Chatham County) Petition of James H. Jones, 1832.

On the 11th day of October, 1832, personally appeared in said Court before the undersigned Clerk of said Court and Quarters (James H. Jones) - John H. Jones a resident of the County and State aforesaid, aged 46 years - a Soldier of the Revolution who being sworn according to Law, took upon his oath to make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the Act of Congress of 2d of June, 1832.

I entered the Service of the United States under the following named Officers and served as hereinafter

mentioned in the County of Middlesex, in the State of Virginia in February, 1777, under Capt. Shultz for three years in the Regiment commanded by Col. Walter and Point - The number of the Regiment I do not recollect - I also served under Col. Fleming - in Genl. Wayne's Division - I served in the Campaign to Petersburg, where the Regiment was organized and from thence to Danbury near the City of Philadelphia, where the Army went into Winter Quarters - and in the Spring was marched to New York and thence to the North - I was at the Storming of Stony Point in July, 1777 - where I was continued two months - and from thence marched to the South to join Genl. Gates's Army - and was at the Battle of Red Bank in December, 1777, and

in the month of February 1780 the Term for which
I was discharged. I have lost my exchange
and papers, that I have no documents, evidence in my possession
I have left my discharge - -
nor do I know of any person by whose testimony I can prove
my discharge -

I hereby relinquish every claim whatever for a
Pension, or annuity except the present and
declare that my name is not on the Pension
Roll of any agency in any State whatsoever
