It Is King Philip's War List of
Freemen

S. C. Lewis Here in Revolutionary
Period

Valuable data concerning Plymouth Colony in 1675, the time of King Philip's War, has come into the possession of the Colonial Society of Massachusetts. It was communicated at the December meeting, held in the house of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences yesterday, by Henry H. Edes, in behalf of Appleton P. C. Griffin, a corresponding member, and consists of a list of the Freemen of Plymouth Colony in 1675. The list is from the original, in the handwriting of Secretary Morton, in the Library of Congress. This list was not included by Shurtleff in his collection of similar lists for other years, which he printed in the "Records of Plymouth Colony," probably because it was not known to him. The list has special interest in this tercentennial year because of its date—the time of King Philip's War, and because it has never before been published.
