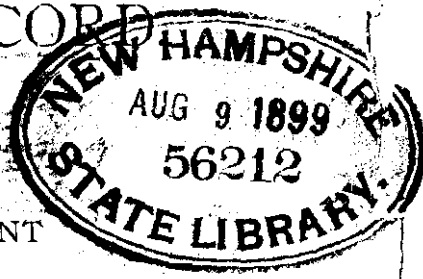

EXPLANATIONS.

Only those of the name of Sargent are numbered or their generation given, the number at the left, and generation at the right of the given name. The surname Sargent is not used but once at the head of a family record and that with the 1st William. Those having an "s." after the date of their birth, have a further record and their name and number is found again at the head of their own family record. Sons not known to be married and daughters are not numbered but referred to under the number of their father.

A place with the state omitted, is of the state last given, and a place once used in the same record is afterward designated by its initial; but in case of two places of the same initials, the initial refers to the place last given. When the name of a place has been changed, all data is given as of the present name; and data of a place taken from another is given under its original name up to the time of the division. Data in a place having no official record, and located in a township or city where such official record would naturally be found, is usually given as of the latter.

PREFACE.

It is with a feeling of relief I close this work which has extended through several years. No one can know the anxiety caused by the desire to obtain a full and correct record, or the discouragement and vexation by the delays, indifference and incomplete records of some, the failure of others to respond and the extra work attending its accomplishment, mostly outside of business hours, but those who have passed through the trials attending such a work. And had I known this I should not have commenced, and assuredly not with the loss I expect.

Although mentally and physically relieved I am not satisfied with the result, knowing there are so many of whom I was unable to obtain any trace, or to fully establish the connection of others with this line, who without doubt belonged to it, and the incomplete records given by those living, although their attention was called to it several times. It is not conclusive that there is no further record of one than that given because it does not appear, for I have learned after giving the children recorded as born in one place, that others were born elsewhere, (notably of those who moved to New Hampshire, prior to 1800) and some would name only themselves when giving the children of their parents, and I would learn of others later. An (?) is placed after the names of those living who did not respond, to designate that the data was obtained from other sources, and may not be correct and full.

"Do you not find the Sargents superior to other people?" I was asked by a lady who married one of the best (?) of our line. Although regarding any of the line notoriously bad, I have found all classes, and that human nature was about alike without regard to name, politics or religion. And as I recalled the trouble and expense of getting from others the records of some who did not respond, and I became acquainted with

their attainments, I was not prepared to answer her question in the affirmative. But as I called to mind the large list of those I have met and corresponded with and the great pleasure I have derived from these associations, I should say at once they were "superior." I shall always hold the latter in grateful memory, and have placed a dagger (†) after the names of those whose interest led them to give me information beyond their own near kindred. To these and those who responded so promptly and with full records, I extend my heartiest thanks, knowing they are courteous and obliging and held their parents and kindred in loving veneration, and wished to give them a perpetuated record, not for their own gratification alone, but for the pleasure and benefit it would give to others. The idea of interest or non-interest in the matter being a portrayal of any trait of character may not appear probable to some, but I have proven it otherwise, and have the opinion of others to confirm it.

Our nationality may have had something to do with our indifference, for not until within a few years have we given much attention to the part our ancestors took in the settlement of our country and its wars for independence and right. We have been a progressive people, looking forward, not backward, taking a person for himself, not asking much about his ancestry. But this is changing, most believing as a rule, "Blood will tell," and I find but few instances of neglect or indifference in the progressive class. "Self-made men" have respected and taken just pride in their ancestors.

As to the correctness of this record there are no doubt many mistakes, but much data that will seem wrong to some, will be right to others, as several dates and records have been given me of one person, by different ones in the same family, and the same persons have given me different data of others and of themselves. I have used those that appeared the most authentic. Public records do not always agree with family records, and it is curious how the public learns of a birth and records it before it happens (?) as is often claimed by a person or family.

But little of my authority is given owing to its magnitude, as data of a person was often obtained from so many sources. It has been gathered from individuals, family, public, and church records, histories, wills, papers, genealogies, gravestones and a record commenced by 175 Ezekiel, and continued by his son, 559 Darius, until the death of the latter in 1859. This latter record included many of the descendants of 2 Thomas to the fifth generation, and some of those of 2 William to the fourth generation. By the courtesy of the widow and daughter of 563

Darius, I had free access to this record and without this I could not have given as much of the early data, and I wish them to have full credit.

As to the beneficial results of the work I feel fully assured, from the vast number of commendations I have received; the answers it has given to many inquiries; the placing on record information otherwise lost or inaccessible; imparting information in relation to the ancestors of many, and correcting erroneous traditions of others. And whatever may be the result I can only say in conclusion as in my previous work, "It is the hope and desire of the writer that this may introduce those of kin and bring them into closer relationship, and prove beneficial and instructive to this and future generations." It is only to be regretted that he did not live to see the work completed and receive the congratulations of every Sargent, wherever he may be, upon the success of his arduous task. It was the crowning effort of his life and to it he literally sacrificed his life.

SARGENT RECORD.

I WILLIAM SARGENT¹.

Since my extensive research in England, which included the examination of probate, church, naval, judicial and other records by genealogists and others; advertising in the leading daily and Episcopalian papers of London, offering a reward for information, I failed to substantiate the statements I copied in my former work, therefore I feel it incumbent on me to give the following explanation:

The quotations that William, "was born in London in 1602," that his father Richard, "was a barrister at law," and his mother, "a daughter of Sir Richard Saltonstall," I could not substantiate and found much to disprove the last two. I believe that a part of these statements I quoted from the persons making them, were conclusions drawn from a record furnished them about fifty years ago, of a "Richard Sargent, a justice, who died at Dinton, England, in 1668, who had a son William." But the Dinton Parish records show that the children of William the son of Richard, were baptised there from 1630, to 1634, and that Richard died aged 79. He therefore would have been but thirteen years old when our ancestor William was born, if born in 1602. That William "was appointed midshipman in the navy," I found no record. That William "sailed with Captain John Smith, in 1614, to Jamestown, Virginia, stopping at Agawam, Massachusetts, en route," may be true as to his being with Captain Smith at Agawam, as he settled there afterwards. But that he went to Virginia, as that writer alleges, is questioned, as history does not give Capt. Smith as being in Virginia later than 1609. William was a seaman in his younger years as he is designated as a "seaman" or "mariner" in his will and other documents, but he no doubt later in life followed other occupations with it.

That his father Richard held a position in the "Royal Navy," another

tradition advanced by others, is not confirmed, so far as I can learn, by the navy records. As to William being born in London, and in 1602, it may be claimed that it has been a tradition so long it must be true, but I have proven so many traditions untrue. I am skeptical in this matter. As the birth of William of Malden, whose record was written by Aaron Sargent of Somerville, Mass., was known to have been in 1602, and the two Williams lived so near each other in Massachusetts, their records of birth might have got "mixed up." Then I have a letter from a person in England stating that he was born in 1598, but cannot learn as there is any authority for it. The nearest record to the one claimed in 1602, I have been able to find in England, of a William born to a Richard, is the following from the Abby church, Bath:

"Marriages. 1602, November, Richard Sargent, and Katherine Steevens the 22 day. Ano Dom., 1630, Jening Walters and Joane Sergeant, were married April 15." "Baptisms. Elizabeth the daughter of Richard Sargeant, 28 day 1603, October. 1606 June, William the Sonne of Richard Sargeant the 28th. March 1609, Joane the daughter of Richard Sargent was baptized the 26th."

As there is no further record of the father or son found there, they may have gone to London and William shipped from there. At first I was not inclined to believe this William was our ancestor or from this part of England, for the following reasons: There were many Sargents, and some whose given names were Richard, in Cambridge and Suffolk counties, England, and as John Winthrop and some of the others who settled at Agawam, Mass., and changed its name to Ipswich, were from Ipswich, Suffolk county, and vicinity, England, I was inclined to believe William was from there. But since learning that the father of William's first wife, "Quartermaster John Perkins," was at Agawam in August, 1631, in a short time after arriving in America, and that he came from near Bath, England, that if William was from there and with Capt. Smith in 1614, when the latter landed at Agawam and wrote up its beauties and advantages, William may have returned and induced John Perkins and others to emigrate.

The first recorded record I found of William is in the General Court records of Massachusetts Colony in April, 1633, by an act by said court protecting certain grantees of land then at Agawam, now Ipswich, Mass., in their rights, and "Willm S^rjeant" was one of them. The next record is that of his oath of allegiance and fidelity in 1639, and his name is recorded "Willi: Sargent," but neither is as he spelt it. It is shown by records and deeds that he was later one of the first settlers at Wessaccon, now Newbury, in 1635; at Winnacumet, now Hampton,

N. H., in 1638; at South Merrimac, now Salisbury, Mass., in 1639, and that "Wm. Sargent, townsman and commoner of Salisbury, tax rate Dec. 25, 1650, 7s. 4d." He was next located at Salisbury New Town, now Amesbury and Merrimac, in 1655, where he resided until his death in 1675. The statement in the town history of Amesbury, "that William married for his first wife Judith, a sister of his second wife, Elizabeth Perkins," the author informs me he made on information of another, and had no other authority. The genealogy of the John Perkins's family gives no daughter Judith, and that Elizabeth was born in 1618, at Newent, Gloucestershire, England, and therefore old enough by 1634 to have been the mother of Mary, the eldest child of William, who married Philip Challis, and Mary old enough to be a mother in 1653, when her first child was born. This therefore refutes the marriage of William to Judith, and also the idea that Elizabeth was too young to have been the mother of the eldest children of William. The date of their marriage was probably about 1633, as she came to America with her parents in the ship Lion in the spring of 1631, and they were both at Agawam prior to 1633. I found no date of her death, but it was before Sept. 18, 1670, for he married on that date Joanna Rowell, who survived him and married Richard Currier of Amesbury.

Owing to a lack and contradiction of records, there is an uncertainty as to William's children, their order, dates of birth and death. Where there are two records which conflict, I have used the Salisbury, if that is one of the two. There is a record of "Mary b. June 17, 1647," and no record of her death, and it is not probable a second child was named Mary after the one who married Mr. Challis, the one named in William's will. So I am convinced it should have been "Lydia," of whom I find no record of birth, but "died in 1661," and have given the former under the latter name. The "Elizabeth" given as the "wife of William died 1641," must have been the daughter "Elizabeth" who "died July 14, 1641." He was one of the "Prudential" men in Amesbury in 1667; he resided in the part of the town known as the "West Parish," and built a house near the church and academy. He died in March, 1675, and was buried in the cemetery at the "Ferry." His will is as follows, and probated at Salem, Mass., in 1675.

"In the name of God Amen. the 24 day of March 16⁷¹ I William Sargent of y^e town of Emefbury in y^e County of Norfolk Maffachufettf in Newengland Seaman being in pritty good health of body & of found & plect memorie (praise bee given to god for ye same) & knowing y^e uncertainty of thif life on earth & being Desirouf to fettle thingf in order doe make thif my laft will & Testam^t in manner & form That if to fay

Firft & principally I comend my foule to Almighty God my Creator affurdely believing y^e I fhall receive full pardon & free remiffion of all my fins & bee faved by y^e p^{er}ciouf death & meritte of my bleffed Savioe & Redeemer Chrift Jefus & my body to y^e earth from whence it waf taken to bee buried in fuch Decent & Chriftian manner af to my Executo^{er} hereafter named fhall be thought meete & convenient.

And af touching fuch worldly eftate af y^e lord in mercy hath lent mee my will & meaning if y^e fame fhall bee employed & beftowed af hereafter by thif my will if expreffed And firft I do^e revoke renounce, fruflrate & make voyd all willf by mee formerly made & declare & appoint thif my laft will & Teftament Item I give & bequeath to my grand child William Challis five poundf & to my grand children Elizabeth, Lydia, Mary & Phillip watson Challif to each of them twenty fhillings Item I give & bequeath unto my grand children Dorothie & Elizabeth Colby to each of them twenty fhillings Item I give unto my grand child William Sargent thirty fhillingf Itt I give & bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth ye wife of Sam^l Colby five poundf Item I give all y^e remayndere of my eftate (theſe my legacies & my funeral chargef being firfte paid) unto my daughter Sarah both howfing & landf, chattelf & other moveablef w^{ch} foever alway p^{ro}vided that if ſhe die wth out children that theſe howfing & landf: to bee equally divided: unto my four children hereafter named, i: e: my fons Thomas & William & my daughterf Mary and Elizabeth Item I do conſtitute ordaine & appointe my fone Thomas Sargent & my daughter Sarah Sargent Executors unto thif my will & Teftam^t & doe make my loving brother in law m^e Tho Bradbury & my eſteemed friend Major Pike my overfeerf to take care that thif my will may bee p^{er}formed according to y^e true intente & meaning thereof

And to thif my laft will & Teftament I doe hereunto fett my hand & feale y^e day & year above named
