of St. Michan, Dublin.

Upon his arrival in America, he settled in New Orleans. There, he was a resident of the Tenth Ward about seven years. He was very active interest in Democratic affairs, having serve as a delegate to the the municipal convention. He was a prominent member of the Parish Executive Committee, the Knights of Pythias and the Odd Fellows. He was the general foreman in charge of the freight yards of the Illinois Central Railroad. During his employment with the railroad, he became the patentee of the "Stanley Combination of the Refrigerator and Ventilator Car."

He married again in 1894 to Margaret Ward.

Later in life, he met again his first love and remarried Isabella in June 1923.

An article appeared in the New Orleans The Times Picayune illustrating their first years together and their reunion:

"It began long ago in Dublin, when Isabella Haines and H. F. Stanley were in their early twenties. They met by chance. Miss Haines, the daughter of a wealthy family was born near the Lakes of Killarney; her mother was a descendant of "the admirable Creighton." and they were of the landed gentry. Her girlhood in Dublin was gay, but restricted. In the early seventies, girls were watched very closely and never went about unchaperoned.

Nevertheless, she found romance in a most unexpected way. One evening, with an older woman, she was trying to decipher the number on a house in Dublin; it was just twilight, and the lamplighter had not yet lighted the city's lamps. She was not quite sure which house was the right one, and, as she stood at the top of a long flight of stone steps, a policeman asked her if he could be of any assistance. She assented, and he located the house for her.

The man was a young, dark-eyed, dashing fellow, big and strong. And he "had a way with him," too. In the few short moments that they were together, under the watchful eye of the older woman, he had managed to impress something of his dashing personality upon the young woman. You can picture them there, in the twilight, so long ago. He with his flashing dark eyes, and his broad shoulders, trim in his uniform; she with her dainty ways, and her delicate features, talking smilingly with the man...one fancied her in the wide, highly decorative skirt, of the period, with wasplike waist and tiny tip-tilted hat, and even, perhaps, with one of those tiny parasols of long ago.... And they stood there on the high stone steps, talking eagerly in the dusk.

A chance meeting...but the man's heart was gone. He schemed to meet the girl. With him, it was love at first sight.

Nevertheless, it was arranged, and resulted, very shortly after, in a runaway match. She slipped away from her fine home, with all its dark old furniture, and its shining silver.... She threw everything overboard and came away with the man she loved. America was the land of promise, the land of tomorrow. So they set sail. They landed in New Orleans--for they had sailed from Liverpool on the day of the Tilden-Hayes election in 1876. The city was in turmoil. Neither of them had ever seen anything like it; everything was totally strange. But America was less strange to the man than to the woman. His relatives had come to the United States in 1849--his grandfather (Peter Warner), an architect, had erected buildings in Vicksburg and Natchez, and had told his grandson of this new country.

At first the Stanleys, were very happy; they went to housekeeping in New Orleans, and after a year, a baby was born to them. In eight years four children had been born. But everything was not happy with them. There were fundamental differences in their natures. She, a gently bred girl, was all for her children, her home and her husband. But he--we have said it before--"had a way with the women" and few of them could withstand his bold, dark eyes and his quick Irish smile.

Neither of the Stanleys like to speak of the final thing that led to their separation and ultimate divorce; but at the end of eight years, Mrs. Stanley and the children left New Orleans. They found a new home in the woods of Mississippi near McComb. Here living in a small house in the piney woods, Mrs. Stanley reared her children. And, until three years ago, she continued to live there.

The children grew to manhood and womanhood. They went away to find employment; they married and raise families of their own. Three years ago the mother found that she was alone. True her children all wanted her to come and make her home with them; or she could take turns; she could visit here and there. And there were the seven grandchildren to consider. Yes, surely, this was the thing to do. Consequently, she went to her daughter in California.

In the meantime, her husband had married again; but the marriage was not a success. After several years a divorce was granted. And he, too, was alone. For twenty-five years he worked for the Illinois Central Railroad; then, after one or two other ventures, he went into business for himself, shipping fertilizer from an office in Constance Street.

And then another figure comes into the story--loneliness.

Mrs. Stanley loves her children dearly; but she realizes--being a wise woman--that the children have their own lives to lead. The mother, no matter how dearly she loves her children, must step aside in the face of new claims. So, after three years, Mrs. Stanley decided that she would return to her old home in the piney woods, alone.

And Mr. Stanley, also alone, was thinking.

Loneliness! The very word has a dreary sound. . . .

Only those who have known love, and all the happiness that love brings, can know true loneliness. It is like an acid eating into your brain; the Russians have a saying. "Loneliness is a cat in one's heart." It gives you no peace. And the loneliness of youth can never equal the loneliness of old age.

Alone, Mrs. Stanley thought of the Ireland of her youth, the green fields, the boy, and girls who sang in the moonlight beside the lakes of Killarney... twilight in Dublin, and the young officer with the dark, flashing eyes who came to her on those high stone steps, just before the Lamplighter came by to light the lamps of the city.

And the man, did he remember that sweet, wistful girl, who had thrown away her worldly goods for him, who followed him from home, across the sea, with love and trust in her eyes?

No doubt there are many old people who think of the mistakes of their youth and who long to rectify them. But how few of them have the courage of their convictions. Pride or prejudice, or fear of public opinion, makes them harden their hearts, and they remain alone and lonely, as the shadows of live lengthen.

But not so with the Stanleys! No! They both realized their mistake, and they told each other so.

And so, a week ago, the Stanleys were married again remarried after a separation of thirty-six years. Judge Labat performed the ceremony, for the Episcopal Minster was opposed, for the Episcopal minister was opposed to marrying divorced couples.

The little old, white-haired lady with the soft, sweet smile, tells you the story quietly and calmly; this second marriage is no thing which is left to chance. They are both sure this time; they know what they want, and they know what to expect of each other.

"Together we are not lonely," she says. "We have old memories, and old times to talk about. As we sit together, here, in the evening, the phrase we use most often is, 'Do you remember?'"

The original middle name of Francis Edward Stanley was "Frederick." He changed this name in his majority after his arrival in the United States.

As he was growing up, he did not get along with his step-father, Sebastian Bassitt who was the second husband of Anna Delilah Warner. He lived at various times with his uncles, Richard Warner and John D. Warner of the Holmesville and McComb City area of Pike County until he was about 18 years of age. He then left that area on his own and settled in the Brookhaven area of Lincoln County.

Not long after arriving in Brookhaven, he met a fellow "Irishman," Daniel Falvey, who was some 30 years his senior. But the young Irishman and the middle aged Irishman became good friends and remained so until the death of Daniel Falvey.

Daniel Falvey who had a farm in the Red Star community took "Frank" Stanley into his home to help him on his farm. Several few years later, the two men went into partnership on a cotton gin and Frank married Mary Falvey, Daniel Falvey's eldest daughter. Eight children were born to Francis Edward Stanley and Mary Falvey, but only four lived to reach adulthood and to marry.

After the death of Mary Stanley, he remarried to a widow, Sophrona Ann Reed Wright and to that marriage five children lived to reach adulthood and marriage. The youngest of these was Mamie Ola Stanley who married John Emerson Smith. Another child Florence Arcola Stanley, married Andrew Falvey, a grandson of Daniel Falvey. Another daughter Annie Mae Stanley married Frank Matthews and a son Edward Lee Stanley married Dora Matthews. Frank and Dora Matthews were brother and sister and also the grandchildren of Daniel Falvey, their mother being Louisa Ellen Falvey, daughter to Daniel Falvey.

It is easy to see that the Stanley - Falvey relationship has been very close throughout the years.

Notes for FREDERICK WILLIAM STANLEY:

Little is known about Frederick Stanley. He may have died in the mid 1940's in Combs, Arkansas. It is believed that a young couple by the name of Thompson or Thomas were looking after him in his old age. His wife Val had died prior to 1940.

In a correspondence Paul Smith had in 1983, a Bert Combs responded that Fred Stanley lived with his brother, Lorin C. Combs, who later resided in Okanogan, Washington.

He arrived in the States on November 20, 1866, with his mother aboard the SS Tarifa from Liverpool and Queenstown, Ireland.

Notes for VALENTINE FOOTE:

Also known as "Val." For many years she was a "mid-wife" in the mountains surrounding Combs, Arkansas. It is believed she died prior to 1940.

Notes for EDWARD STANLEY:

Edward was born at N.Cadbury, Somerset in 1852. He was educated at Victoria College, Jersey. In 1868 he won an open one mile race in Hersey very easily in the reported time of 5 minutes 45 seconds. In 1869 he won a prize for latin verse and in 1872 was out shooting with two companions when he was painfully shot in the back.

In May 1875 he successfully passed the examination for a first appointment in the cavalry or infantry with rather modest marks and in August received his first appointment as Sub-Lieutenant in the 2nd West India Regiment. In January 1874 he sailed for the Gold Coast with some other officers of the regiment to join an expeditionary force.

He later transferred to the North Stafford Regiment, probably soon after his marriage in 1877 to Mary Louisa Deane. In 1884 he sailed for the West Indies with the North Stafford regiment. Subsequently he served at Lichfield and Devonport before retiring from the Army with the rank of Major in 1888. He was granted a gratuity but no pension.

In 1890 he entered the Colonial service as Inspector General of Constabulary at Lagos, Nigeria. Having returned to England on leave in 1893, he returned to Lagos and was on passage home for further leave in 1896 when he died, en route, of Malaria at the age of 43.

Edward and his wife, Sunny Stanley (Mary Deane) had six children:

Bessie Eleanor 1878 (at Demerara)  
Sylvia Deane 1880 (at Ipswich)  
Edmond Alan Berners 1882 (at Roscommon)  
Talbot Anstruther 1884 (at Manchester)

The family probably went to live at Southsea (where Sunny's sister and some other relations lived) soon after the birth of the last child. Sunny died in 1905 which was the year in which her youngest son went to sea. One result of their disrupted family life was that the children recalled little of their father and perhaps not a great deal about their mother who must have had such a struggle in

bringing them up with very meagre means. A photograph of Edward, Geoffrey and Edmond was with Edward Talbot Stanley in 1898, also one of Sunny. A painting of Edward with a pony was with Belissa Stanley. A report of their wedding from a Pembroke paper is in the 'old book'. Some details of the Deane family are in the family box file.

Notes for BERYL GREY STANLEY:

Beryl was born at Litchfield on 9th July 1886. She married John Sproston Cressall in 1906. Following his death (perhaps during the first World War) she married, in 1921, Mr Alan Hughes who shortly obtained employment with the Anglo Persian Oil Co. at Abadan. Her godson, (E.T.S.) recalls a happy stay with her in London in 1928, when she and her husband were on leave. E.T.S., who visited Abadan in 1933, realised that the expatriate life there was well paid and fairly agreeable so it was unfortunate that Beryl's husband fell out with the company well before his retirement age and was placed on early retirement at some time in the 1930's. They lived in England before and during world war two and then went to live in the Channel Islands, which had financial attractions. When they eventually returned to England, they lived at East Preston, near Brighton where Beryl died in 1976 at the age of 90. Her husband, Alan Hughes, who was 15 years younger, ended his days rather sadly in a home for the aged at Chelsworth in Suffolk where B.M.H.G. maintained contact with him until he died a few years later.

Notes for BESSIE ELEANOR STANLEY:

Bessie was born at Demerara (in British Guiana) in 1878. The family moved according to her father's army appointments for the first ten years of her life and following his retirement in 1888 probably moved to Southsea in about 1890, where her mother died in 1905. Bessie married, in 1912, Captain John Brown Grogan of the Royal Army Medical corps.

Her oldest brother, Alan, left no doubt that she was his favourite sister. Much of her time after the First World War was spent in India so her nephew and niece saw little of her before her husband's retirement in the 1930's. In her later years she and her husband lived in a residential hotel in Richmond where she died in 1943

- iii. SYLVIA DEANE STANLEY, b. 1879, Ipswich, England; m. BAYLEY THORNE; d. 1918.

Notes for SYLVIA DEANE STANLEY:

Sylvia was born in Ipswich in 1879 and, as in the case of Bessie, settled in Southsea in about 1890 after her father's retirement. In 1807 she married Lieutenant Bayley Thorne of the Middlesex regiment. He was killed in action in France in August 1918 while commanding the 2nd/6th North Stafford regiment. E.A.B.S. obviously liked her less than her older sister but E.T.S. and K.S. got to know her quite well when she lived in Brighton during World War II with two other women, and considered her a most agreeable and cheerful aunt whom it was always a pleasure to visit. When recording her death in the 'old book', E.T.S. unfortunately failed to record the year.

Notes for TALBOT ANSTRUTHER STANLEY:

Talbot was born at Manchester on 17th December 1883 and entered the Army in the S. Staffordshire regiment in June 1901, (His father's old regiment). He transferred to the Royal Army service Corps in 1904. He married Sylvie Read of Baltimore U.S. A. in 1909. This was her second marriage as she had a son named Jack Read who Edward Talbot Stanley met in Bombay in 1935, with his wife, and found them very pleasant people. Talbot and Sylvie must have been divorced after a fairly short marriage.

Alan used to recount many stories of his happy companionship with Talbot as boys. Talbot was obviously a very likeable, carefree scoundrel. One such story recalled the two older boys employing their younger brother for a small payment as a moving target for their airguns, dressed suitably in an oilskin. Talbot served on the western front during the First World War, reaching the rank of major in 1917. He retired in 1920. He seemed to be somewhat dependent on casual employment and lived periodically with his aunt, Lottie Dean, at Hintlesham. E.T.S. recalled being presented by him with a very large mongrel dog, which quickly had to be found another home. One job which he undertook, while staying with Aunt Lottie was as a turnstile operator at the Wembley Exhibition in 1924 and 25. He is somewhat scurrilously described at that time in a book entitled 'Suffolk Childhood' by Simon Dewes. (Hutchinson 1929). A copy of the description is in the family box file.

Talbot died of pneumonia in Colchester Hospital on 21st June, 1927.

- vi. EDWARD GELDARD STANLEY, b. May 31, 1889, Devonport, England; d. 1942; m. ISOBEL EARL.

Notes for EDWARD GELDARD STANLEY:

Teddy was born at Devonport on 31st May, 1889. He entered the Royal Navy in May 1905, joining for the last term to be trained in H.M.S. Britannia before she was replaced by colleges ashore, which provided much better education. He became a submarine specialist before the start of World War One and in 1914 married Isobel Earl. By 1915, he was 1st Lieutenant of H.M.S/M E.14 (Lt Cdr E.C. Boyle) in the Dardanelles campaign with E.11 (Lt Cdr M. Nasmith). Both submarines achieved considerable success after penetrating the straits on several occasions. Both Commanding officers were awarded V.C.'s, the other officers D.S.C.'s and all the ratings had D.S.M.'s. Teddy subsequently commanded several submarines but did not get many opportunities. He was promoted to Commander in 1925 and retired with that rank in 1935.

He was recalled to active service in 1939 in the rank of Captain and served as Chief Staff Officer to Rear Admiral Newcastle, until his death in 1942 from tuberculosis.

E.T.S. recalls first meeting Teddy in 1919 when he was taken round L.56. Teddy pretended to put the 4-year old into a torpedo tube. Thereafter they met fairly frequently. E.T.S. found his uncle rather frightening but he was obviously pleased when informed that his nephew intended to follow in his footsteps as a submarine officer. When E.T.S. last visited him in hospital in 1941, Teddy was delighted to learn that he now commanded H.50 which he himself had once commanded. He was no less pleased to hear that he expected to be sent to the Mediterranean soon, where torpedo targets were not too hard to find. It was sad that Teddy and Isobel had no children. They were apart for quite a lot of their married life and eventually she went to live with her sister in Sudbury but saw very little of her brother-in-law or nephew.

Notes for EDMOND TALBOT STANLEY:

Talbot was born at Pembroke in 1858 and educated like his brothers at Victoria College, Jersey. He entered the Army in 1875 gaining 105th place out of 110 successful candidates and declared only eligible for a West Indian regiment. Nevertheless he was accepted into 11th Foot (Devonshire Regiment) as a sub-lieutenant and sailed for India. He subsequently wrote an account of shooting his first bison for a sporting paper.

Later newspaper cuttings refer to his entry to the Ordnance Store Department and his promotion to Captain in the Devonshire's. (Presumably he retained his commission in both regiments.)

In 1884, he married ALICE MARY CROCKER, daughter of Surgeon General A.Crocker of Southsea. They had three daughters;

Hilda Delamain 1885 - 1918

Evelyn Learmonth 1887 - 1888

Aline 1890 - 1961

Talbot was serving at Woolwich in 1885 when Hilda was born. By 1887 they were in the Far East and Evelyn was born at sea off the Japanese coast. She died 11 months later in Hong Kong.

Talbot probably served in the South African War as we have a photograph of him taken at Pietermaritzberg wearing a campaign medal ribbon.

He probably retired in the rank of major before World War I and was then recalled to service. He died at Rouen in 1919, no doubt a victim of the influenza epidemic that followed that war. His wife Alice Mary died in 1940.

Notes for HILDA DELAMAINE STANLEY:

Notes for ALINE TALBOT STANLEY:

Married Lieutenant STREET R.N. in 1918. He also was a war casualty. She lived subsequently in a flat in London and enjoyed watching cricket matches at Lords. She worked very hard to persuade the keepers of Cambridge rowing history to give the credit due to her grandfather E.S.Stanley for the selection of the Eton blue as the distinctive colour for the Cambridge crew in the university boat races of 1836 and thereafter but never succeeded. She died in 1961, leaving a few family pictures and documents to Edward Talbot Stanley

Notes for ALICE STANLEY:

Alice was born at Dunkirk on 14th August 1864 and baptised at the British chapel.

She married George Stanser Ingles on 28th January 1892 at St Mary Abbot's church, Kensington. He had grown up in Jersey and was an officer in the P & O Steamship Company, and also a sub-lieutenant R.N.R. He lost his life in the same year on 10th October when the liner Bokhara, of which he was 2nd Officer, was wrecked on the Pescadores during a typhoon. Some survivors accounts are in the 'old book'. Alice later told her daughter, Joan, that she received a letter from him, posted before he sailed from Shanghai, recounting in great detail a dream of the Bokhara being wrecked, very much as actually occurred. Joan recorded this in the 'old book' when staying with Edward Talbot Stanley many years later.

Alice subsequently married again, a cousin, Owen Andrew Armstrong of 73, Pembroke road, Dublin where their three children, Emmie, Joan and Geoffrey were born. (We have no dates).

Geoffrey died in 1914, where the family lived. Joan recounted to E.T.S., in 1964 how they watched the street fighting in Dublin at Easter 1916 during the insurrection at that time. Owen must have died in 1918 Or 1919 and soon after the end of World War One. the family moved to Southsea where they lived on the sea front near South Parade pier until Alice's death on 22nd August 1933. When living near by in 1919 and 1920, Edward Alan Berners Stanley and E.T.S. got to know the family quite well and visited them from time to time in subsequent years.

Emmie married Lieutenant Commander Vernon Nicholson, probably about 1930 and they had two sons of whom we have no records. After the end of world War two, he retired from the navy and they went to Antigua where they restored the derelict English Harbour and established a successful yacht chartering business. We have no further records of them.

Joan married Lieutenant Commander G. Best in about 1930 and they had a son who became an officer in the Army Catering Corps, but of whom we have no other record. Joan's marriage ended in a divorce and she went to live and work in London. She stayed, periodically with E.T.S. and K.S. with whom she was a very welcome guest who made friends very readily and had a great gift of judging character by hand writing. She moved to Southsea in 1965 and died shortly thereafter.

Nellie first married John J. "Jack" Corbitt by whom she had one daughter, Isabella who was known as Issabie.

Nell later moved to El Paso, Texas and married Lawrence Gardner, a local businessman and owner of the Empire Bottling Company. In 1928, she started the Mrs. Lawrence Gardner's Commercial College. In 1943, she sold the school and worked with her husband in the bottling company until his death in 1950. After his death Nell took over the leadership of the business and for many years was a prominent businesswoman in El Paso. In 1957, she sold the bottling company and organized the Empire Moving and Storage Company.

She was one of the pioneers in establishing homes for the elderly. "A Living Memorial" to Nell was the Pilot Home of the Aged. She was the first to organize a Pilot Club in El Paso and became known as the "Mother of Pilot Clubs West of the Mississippi. This

Nell, was known as a "sweet" lady to some but was described by others as a "formidable woman, tall, erect, bordering on being heavy-set. . . . She always wore a hat, more often a rather broad-brimmed hat." Nell shared a bit of her personal philosophy on her 85th birthday:

"Forget yourself and think of others. Develop a sense of humor, especially regarding your own personal peculiarities. Have a tough hide and be too big to indulge in littleness. Be curious. Be venturesome. Think of the other fellow, if you want to be remembered."

Nell was known for being conscientious and taking her duties seriously. Once when she was due to speak at a ladies club, she fell and broke her wrist. Undaunted, she immediately went to the doctor's office and had the wrist bound with a bandage. Although the doctor implored her to remain and allow him to properly set and treat the injury, she declined and continued on to her appointment. At the conclusion of her talk, she returned for proper treatment.

Nell Stanley Gardner had left a remarkable legacy of civic service behind her. Aside from her business achievements, she had been a member of the Altrusa Club, Pan American Round Table, and secretary-treasurer of the Woman's Department of the El Paso Chamber of Commerce. She was highly involved with the Pilot's Club, starting the first unit outside the U. S. (in Juarez, Mexico) and acting as the driving force in establishing the Pilot Home for the Aged in 1937, prior to the realization for a need for elderly care by most Americans. She was one of the first women elected to the Board of Regents of the University of Texas in 1932.

Notes for ALONZO LAWRENCE GARDNER:

Founded the Empire Bottling Company, El Paso, Texas.

Although little is known of Lawrence Gardner's early life, he may have been influenced by what he saw of the liquor and soda water trade as a driver for the El Paso Ice and Refrigeration Company in 1905 (Gardner did not appear in the 1904 City Directory, but was listed as Lon Garner, residing at 306 S. Campbell, in 1905). He was, by his own admission, a man with a purpose.

Gardner, known at that point in his life as Lon or Lonnie, galvanized into action. With \$1,750 in venture capital, he opened the Purity Bottling & Manufacturing Company in April, 1906. The original works, located "in a small adobe shack at Texas and Campbell Streets", produced about 200 dozen bottles per day. This hand-operated plant produced a sufficient quantity of "pop" to warrant the purchase of "a lovable, but spavined old horse, called Friday" from Joe Wright at a cost of \$15.00. Although Friday's front legs were so stiff that they would hardly bend, he was able to pull a "little wagon [Gardner] had bought from the Myers Vehicle Co. with a small payment down and the rest eventually". At that time Gardner made all his own deliveries.

Gardner claimed that he "pioneered soft drinks into stores and soda stands". He encouraged high school (and younger) students to set up their own small businesses in the form of soda stands where passersby could slake their thirst with a cold bottle of Purity's Pale Dry Ginger Ale or one of his other flavors. Success inspired other students to set up their own stands made from empty boxes, and soon young entrepreneurs, many of whom later became successful El Paso businessmen, were vending Purity beverages throughout the city.

His new company, the Empire Bottling Works, although best noted for its carbonated beverage production, became a leader in other areas. It became noted as a beverage supply company with one of the largest selections of soda fountain accessories and equipment in the southwest. In addition, the firm supported a large candy factory under the same roof. Along with a change in his career, Gardner's lifestyle altered in another way. In 1914 he married the former Nell Corbett who had come to El Paso in 1911.

Empire grew rapidly. In 1917, the firm constructed a "five story brick building which houses the largest soft drink supply business in the entire country" on the corner of Mills Ave. and Florence St. Empire now serviced "a territory from San Antonio to Phoenix". At some point, Empire opened a branch in Ciudad Juárez, Mexico, and advertised its products as being available from both plants in 1920. The Juárez plant was probably closed with the change to Empire Products Corp. in 1925; it was certainly gone by the Empire advertisements in 1931.

With the repeal of Prohibition, Empire added Anheuser Busch to their list of products, distributing Budweiser beer in bottles and draft until 1957. In 1938, Gardner's daughter, Isabella C. Zimmerman, became a vice-president of the corporation and was

followed by her husband, William W. Zimmerman, who was elected as a vice-president and sales manager two years later. Empire celebrated its thirty-third anniversary in 1939 by placing its twelve-ounce bottle of Pale Dry Ginger Ale on sale for five cents. The popular drink had been priced at fifteen cents per bottle for several years. By 1940, the company was branching out with a plant in Las Cruces, Silver City, New Mexico. When Lawrence retired from Empire in 1944, Nell S. Gardner assumed the presidency, with the Zimmermans as vice-president and secretary/treasurer. Lawrence Gardner may have become feeble and been moved into a nursing home. He was listed at a different address from Nell in 1949. Gardiner died in 1950.

In 1938, Isabella C. Zimmerman, became a vice-president of the Empire Bottling Company and was followed by her husband, William W. Zimmerman, who was elected as a vice-president and sales manager two years later.

She was a former professor of English at Texas Western College. She was well known for her work as a book reviewer and for her activities in El Paso Pilot Club.

Isabella, had a different reputation than her mother. She was once described as "the meanest woman on the face of the Earth", a person who hated everyone. Although her detractors disliked her, she was Nell's only child, and her mother mourned her untimely death in 1958.

"Nell" was born May 17, 1911, in Lincoln County, Mississippi. She was the oldest child of George and Bertie Ellzey Stanley who are buried at New Hope Methodist Church, northwest of Brookhaven, Mississippi.

On January 21, 2001, while at Haven Hall Health Care Center in Brookhaven, she gave the following brief sketch of her life to John Paul Smith, her first cousin; being the son of her father's sister, Mamie Stanley Smith.

The Vardeman in her name was provided by her father who was an admirer of Mississippi's fiery Senator Vardeman in the early 1900's.

Nell attended Love School near Brookhaven and Brookhaven High School and then attended Co-Lin in Wesson while Russell Ellsey, a cousin, was president of the school. Alan was born on 2nd September 1882 at Roscommon in Ireland where his father was serving. (By coincidence it was not far from where his ancestors had lived.) He grew up in Southsea where he attended St Helen's School until he entered the Royal Navy in H.M.S. Britannia at Dartmouth in 1897. He passed in 52nd out of 65 and four terms later passed out 20th having been made a cadet captain.

In 1898 he joined H.M.S. Mars on the China station, transferring shortly to H.M.S. Orlando in which he took part in the war of 1900 (The Boxer war), in which he was present at the bombarding of the Taku forts, and was a member of the international landing party sent to the relief of Admiral Seymour's force, and the legations in Peking. The task was accomplished after some bitter fighting and he qualified for the China Medal with a clasp for the relief of Peking. The city was considerably looted by the victors after the ancient custom of war. The British share of the loot was, more or less, pooled and Alan received quite a significant sum, of which he gave some to his mother to assist with the education of his younger brothers. A description of the Boxer war is contained in the family box file.

Apart from a further spell in China and one in H.M.S. Ganges at Shotley, most of his service until 1922 was in destroyers, or similar vessels. His certificates of service indicate how well he was considered. While serving in Ganges, he met his future wife, Lilian Gertrude Hunter Rodwell and they were married at Holbrook on 3rd January 1914. They went to live at 4 Minor Canon Row, Rochester where they spent nearly two years during which he was commanding H.M.S. Afridi for the greater part of the time and later H.M.S. Staunch. Their son, Edward Talbot Stanley (who writes this) was born on 11th July 1915 and at the end of the year Alan sailed for the Mediterranean in Staunch. Lilian and Edward moved to Suffolk.

Two busy years in the Mediterranean came to an end on 11th November when Staunch was torpedoed and sunk by a German submarine while lying at anchor off Belah. These two years cannot have seemed entirely satisfying, including, as they did the failure of our Dardanelles operations and the highly successful achievements of the German submarines against our shipping, against which our destroyers could offer little effective defence for lack of suitable equipment. Nevertheless, Alan's services were valued. He was awarded a Mention in Despatches in March 1916 for services in the evacuation of the Gallipoli Peninsula in March 1916 and promoted to Commander at the end of 1917. He was awarded the D.S.O. for services as Senior Officer of destroyers employed guarding the flank of the Army during the Gaza operations and rendering valuable service during the enemy's counter attacks upon Sheik Hassan. An extract from 'The First World War' by Martin Gilbert, which describes the capture of Gaza in 1917 is included in the box file.

On return to the U.K. in 1918 he was appointed in command of the flotilla leader Kempenfelt in which he served for about a year. One duty undertaken was to transport King George V to France for which he was awarded the M.V.O. (4th class).

At the end of 1918, the war now being over, the family moved to Southsea and lived at Furness Lodge, Eastern Villas road until Alan's departure for China in the sloop Bluebell in early 1920. Belissa Mary Hunter (Sunny) was born on 4th April after which Lilian and the children moved to Holbrook where they remained for most of the time until Alan's return to the U.K. in 1922.

His return more or less coincided with the descent of what was known as 'The Geddes Axe' after the minister responsible. It resulted in the early retirement or discharge of numerous naval officers. Alan was one of the victims in company with all the other non-specialists of his Dartmouth term except A.B. Cunningham who became the outstanding Naval officer of the second world war as C-in-C Mediterranean, First Sea Lord and in due course Admiral of the Fleet.

So began 17 years in the wilderness for Alan with an income that became progressively less adequate for family needs with increasing costs of education and reductions in pensions during the economic slump of 1931 from which the economy had barely recovered by 1939. Perhaps it would be fair to say that the only feature of country life that Alan much enjoyed was shooting while Lilian would have been just as little suited by a town life. However, they rented a house in East Bergholt in 1922 and in 1931 bought the old Brantham rectory. A very nice house in 15 acres of land but in a very derelict state. The years from 1922 to 1939 were frustrating for Alan.

In 1939, with the outbreak of the Second World War, Alan was recalled from retirement and served again in the Navy with the rank of Captain (retired) and the next six years were, probably, the happiest of his life. After some months, becoming acclimatised to the service, and the sea, he was appointed in command of the Armed Merchant Cruiser Derbyshire (an ex-Bibby liner), employed escorting Atlantic convoys and such other tasks for which a large, seaworthy ship with a scanty armament seemed suitable. It was a hazardous task and a number of similar ships were lost and he obviously enjoyed it. This was followed by shore jobs at Methil, Londonderry, and Taranto.

On reversion to the retired list in 1946, the frustration of earlier years in the wilderness had departed and he seemed to enjoy the relaxation of his last six years although latterly troubled by the cancer from which he died on 23rd November 1951. Lilian survived him by a further 10 years. (A scrap book containing some details of both their lives has been compiled)

16th Earl of Derby

The son of the 14th Earl of Derby, a politician and British Prime Minister, Lord Stanley of Preston entered politics after having studied at Eton College and Sandhurst. He served briefly as an officer with the Grenadier Guards, but his family's prominent role in British politics soon called him to political life. He served as a Conservative member of parliament in the British House of Commons and a member of the cabinet. He married Lady Constance Villiers on May 31, 1864 and they had ten children.

Lord Stanley's term as Governor General of Canada was due to end in September 1893. However, in April of that year, his brother, the 15th Earl of Derby, died. Lord Stanley succeeded him as the 16th Earl of Derby. As a result, he left Canada on July 15, 1893 and returned to England. An Administrator was appointed to fulfil his duties until Lord Aberdeen was sworn in that September.

Back with his family in England, he soon became the Lord Mayor of Liverpool and the first chancellor of the University of Liverpool. During the last years of his life, he increasingly dedicated himself to philanthropic work. Lord Stanley died on June 14, 1908, and Lady Stanley died on April 17, 1922.

Notes for EDWARD TALBOT STANLEY:

The Obituary of Commander Edward Stanley, DSC, DSO, RN 6th December 2004:

Commander Edward Stanley, who has died aged 89, was a submarine ace awarded a DSO and DSC as a member of the "Fighting Tenth" squadron in the Mediterranean during the Second World War.

On his first war patrol in command of the submarine *Unbending*, Stanley sank several small ships, and had only four torpedoes left when he was cued by signals intelligence on to an important Italian convoy in the Tyrrhenian Sea.

At noon on 19 October 1942, he found himself right ahead of the convoy when it altered course, placing him between four supply ships and seven destroyers, with aircraft above them. Stanley fired his remaining torpedoes at the troopship *Beppe* and the large destroyer *Da Verazzano*, then dived deep, though he classified only two of the depth charges that followed as "close".

On his next patrol a month later, he stalked the 10,000-ton troopship *Viminale*, but could not close the range before she entered harbour; he tried again in December when he reconnoitred Palermo for another attack using chariots; finally, on 23 January, Stanley found her under tow.

He fired three torpedoes at 2,000 yards, hitting with two. Over the next two hours he counted 56 depth charges which shook *Unbending* so badly that he had to return to Malta for repairs to the submarine's batteries, although it had spent only a week on patrol.

Three weeks later, Stanley sank the 855-ton cargo ship *Carlo Margotti* as she took refuge in a sheltered bay in the Adriatic. While following underwater he saw through the periscope the splash of small-arms fire from the shore. His crew in the control room were amused to see him instinctively ducking the fall of shot on the surface above them. *Carlo Margotti* was sunk at her moorings.

After landing reconnaissance teams on the beaches of Sicily, who were all tragically lost, Stanley did not relish more special operations when he was ordered to take a team of commandos to blow up a railway tunnel in Calabria. The operation was interrupted by a heavily-guarded convoy passing down the coast: the commandos watched with pleasure while Stanley fired four torpedoes and sank two steamers, but then had to try to make their escape overland. While returning to Malta, he picked up a survivor from an American Baltimore bomber which had been shot down.

In June 1943 Stanley was rested after nine patrols, in which he had sunk 15,673 tons of shipping and had damaged or possibly sunk another 10,000 tons during special operations and gun actions. He was awarded the DSO.

Edward Talbot Stanley was born at Rochester on July 11 1915 when his father was captain of the destroyer *Staunch* in the

Mediterranean. His father was later a victim of the "Geddes axe", but young Stanley still joined Dartmouth in 1929.

His midshipman's time was spent in the battleship *Malaya*, and from 1933 to 1935 he served in the cruisers *Hawkins* and *Emerald*, based at Ceylon. The men worked "tropical routine" from 0530 to 1300 daily, leaving the afternoons and evenings free for golf, swimming, sailing, visiting the young plantation managers and going to dances.

This idyllic life was punctuated by occasional parades and police work in ports around the Indian Ocean. Stanley volunteered for submarine service in 1937, to spend two weeks in an old L-class submarine commanded by "Crap" Miers, VC, who, he noted, was "a rather flamboyant type rare in submarines".

His first appointment "in the trade" was to the new mine-laying submarine *Rorqual*, which was at Colombo, en route to the Far East; When he revealed that he "did not eat curry", despite having spent several years on the station, his shocked captain made him try it. After the outbreak of war, Stanley felt ill at ease living a life of peace, plenty and blossoming romance, and he was disappointed to be made first lieutenant of the submarine *Regent* in refit at Hong Kong. When *Regent* was eventually sent to the eastern Mediterranean, he missed its first war patrol because of illness, but was able to marry his fiancée during his convalescence.

On September 30 1940, however, he narrowly escaped sinking when, south of Taranto, *Regent* broke surface in rough seas while attacking the Italian fleet. In the counter-attack the boat managed to level off only just above her safe diving depth, crushing some internal bulkheads. In his memoirs, Stanley candidly blamed himself for the loss of trim and poor state of training on board.

In April 1941 Stanley was on the casing of *Regent* supervising the flying of a white flag as it entered the Yugoslav port of Kotor, in an attempt to rescue the British ambassador Sir Ronald Campbell, when two German aircraft dive-bombed: some shrapnel lodged under his ribs, where it remained throughout his life. Stanley was awarded the DSC.

From Malta he flew home in a Sunderland flying boat, managing a brief reunion with his new wife on board the troopship *Monarch* of Bermuda at Gibraltar before setting off for his submarine commanding officer's course.

Stanley's first command was the elderly training submarine *H50*, which had once been commanded by his uncle and was used to exercise escort vessels in the technique of rapid boarding. He also spent one patrol on the blockade of Brest, before being sent to *P37* (the submarine's official name until being formally named as *Unbending*). On returning from the Mediterranean he spent a short time training officers at the stone frigate *HMS Royal Arthur*, before commanding for short periods the submarines *Tireless* and *Trusty*.

He was then sent to the Pacific in command of *Taciturn*. At the end of the war, his squadron commander Captain Ben Bryant wanted to recommend him for a Bar to his DSC, but Stanley persuaded him to suggest five DSMs for his petty officers: he was mentioned in dispatches instead.

After some successful post-war staff appointments and a happy commission as second-in-command of the cruiser *Bermuda*, Stanley was disappointed not to be promoted captain, and retired at his own request. He worked as a middle manager for Fison's, the fertiliser company, for 23 years.

Edward Stanley, who died on December 3, married Kay Trickett, the nurse he had courted in Hong Kong before the war. She died in 1991, and he is survived by a son and two daughters.

A Personal Tribute given at the Funeral of Edward Stanley

It is an honour and a privilege to give this personal appreciation of Edward Stanley. Edward was, as most of you will know, my father in law but he was much more than that. He was also friend, well-informed advisor, generous host, source of historical information, and fount of considerable wisdom. He was also odd job supervisor extraordinaire. It was a feature of visiting his household that one would be allotted useful tasks, such as mowing the grass, sweeping leaves, helping make elderflower wine or, as on one occasion, shooting a couple of rabbits on the lawn threatening his lettuces. This made visitors feel immediately needed, and valued, and thus somehow drew one into the family and, above all, he was a family man. He would of course always find things to do for others as well as actively supporting numerous charities over many years, helping individuals in trouble, and tirelessly sitting on innumerable committees; some doubtlessly more frustrating than others but still to be born with humour for the greater good. He was, without doubt, a man of rare humanity and humility and an example to us all.

I never heard him judge anyone adversely, although certain politicians and newspaper editors were fair game, but with those he knew or met he could always see the alternative viewpoint and was so very understanding of others views. He could, nevertheless, give his own in such a delicate and unchallenging way that one could find oneself won over, even before realising it. He was, in the

truest sense, a gentle~man, and it was no chance that everyone who met him warmed to his humour and friendliness and always remembered him with affection. I was thinking only last night, at the carol service here, that it is somehow very appropriate that we should be celebrating the life of such a giving man at this time of Christmas.

Edward was a career Naval Officer of distinction, which is why it is so apt that we should be gathered here in this lovely little Suffolk church overlooking the river that he loved, flowing nearby into the sea that he loved as well. He came from a strong naval background with both father and uncle having great naval careers of their own in the First World War. He rose to this challenge with remarkable success, commanding a submarine for the major part of the Second World War and through frighteningly awful times, such as in the Mediterranean operating out of Malta with the extraordinary 10th Submarine Flotilla; a collection of astonishingly courageous young men. Later, he was in the Pacific, based in Western Australia. There he made lifelong friends; most of his friends were lifelong; who since became godparents to some of his children and whose families are still in regular contact.

All his naval experience is very well recorded, with too many exploits to relate here, not least in his own privately published small autobiography, where he exercised his natural and delightful skill for narrative writing - better in print than handwritten, perhaps, for those who knew his letters - and where he recorded his life with utter modesty. I am still convinced that there were wartime episodes in which he was involved that are unexpressed because of this modesty. Certainly there are events that his friends can recall which are not commonly known. For instance, it seems certain that he was the first person to install a bath in a British submarine; one of the portable saucer-shaped ones; which was inserted in to the wardroom before building was complete, undoubtedly against regulations. By the time it was, it was too late, being too large to remove through the hatches. His generosity of spirit is well exemplified, for instance, by his treatment of small coastal ships carrying food or coal in the Pacific. These were official targets for the Americans and the British and the crew, ordinary local folk, often went down with their craft. Edward, at some risk to his ship, would invariably rescue them, before sinking it, give them a meal and put them aboard a local fishing boat. On one occasion there was no room in a boat for two young boys who were about to be ejected by the local crew until Edward took them aboard and transported them back in his submarine to Australia where he bent every rule to obtain their entry and no doubt their lives changed dramatically thereafter.

So typical of the man, again, was that towards the end of the war it was proposed that he be awarded a bar to his Distinguished Service Cross. This he declined in order to bargain for medals to be given to six senior ratings who had not been so rewarded up until that time, but perhaps should have been. More prosaically, but again typically, it is on the good authority of no less a person than himself, that he encouraged the baking of fresh bread on board his submarine, no doubt a welcome addition to the usual fare in those nutritionally austere times, and a great morale booster. Events such as these, and many others, are still warmly remembered by wartime colleagues who survive him, not surprisingly I feel.

War is a time of excited fear for many young men, who are caught by the moment. It is believed, however, that Edward could somehow always see the broader picture and retain an understanding that what had to be done was ultimately for the good of mankind generally.

It was during the war, of course, that he married Kay in Alexandria, they having met during happier times in Hong Kong. She arrived, as most others were leaving during the height of operations, with her wedding dress, and so began a long and happy marriage. Much of this was spent in Suffolk where Edward worked for Fisons in Industrial Relations. It is a testament to his ability to get on with, and understand, people that there was never a single episode of industrial action during his tenure, in those years when other companies were suffering significantly. Life in Felixstowe, and then Waldringfield, was both full and fulfilling.

These times were happy and busy and of great pleasure to him, watching his family grow up, marry, and have children. Then, sadly, Kay became seriously ill with an illness to which he himself was later to succumb. He looked after her carefully and uncomplainingly for a number of years, but somehow still found time to do all sorts of other helpful things and to write letters to his grandchildren. In his book there is a passage about Kay during her declining days, when she was confined to her bed in which he says; and here I quote: - "People visiting her in bed at that time were often struck by the beauty of her features. I would say the same of her personality. How lucky I was to marry her"

There will be some here who would perhaps say the same of Edwards's features. It is quite certain that all would agree on the fineness of his character. How lucky we were to have known him.
