FOSTER, Manan, a fireman, was killed at Newcastle, Delaware, March 2, 1850, when the steamer Clifton burst her boiler. (March 5, 1850)

FRAILEY, George Clinton, only son of G. Clinton & Eliza M. M. FRAILEY, of Baltimore, died in Georgetown, D. C., Aug. 2, 1850, at the residence of his grandfather, George F. de la ROCHE, in the 6th year of his age. The remains will be taken to Baltimore for interment in Greenmount cemetery. (Aug. 6, 1850)

FRANCE, Eleanor Hubbard, 2nd daughter of Joseph Henry & Mary Elizabeth FRANCE, died July 15, 1850, age 4 yrs., 4 days. (July 16, 1850).

FRANCE, Mary Augusta, youngest child of Joseph Henry & Mary Elizabeth FRANCE, died June 17, 1850, age 1 yr., 4 mos., 23 days. (June 18, 1850).

FRANCE, Parke Bailey, infant son of Thomas E. & Annabella FRANCE, died March 23, 1850, age 7 mos., 27 days. (March 25, 1850).

FRANCIS, Albert, a brakeman on the Syracuse & Utica Railroad, was killed April 23, 1850, when he was knocked from the top of a car on which he was standing when the train passed under a bridge near the east tunnel at Syracuse. (April 24, 1850 & Sept. 3, 1850).

FRANCIS, Peter, & Matilda SUIT, daughter of Edward SUIT, all of Bladensburg, were married March 5, 1850. (March 6, 1850).

FRANKLIN, Alexander, a member of the Pittsburg Bar, died May 2, 1850. (May 3, 1850).

FRANKLIN, Lucinda, wife of Thomas T. FRANKLIN, of Spencer, Owen Co., Indiana, was murdered Dec. 14, 1849. (Jan. 2, 1850).
