March 31, 1850 AE 70 [gs]). Both bur. at North Monroe. This was a family widely known for their musical acquirements. They were all fine singers, some of them travelled with the famous Hutchinson Family, touring the country. The family gave concerts and composed largely the choir at Barnet village in the '40's and '50's. (By Mrs. Frank Bedell, Big Rapids, Wisc.)

The following from *History of Monroe*: "Asenath Heath Duncan had a very interesting life. She and her husband, William Harvey Duncan, went west, part way by wagon, and settled in Keosauqua, Iowa where he built the first water-driven grist mill in the state. Their daughter, Susan, was born in Buffalo on the way out. William Duncan died and Asenath decided to return east. Many men were anxious to marry her but she didn't care for any of them. She was also bothered by Indians. Sitting alone in her cabin at night with her children, she would often see an Indian peering in at the window. So she returned to Monroe and later married Nathan Batchelder. There are many anecdotes related by her grandson, Senator Ralph Flanders, who describes her as a remarkable and lovable character."

The Heath sisters and their brothers, with some members of the Gleason family, were influential in their day, in elevating the musical taste of people in their vicinity. They were gifted with sweet and clear voices, and rendered the popular music of their time with an effect which was enhanced by the personal charm of each member of the family. During some years they assisted at musical conventions, then becoming popular, and at camp meetings they rendered with great effect the appealing hymns which were an important adjunct to those great gatherings in the open air. In their time musical instruments, other than the flute and violin, were rare in this vicinity, and vocal music was more carefully cultivated than now.

The Heath farm is now [ca. 1921] owned by Hugh Nelson, and no one lives on it.
