

Ancestry of Dorthea Christina Lauritzen

First Generation

1. **Dorthea Christina Lauritzen**¹ was born² on 10 Oct 1875 in Moroni, Sanpete, Utah. She died³ on 20 Jan 1953 in Redmond, Sevier, Utah from a stroke and was buried⁴ on 25 Jan 1953 in Redmond Cemetery, Redmond, Sevier, Utah.

Dorthea was counted in a census⁵ in 1880 in Moroni, Sanpete, Utah. Her obituary states "Mrs. Mickelsen [Dorthea Lauritzen] was born in Moroni, October 10, 1875, a daughter of Peter and Caroline Jensen Lauritzen."⁶

Dorthea married⁷ **Christian Mikkel Mickelsen**⁸, son of Niels Carl Mickelsen and Marie Christensen, on 6 Dec 1899 in Manti, Sanpete, Utah. Christian was born⁹ on 7 Feb 1873 in Ephraim, Sanpete, Utah. He died in Sep 1943 in Redmond, Sevier, Utah and was buried on 2 Oct 1943 in Redmond, Sevier, Utah.

Christian was ordained Seventy in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints by J. Golden Kimball¹⁰ on 25 Jun 1893 in Utah. He served a mission¹¹ in 1897 in Copenhagen, Denmark, part of the Aarhus Conference.

Second Generation

2. **Peter Lauritzen** was born¹² on 6 Apr 1850 in Hedegaard, Norre Snede, Skanderborg, Denmark and was christened¹³ on 20 May 1850 in Ejstrup, Skanderborg, Denmark. He died¹⁴ on 3 Oct 1890 in

Moroni, Sanpete, Utah after being gored to death by a bull on his family farm and was buried¹⁵ in Oct 1890 in Moroni, Sanpete, Utah. Peter was baptized¹⁶ a member of the Church before 6 Apr 1862 in Skanderborg, Denmark.

In his christening record, he is shown with parents "Laurst Laursen [and wife] Marie Pedersdatter of Hedegaard."¹⁷ Peter immigrated¹⁸ on 29 Sep 1862 to Salt Lake City, Salt Lake, Utah and then went on to settle in Moroni, Sanpete, Utah. Peter served a full time mission for the Church in November 1879. He kept a journal and wrote that he left his home in Moroni on December 20th, just five days before Christmas. His wife Caroline and the family accompanied his as far as Nephi and then he continued on to Salt Lake alone. At this time Caroline was expecting her fifth child in April. He was assigned to the Northwestern States Mission and to St. Paul, Minnesota. He reports in his journal that he never received word of the new baby's birth until the 12th of May when letters informed him of the even. He wrote, "I felt thankful to God that everything was as well as it was at home." He returned home from his mission in 1881. After his return he was called to be one of the first ordinance workers in the Manti temple.

Peter purchased land in Moroni, Sanpete, Utah 8 Jan 1881, soon after returning home from his mission.¹⁹

Despite his absence from his family, he was counted in a census²⁰ in 1880 in Moroni, Sanpete, Utah as the head of the household with his wife and five children. Also, he became active in civic affairs in the community and served a term as Mayor of Moroni and also a number of years as city councilman.²¹

3. **Caroline Christina Jensen** was born²² on 8 Feb 1852 in Farre, Skanderborg, Denmark and was christened²³ on 8 Apr 1852 in Ejstrup, Sporup, Skanderborg, Denmark. She died²⁴ on 4 Feb 1936 in

Moroni, Sanpete, Utah from a stroke and was buried²⁵ on 9 Feb 1936 in Moroni, Sanpete, Utah. Caroline was baptized²⁶ before 6 Apr 1862 while in Denmark.

In her christening record, it shows her parents as "Peder Jensen [and] Kirstin Andersen of Farre."²⁷ Caroline was counted in a census²⁸ in 1880 in Moroni, Sanpete, Utah while her husband, Peter, was away on his mission. She was also counted in a census²⁹ in 1900 in Moroni, Sanpete, Utah.

Third Generation

4. **Lauritz Lauritzen** was born³⁰ on 15 Sep 1816 in Vesterlund, Vejle, Denmark and was christened on 13 Sep 1816 in Vesterlund, Vejle, Denmark. He died³¹ on 11 Feb 1896 in Moroni, Sanpete, Utah and was buried³² on 13 Feb 1896 in Moroni Cemetery, Moroni, Sanpete, Utah. Lauritz was baptized³³ in 1862 while in Denmark. Lauritz married³⁴ Marie Pederson on 1 May 1847 in Ejstrup, Skanderborg, Vrads, Denmark. They were sealed a few years after arriving in Utah on 30 Jan 1868 in the Endowment House.

Lauritz and his future wife, Marie Pedersdatter, were both found in the 1845 Danish census, living in Norre Snede, Vrads, Skanderborg, Denmark, and working as tjenestefolk near Praestegaard.³⁵ Lauritz and his family [wife Marie, and children Marie, Peter, Lauritz, Jens, Karen, Soren, and Hans Johan] left Denmark³⁶ on 6 Apr 1864 from Vesterlund, Vejle, Denmark. The Lauritzen family traveled on the *Monarch of the Sea*, the first ship carrying Scandinavian members of the Church to America. After traveling across America, they ended at their frontier outfitting post, Wyoming Nebraska, a town seven miles north of Nebraska City and forty-four miles south of Omaha, consisted of only about a half a dozen occupied houses and two unoccupied larer buildings--a warehouse and a hotel. This place, Wyoming, was the last Mormon outpost on the Missouri prior to the advent of the transcontinental railroad. Because of the Civil War raging in America, Mormon immigration was particularly difficult in 1864, which obtaining supplies more difficult and transportation expensive. Increased Indian-White hostilities along the Platte River

route also contributed to the difficulties of the return trip to Salt Lake City.³⁷ The raging war of Austria and Prussia against Denmark also complicated leaving Denmark, but ‘upwards of 800 souls’ from Scandinavia were able to travel safely to Liverpool in time to leave on the first ship of the season, with even less disturbance than in previous years. Many young Danish men who were required to serve in the military were also amazingly allowed to leave without difficulties. The Church agents in England, under the direction of European Mission president George Q. Cannon, chartered three sailing ships for the 1864 emigration: the Monarch of the Sea sailed from Liverpool on April 28 with 974 Saints and arrived in New York City on June 3 [and two others.] After clearing emigration at Castle Gardens, agents rushed the emigrants up the Hudson River to Albany, where they caught a train west. They continued on trains through Detroit and Chicago to Quincy. Many of the emigrants arrived in New York City without money or means to procure food and other necessities.³⁸ They arrived in Utah³⁹ in Oct 1864.

He was counted in a census⁴⁰ in 1880 in Moroni, Sanpete, Utah.

5. **Marie Pedersdatter**⁴¹ was born⁴² on 23 Nov 1823 in Ejstrup, Norre Snede, Skanderborg, Denmark and was christened⁴³ on 23 Nov 1823 in Ejstrup, Norre Snede, Skanderborg, Denmark. She died⁴⁴ on 15 Oct 1899 in Jerusalem, Sanpete, Utah and was buried⁴⁵ on 17 Oct 1900 in Moroni Cemetery, Moroni, Sanpete, Utah. Marie was baptized⁴⁶ in Sep 1862 in Ejstrup, Skanderborg, Denmark.

Marie was confirmed⁴⁷ in 1838 in Hammel, Skanderborg, Denmark. She was counted in a census⁴⁸ in 1880 in Moroni, Sanpete, Utah.

6. **Peder Jensen** was born⁴⁹ on 29 Jul 1811 in Naarup, Gjern, Skanderborg, Denmark. He died⁵⁰ on 13 May 1872 in Moroni, Sanpete, Utah and was buried⁵¹ in Moroni City Cemetery, Moroni, Sanpete,

Utah. Peder was baptized⁵² on 14 May 1861. Peder married⁵³ Kjersten Andersen on 8 Apr 1838 in Hammel, Skanderborg, Denmark. They were sealed⁵⁴ on 5 May 1866.

He emigrated⁵⁵ from Denmark on 6 Apr 1862. Peder arrived⁵⁶ in 1862 to Moroni, Sanpete, Utah. He was employed as weaver⁵⁷ in his early life in Denmark, but upon reaching Moroni, decided to farm.

7. **Kjersten Andersen** was born⁵⁸ on 26 Oct 1809 in Farre, Sporup, Skanderborg, Denmark. She died⁵⁹ on 18 May 1880 in Moroni, Sanpete, Utah and was buried⁶⁰ in Moroni City Cemetery, Moroni, Sanpete, Utah. Kjersten was baptized⁶¹ in Jan 1861.

Fourth Generation

8. **Lauritz Hansen**⁶² was born⁶³ on 11 Feb 1770 in Vesterlund, Vejle, Denmark. He died⁶⁴ on 3 Feb 1839 in Vesterlund, Vejle, Denmark and was buried on 10 Feb 1838 in Vesterlund, Vejle, Denmark. Lauritz married Ane Marie Pedersen about 1795.

9. **Ane Marie Pedersen** was born⁶⁵ in 1774 in Vesterlund, Vejle, Denmark and was christened⁶⁶ on 16 Oct 1774 in Thyregod, Vejle, Denmark. She died⁶⁷ on 22 Apr 1858 in Vesterlund, Vejle, Denmark and was buried on 28 Apr 1858 in Vesterlund, Vejle, Denmark.

10. **Peder Christiansen** was born⁶⁸ in Enkelund, Tyregod, Vejle, Denmark and was christened on 2 Aug 1778 in Eskelund, Tyregod, Vejle, Denmark. He died⁶⁹ on 1 Jan 1856 in Ejstrup, Norre Snede, Skanderborg, Denmark and was buried⁷⁰ on 8 Jan 1856 in Store Thorlund, Ejstrup, Skanderborg, Denmark.

11. **Karen Sorensen** was born⁷¹ in 1800 in Ejstrup, Norre Snede, Skanderborg, Denmark. She died⁷² on 18 May 1866 in Ejstrup, Norre Snede, Skanderborg, Denmark and was buried⁷³ on 26 May 1866 in Ejstrup, Ejstrup, Skanderborg, Denmark.
